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FOREWORD

The Annual Agricultural Review is a publication of the Ministry of Agriculture, Food Production, Fisheries and Rural Development prepared by the Corporate Planning Unit. It provides current and historical statistical data, analyses and information on the agricultural sector in St.Lucia. The review serves as a primary reference document on the state of agriculture in St.Lucia. The information conveyed in the Annual Agricultural Review is an invaluable tool to aid in planning and decision making particularly among key stakeholders in the Agricultural sector, including policy makers and planners, farmers, aid agencies and other interested parties.

This edition presents historical data from 2006 with specific focus on the period January to December 2010. It is expected that the various stakeholders within the Agricultural sector, learning institutions, partner agencies and the general community will find this publication informative and relevant for their decision making and development planning. 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Domestic Economic Developments

There was recovery in global economic activity in 2010; this was denoted by a 5.0 percent expansion in global output. The world's largest economies experienced increases in economic growth and inflation rates.

The region experienced weak external demand, along with declines in foreign direct investments and restricted access to credit, which impeded growth in 2010. Inflationary pressures challenged the Caribbean economies; this was as a result of higher food prices globally, caused primarily by food shortages as a consequence of floods and other natural disasters.

Preliminary estimates revealed that general activity in St. Lucia grew by 4.4 percent in 2010 compared with that of 2009. While increased performance within the tourism and construction sectors, and developments in the distributive trade services and real estate sectors contributed to the increased economic activity, banana production suffered with a decline of 30.9 percent as a result of the prolonged drought within the first half of 2010 followed by the passage of Hurricane Tomas later that year.

Overview of the Agricultural Sector

During the review period, the performance of the agriculture sector was adversely impacted by the occurrence of the drought of 2009/2010 and the passage of Hurricane Tomas in October 2010. Estimates revealed that the sector contracted by 21.4 percent, following a decline of 3.7 percent in 2009. Agriculture's contribution to GDP moved from 4.22 percent in 2009 to 3.32 in 2010.

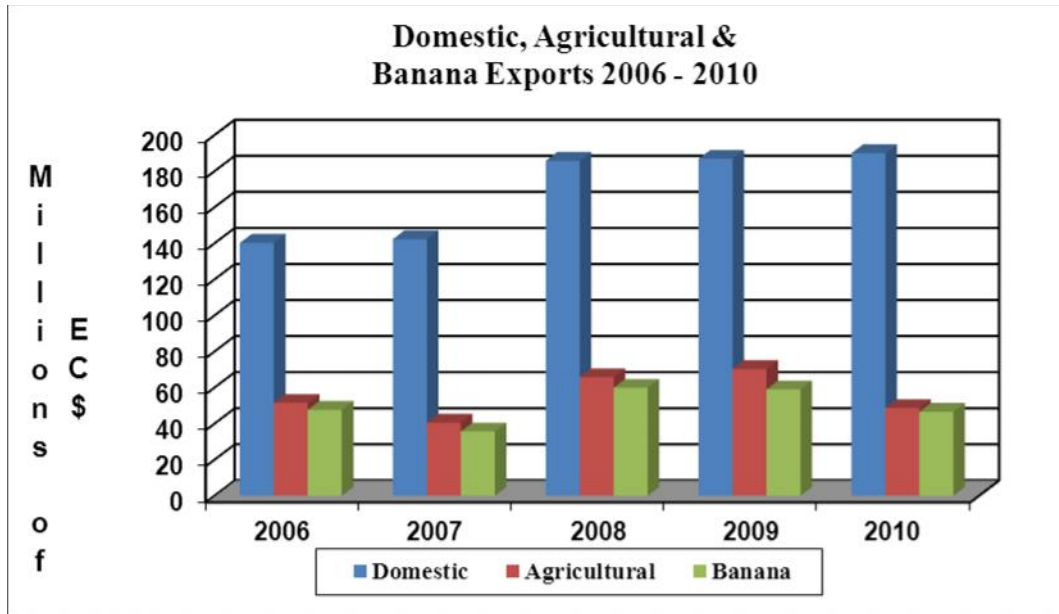

Banana

The banana industry was severely impacted by unfavourable weather conditions, namely the Drought and Hurricane Tomas and the cessation of exports to the UK during the last quarter of 2010. Banana exports to the United Kingdom (UK) declined by 36.0 percent to 21,701 tonnes in 2010. However, regional exports increased by 79.8 percent to 3,687 tonnes. Exports within the region were mainly to Barbados and Trinidad. While the volume of bananas purchased by marketing outlets declined 4.7 percent, hotel purchases grew by 2.5 percent in 2010, when compared to 2009.

