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## FOREWORD

The Annual Agricultural Review is a publication of the Ministry of Agriculture, Food Production, Fisheries and Rural Development prepared by the Corporate Planning Unit. 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## **DOMESTIC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS**

The global economic performance for 2011 was characterized by substantial differences in the rate of economic growth across regions and economies. Although supported by the aid of monetary policy, growth in leading economies slowed down due to lingering weaknesses in housing markets, credit and labour associated with the global financial crisis. Weak underlying demand, persistent large fiscal imbalances, high debt levels (mainly in the European Union) and fears of a “double-dip” recession negatively affected growth.

Decelerated growth in global economies in 2011 affected the performance of regional economies; the region however, was able to record an expansion in GDP growth for the year 2011. This growth resurgence was dampened as a result of rising international oil and food prices.

General activity in St. Lucia’s economy showed signs of continued recovery from the global financial crisis. Preliminary estimates indicate that real GDP expanded by 1.0 percent in 2011 compared to the revised growth of 0.6 percent in 2010. The growth rate of 2010 was downgraded from the original 4.4 percent increase. The increase in economic growth in 2011 was attributed to the positive performance of the hotel and restaurant sector along with growth in the construction sector. Increases in value added were also recorded within the manufacturing sector, hotel and restaurant sector, distributive trade services, real estate, renting and business activities.

## **OVERVIEW OF THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR**

In 2011, the agricultural sector recorded another year of negative growth. The sector contracted by a further 6.5 percent, following a significant dip of 18.2 percent in 2010. The reduction was as a result of the continued adverse effects of the passage of Hurricane Tomas in 2010 as well as the widespread infestation caused by the Black Sigatoka disease. Declines were recorded in value-added for all sub-sectors excluding other crops.

## Fisheries

The fisheries sector recorded another year of negative growth. Fish Landings declined by a further 7.1 percent in 2011. This was as a result of unfavorable sea conditions resulting in a reduction in the number of fishing trips. The sector exhibited growth in the level of fish imports, which, grew by 0.9 percent.


## Livestock

The livestock sub-sector registered mixed performances in 2011. Poultry production increased by 11.1 percent, this was mainly attributed to development (entry of new farmers/ expansion of existing plants) within the industry. Alternatively, activity within the pig-farming industry reduced, causing local pork purchases to decline by 8.3 percent. The basis for this reduction was due to the rising cost of animal feed. Despite the above, poultry imports increased by 37.4 percent and meat imports with the exception of beef declined.

## Banana

Banana exports to the UK decreased significantly by 63.5 percent or 6,557 tonnes. On the other hand, regional exports increased by 9.6 percent or 353 tonnes. During the review period, regional banana exports were to Barbados and Trinidad. The value of banana exports declined by 65.0 percent or \$30.3 million in 2011 when compared to 2010. The volume of bananas purchased by marketing outlets declined significantly by 47.0 percent, whereas, hotel purchases grew by 13.1.

### **Non-Traditional Crops**

Mixed performances were recorded in the volume of non-traditional crops purchased by marketing outlets and hotels. The volume of domestic agricultural produce purchased by supermarkets declined by 35.2 percent whilst hotel purchases increased by 25 percent. Notably, 2011 recorded the highest volume of domestic agriculture produce purchased by hotels over the past five years; a dissimilar path was recorded for marketing outlets.

## Banana Industry

Banana exports to the UK declined by 63.5 percent to 6,557 tonnes in 2011. The devastation caused by hurricane Tomas and the infestation of fields by the Black Sigatoka disease largely contributed to this weak performance. During the first half of the year, 1,124 tonnes of bananas were exported to the UK. This represents a 93.4 percent decline compared to the previous year, where 17,023 tonnes of bananas were exported to the UK.

The island-wide