Non-Traditional Crops

As a result of adverse weather conditions in 2010, total domestic sales to supermarkets and hotels declined in 2010, mainly attributable to reduced crop output. Supermarket purchases, which accounted for 79.6 percent of total purchases, dipped by 18.5 percent, while hotel purchases decreased by 5.8 percent in 2010.

Fisheries

Following growth of 9.6 percent in 2009, the fisheries sector contracted by 5.7 percent in 2010. The volume of fish landings were impacted by the passage of Hurricane Tomas, which caused widespread damage to fishing vessels and coastlines, coupled with the Drought, which contributed to unfavorable sea conditions. In order to neutralize the low supply, fish imports increased by 13.3 percent.

Livestock

The livestock sub-sector continued to exhibit growth in 2009. Production within the poultry and pork industry grew by 26.0 percent and 32.5 percent respectively. The volume of egg production was hindered by the Drought and poor quality of feed, thus, egg production dipped by 3.3 percent.

The Banana Industry

St. Lucia's banana exports to the United Kingdom (UK) declined by 36.0 percent to 21,701 tonnes in 2010. This low level of output was primarily attributed to unfavourable weather conditions in 2010. Banana production was severely hampered by the prolonged drought which lasted from September 2009 to March 2010 coupled with Hurricane Tomas in October 2010 which came at a time when the banana industry was re-emerging from the effects of the recent drought. In addition, flooding in various farming communities further exacerbated the adverse weather conditions.

During the first half of 2010, banana exports to the UK dipped by 15.3 percent to 13,699 tonnes, while exports during the second half declined by 55.0 percent to 8,002 tonnes. This was largely due to the cessation of exports to the UK during the last quarter as well as the passage of Hurricane Tomas which resulted in widespread damage to banana plantations island-wide. Moreover, the infestation of fields by the black sigatoka disease also resulted in reduced yields per acre during the latter half of 2010.

Regional exports of bananas grew robustly in 2010 as farmers capitalized on more viable market opportunities in the region. Exports to the region increased by 79.8 percent to 3,687 tonnes valued at EC\$4.7 million. Trinidad and Barbados accounted for the largest share of regional exports. Whilst, Barbados accounted for 38.7 percent of regional exports, Trinidad accounted for 61.2 percent. Banana exports to Trinidad increased significantly by 248.4 percent to 2257.8 tonnes, valued at EC\$3.5 million. In addition, exports to Barbados increased to 1,428.3 tonnes, valued at EC\$1.2 million.

The St. Lucia National Fairtrade Organisation handled the majority of bananas exported to the UK in 2010. This company facilitated the export of 17,988 tonnes of bananas to the UK. The remaining 3,713 tonnes of bananas were exported to the UK through the Tropical Quality Fruit Company. There were no exports of bananas by the St. Lucia Banana Corporation (SLBC) which was largely due to WIBDECO'S termination of its annual supply contract with banana companies that were not Fair Trade compliant.

There was an overall increase in the prices of banana inputs in 2010. While the prices of twine and fertilizers increased by 17.6 percent and 15.1 percent respectively, the price of weedicides grew marginally in 2010. A 1.9 percent increase in the average price range of weedicides was recorded in 2010. The average price of fungicides and nematicides increased by 5.2 percent and 4.7 percent respectively in 2010.

Cocoa Industry

After three consecutive years of growth, production of cocoa beans declined by 48.1 percent in 2010. This was primarily attributed to the drought conditions experienced during the last quarter of 2009 and the first quarter of 2010, which resulted in reduced yields in 2010. A total of 57.3 tonnes of cocoa beans were produced in 2010 compared to 110.2 tonnes in 2009.

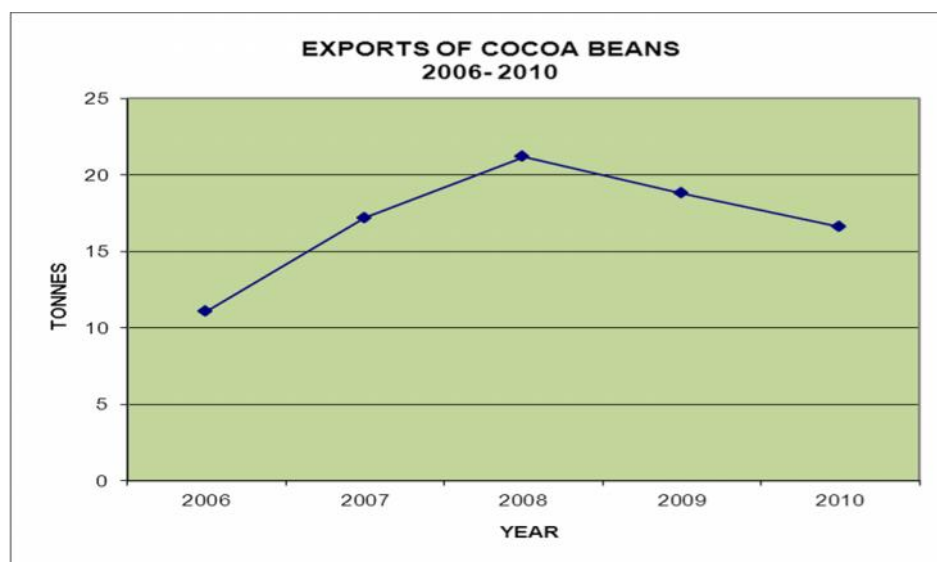

Corresponding with the decline in cocoa beans production in 2010, exports of cocoa beans decreased by 11.7 percent to 16.6 tonnes in 2010. Cocoa beans were only exported during the second quarter of 2010 compared to the previous year, when cocoa beans were exported during the second and third quarters. Notwithstanding a decrease in the quantity of cocoa beans exported in 2010, the price per tonne rose from \$11.3 in 2009 to \$12.7 in 2010. This indicated a 12.4 percent increase in the price of cocoa beans in 2010.

The Ministry of Agriculture continued to provide the necessary support to farmers to help revitalize and develop the cocoa industry. Revitalization of the cocoa industry through the implementation of programmes that seek to rehabilitate existing acreages and further expand acreages is currently being pursued under the Ministry's Crop Development Programme. Cocoa beans has significant export potential, therefore the development of the cocoa industry is of

paramount importance in the Ministry's diversification thrust, in light of the decline in banana exports and earnings.

The development of a viable and thriving cocoa industry will present more opportunities for employment in the rural communities where a substantial amount of production takes place. This would result in increased incomes, reduction in unemployment and poverty in rural communities which are all tied to the objectives of the Ministry's Rural Development Programme. Farmers would benefit from increased sales to exporters, supermarkets, hotels and directly to consumers processing cocoa beans for the manufacture of cocoa sticks.

Non-traditional Crops

Domestic sales of non-traditional crops to supermarkets and hotels exhibited a downward trend in 2010. The review period registered a 15.2 percent decline in the total purchases of non-traditional crops to the above purchasing outlets. This was primarily attributed to the decline in production associated with the drought and hurricane. Total output of non-traditional crops purchased by supermarkets declined by 18.5 percent to 2,305.5 tonnes in 2010, following growth of 9.9 percent in the previous year. The volume of non-traditional crops purchased by the hotels also declined by 5.8 percent to 900.5 tonnes in 2010. Purchases of *Musa* species accounted for 45.4 percent of total purchases.



Exports of non-traditional crops in 2010 largely comprised breadfruit, plantain, avocado, mango, hot pepper, and to a lesser extent, grapefruit, pineapple, sweet orange, sweet potato, yam, pumpkin and aroids (dasheen, tannia, eddoes). Total exports of these produce increased significantly by 51.2 percent to 4,426.51 tonnes, contributing to the 81.1 percent increase in revenue.

Fisheries Sector

The total volume of fish landed declined by 5.7 percent to 1,752 tonnes in 2010, with a corresponding value of EC\$22.6 million. This was primarily attributed to unfavourable weather conditions during 2010, namely, the drought, which caused the fishes to divert to cooler waters. The Fisheries sector experienced damage and loss of many fishing vessels and heavy siltation of coastal waters as a result of the passage of Hurricane Tomas. This affected fish landings particularly during the last quarter of 2010.



A review of catch by species indicates an increase in landings of tuna and kingfish, two of the major fish species landed. Landings of tuna grew by 26.1 percent to 613 tonnes in 2010 and accounted for 35.0 percent of total fish landings. Kingfish accounted for 11.2 percent of fish landings and grew by 1.0 percent to 197 tonnes. Conversely, landings of Dolphin declined by 24.3 percent to 352 tonnes and accounted for 20.1 percent of total landings. Landings of flying fish, which display a large degree of natural variability declined by 50.5 percent to 109 tonnes.

Vieux-fort, Dennery and Soufriere represented the major centres of fishing activity in 2010. Total fish landings at Vieux-Fort and Soufriere increased by 15.8 and 29.5 percent respectively while Dennery recorded a 12.6 percent decline in fish landings. Gros-Islet, which represented the third largest fish landing site in 2009 recorded a 29.7 percent decline in 2010.

Imports of fish increased by 13.3 percent to 1,551 tonnes in 2010. The second quarter represented the only period of decline in fish imports. Imports of fish for that period decreased by 17.2 percent. On the other hand, fish imports grew by 15.6 percent, 36.3 percent and 22.0 percent for the first, third and fourth quarter respectively. The increased levels of fish imports were attributed to declines in fish landings associated with the passage of Hurricane Tomas. Imports of frozen and chilled fish increased by 4.5 percent to 322 tonnes in 2010, while imports of canned fish grew by 22.4 percent in 2010. There was a notable increase in the importation of canned fish during the last two quarters of 2010, due to increased purchases by customers in preparation for Hurricane Tomas. Thus, imports of canned fish increased by 82.8 percent and 52.2 percent during the third and fourth quarter of 2010.

The continued deployment of Fish Aggregating Devices (FAD's) and the implementation of the Fishers training programme is expected to contribute to improvements in the performance of the fisheries sector in the future.

Livestock Subsector



Poultry Imports

Total imports of poultry products declined by 19.7 percent to 6,723 tonnes in 2010 with a corresponding value of \$25.5 million. There was a decline in the importation of all species of poultry, including chicken, turkey and other parts in 2010. This could be attributed to the increase in local poultry production in 2010. Importation of poultry necks, backs and wings which accounted for the majority of poultry imported, declined by 17.6 percent to 3,590 tonnes in 2010. Imports of whole poultry declined by 20.6 percent to 81 tonnes in 2010, while the importation of other parts declined by 21.9 percent to 3,052 tonnes.

Egg Production



Egg production declined by 3.3 percent to 1.2 million dozen eggs, valued at \$6.3 million. Egg production declined by 13.1 percent to 319,000 dozen eggs in the first quarter and 13.5 percent to 281,000 dozen eggs in the second quarter of 2010. During the first half of the year the performance of the egg sub-sector was adversely affected by the drought and poor quality of feed. The drought led to increases in temperature/ heat which resulted in lower yields. Local egg production picked up

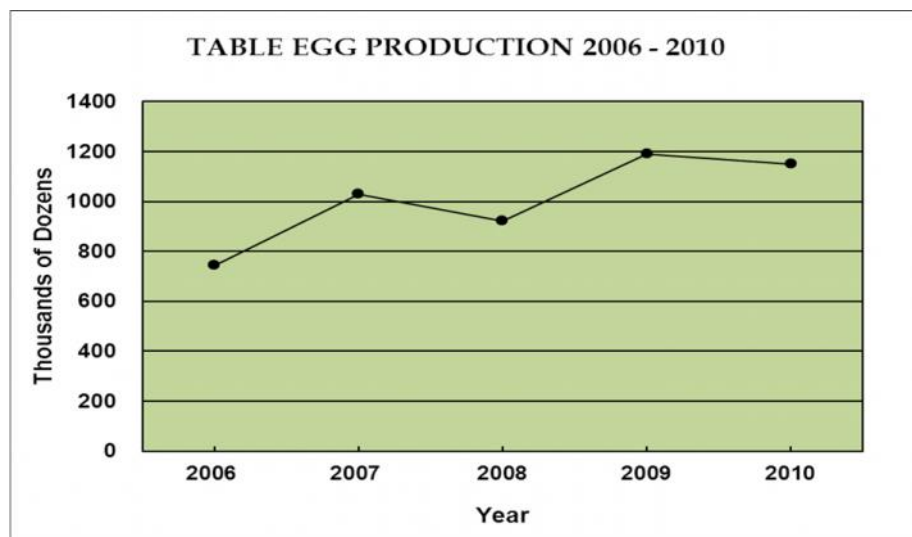
during the second half of 2010, with increases of 0.4 and 19.3 percent respectively during the third and fourth quarters of 2010. The average laying flock of hens on farms decreased by 11.6 percent in 2010.

Local Poultry Production



Local poultry production increased by 26.0 percent to 1,267.9 tonnes valued at \$15.1 million in 2010. This was occasioned by the entry of new producers into the industry and the expansion of several existing plants. While the production of whole chicken declined by 0.98 percent to 707.4 tonnes in 2010, local production of mixed parts grew by 91.8 percent to 560.5 tonnes. Local production of mixed parts grew by more than 100 percent during the beginning of the first and second half of 2010. Significant increases of 62.6 percent and 80.7 percent in the production of mixed parts were also posted during the latter part of the first and second half respectively of 2010.

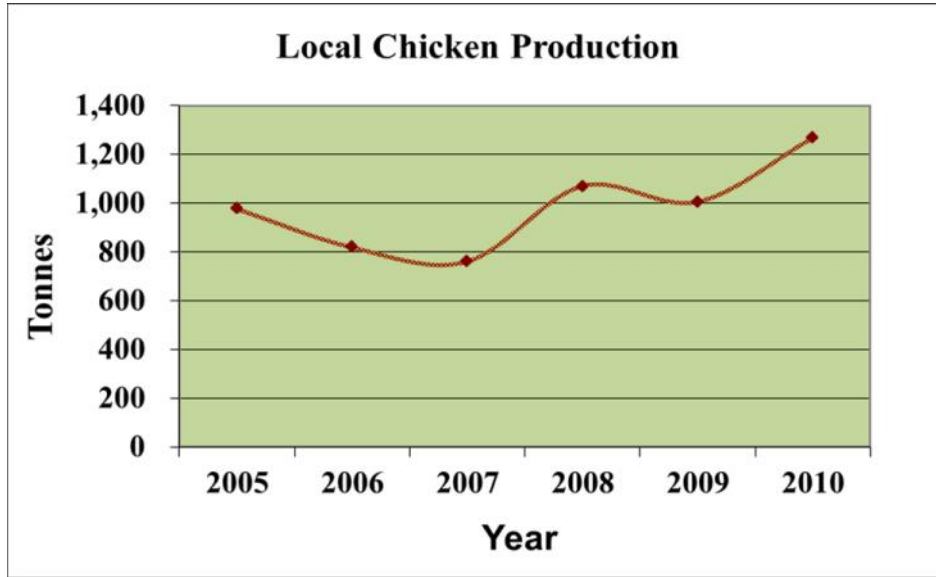

Local Pork Purchases



Local pork purchases increased by 32.5 percent to 192.8 tonnes in 2010. This represented a corresponding increase of 32.1 percent in the value of local purchases to \$2.4 million. There was a significant increase in pork production during the first two quarters of 2010. While local pork production expanded by 70.7 percent to 46.0 tonnes in the first quarter of 2010, local pork purchases grew by 122.6 percent to 52.1 tonnes in the second quarter of 2010. This marked increase in pork production during the first half of 2010 was due to increases in sow productivity and the number of pork outlets island-wide. There was a decrease in local pork purchases during the third quarter of 2010, a decline of 10.4 percent to 47.3 tonnes was recorded in the third quarter of 2010. The fourth quarter recorded an increase of 11.7 percent to 47.3 tonnes in local pork production.

Figure VI-3 Local Pork Purchases

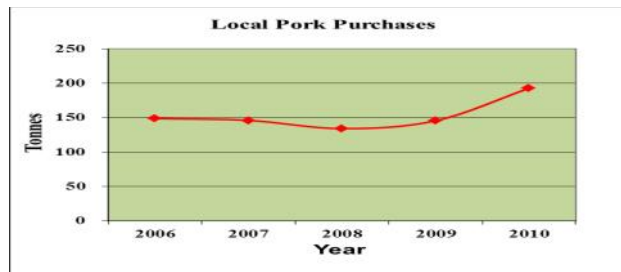

Meat Imports

Following a 27.2 percent decline in imports of beef in 2009, beef imports increased by 8.5 percent to 513 tonnes in 2010. The first, second and third quarters of 2010 posted increases of 3.4, 35.7 and 8.4 percent respectively. This was due to increases in stay-over tourist arrivals which led to increases in demand for beef by the hotel sector. Imports of beef declined by 5.1 percent to 112 tonnes in the last quarter of 2010. The passage of Hurricane Tomas in October 2010 had an adverse effect on the tourism sector in the last two months of the year, resulting in the temporary closure of some hotels. This led to reduced hotel occupancy rates which in turn resulted in decreases in demand for beef.



Pork imports grew by 40.5 percent to 586 tonnes in 2010. All four quarters of 2010 recorded increases in the importation of pork. This signifies the need for increases in the production and productivity of pork in the domestic market to satisfy local demand. Imports of mutton continued to decline in 2010, 445 tonnes of mutton was imported which represents a 23.8 percent decline compared to 2009, which registered a decline of 21.8 percent in imports of mutton. Following an increase of 85.7 percent in chevron imports in 2009, imports of chevron declined by 5.1 percent to 37 tonnes in 2010. It is anticipated that when the Meat Processing Facility becomes operational, the importation of meat particularly beef and pork would be significantly reduced.

Imports of Selected Livestock Products

Following a 12.3 percent increase in imports of milk in 2009, milk imports decreased by 25.8 percent to 2,890 tonnes in 2010. The value of imported milk declined by 11.7 percent to \$15.9 million in 2010. A similar trend was followed for cheese imports, which declined by 10.3 percent to 822 tonnes, however, the value of cheese imports grew by 4.6 percent to \$11.7 million in 2010. Imports of butter/butterfat rose by 12.2 percent (101 tonnes), with a corresponding increase in value of 20.7 percent.

Agricultural Financing

In 2010, the number of loans approved for agricultural and fishing activities declined substantially by 68.5 percent to 40 loans, valued at \$2.9 million. Significant declines were recorded for all major agriculture sub-sectors. The number of loans approved for Crop development decreased by 70.8 percent to 26, valued at \$0.4 million, while loans approved for livestock declined by 57.9 percent to 8, valued at \$1.0 million. Despite the sharp decline in the number of loans approved for the Livestock Sub-sector, the Poultry industry recorded an increase of 20.0 percent in the number of approved loans. This represents the highest number of loans approved for that industry over the past four years. Contrary to the preceding four years, the review period did not record any loan approvals for fishing and industry related activities, however four(4) additional loans were approved for Land Purchase & Development during 2010, when compared to 2009.

Figure VII-1 Number of Loans disbursed by Type of Agricultural Activity 2006 - 2010

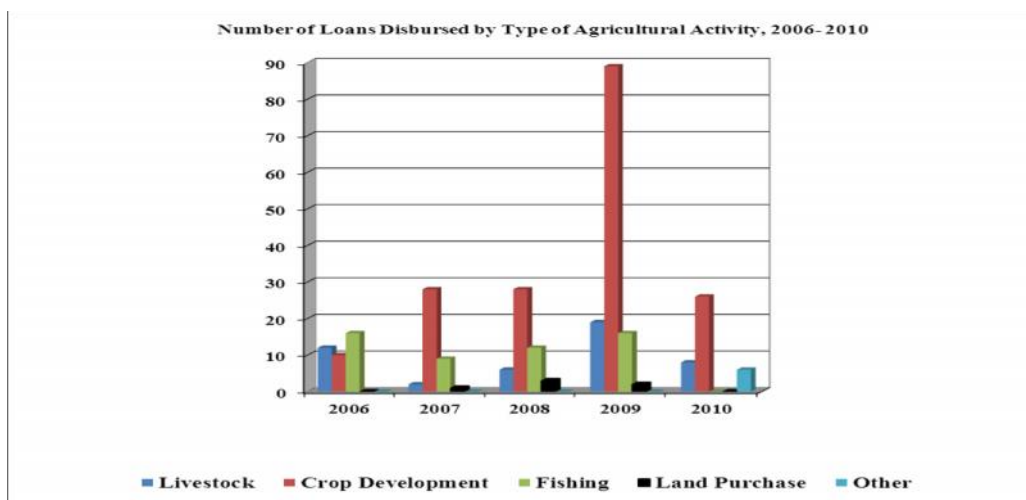


Figure VII-2 Value (EC\$'000) of Loans Disbursed by type of Agricultural Activity 2006 - 2010

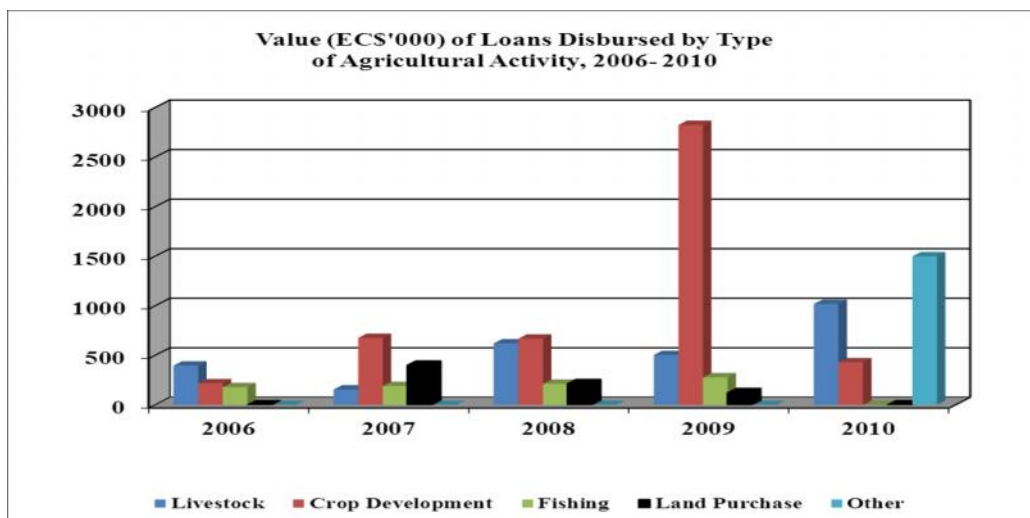

Food Trade Balance

The trade balance on food for 2010, grew by 2.4 percent (or \$5.3 million) to \$227.8 million, following a 1.7 percent decline in 2009. This represents the highest food trade balance over the past four years and is mainly as a result of the significant decline in food exports. Food exports, which accounted for 32.0 percent of domestic exports, declined by 30.8 percent to \$48.7 million. While food exports in the first quarter of 2010 grew by 7.7 percent, the second and third quarters recorded declines of 20.3 percent and 25.7 percent respectively. The last quarter of 2010 recorded the lowest level of food exports, as a result of the adverse effects on crops caused by the passage of Hurricane Tomas. Exports during that period dipped by 72.0 percent and corresponded to the highest recorded food trade balance during that period.

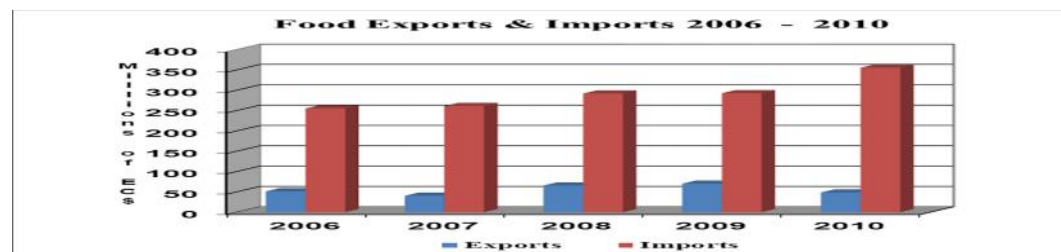

Food imports accounted for 20 percent of total imports in 2010. During the review period, food imports declined by 5.6 percent to \$276.5 million, following increasing levels over the past two years. Both quarters of the first half of 2010 posted declines of 52.3 percent and 13.6 percent respectively, while a differing path was followed during the second half. The third and fourth quarters of 2010 registered increased imports of food of 19.3 percent and 21.6 percent respectively.

Composition of Food Imports

Food imports for 2010 totaled \$276.5 million, a 5.6 percent decline over 2009. Declines in the major food products excluding Feeding Stuff for Animals contributed to the overall reduction in food imports. A significant increase of 245.8 percent in Feeding Stuff for Animals represented the highest level of imports for this item over the past five years. The major food imports for 2010 included Meat and Meat Preparations, followed by Cereal & Cereal Preparations, Vegetables and Fruits, and Dairy Products & Eggs.

Although Meat and Meat Preparations accounted for the largest share of food imports, the most notable decline in food imports was attributed to cereal and cereal preparations, which declined by 25.7 percent to \$50.8 million. Meat and Meat Preparations dropped from \$64.0 million to \$55.9 million, representing a 12.7 percent decline.

Exports of Selected Agri-Produce

The major exports of agriculture produce in 2010 were breadfruit (317.1 tonnes) and plantain (343.6), followed by mango(44.1 tonnes) on a smaller scale. Total exports of the selected produce, excluding bananas earned revenue of \$5.9 million, an 18.0 percent increase over the preceding period. With the inclusion of bananas, revenue generated from exports of agriculture produce increased significantly by 81.1 percent to \$5.9 million, banana exports accounted for 81.3 percent of revenue earned.

Although the volume of breadfruit exports has fluctuated during the past five years, volume of plantain exports has somewhat maintained a steady growth rate. In 2010, plantain exports grew by 5.2 percent, with a corresponding 9.5 percent increase in unit price. While breadfruit exports decreased further by 29.1 percent, the unit price remained constant. Mango exports increased by 36.2 percent, following a 63.1 percent drop in 2009.

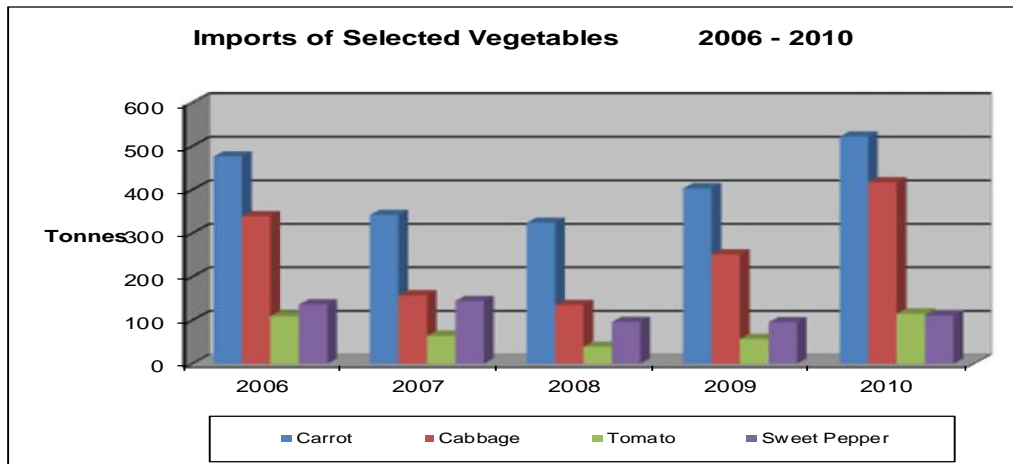

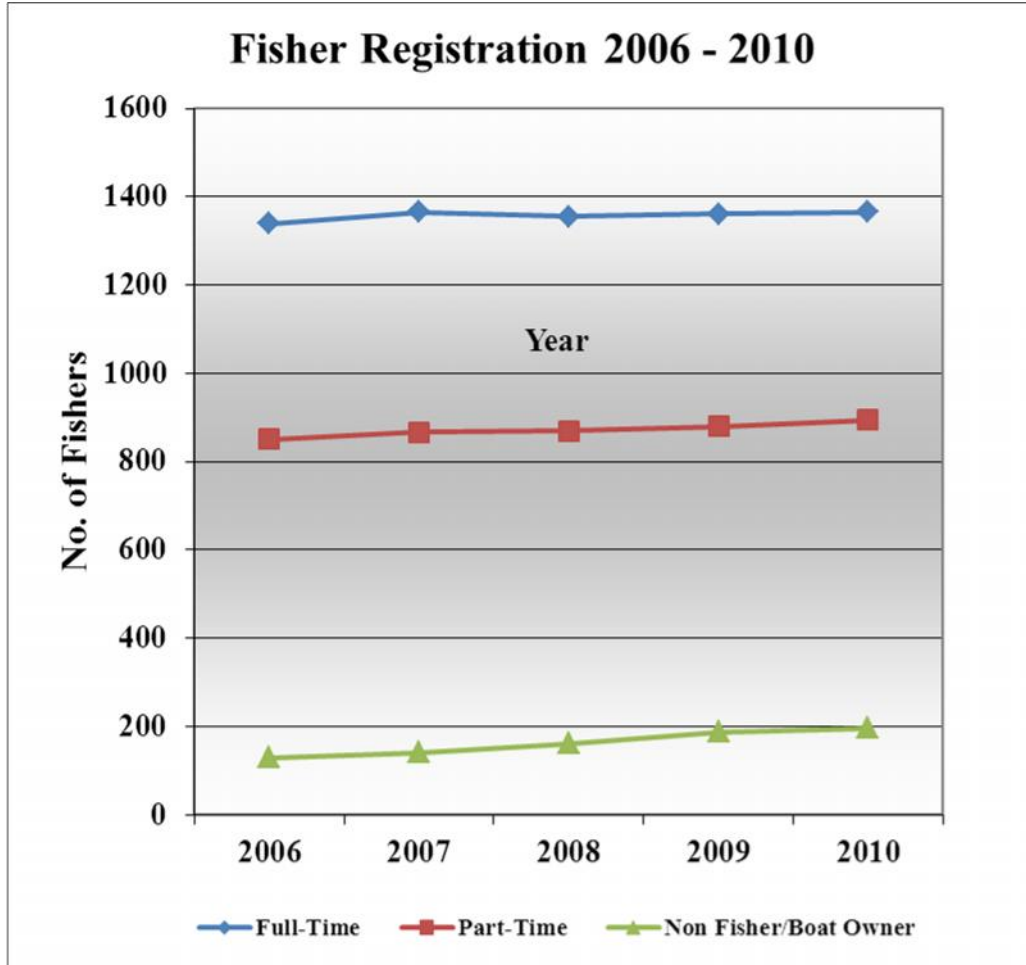
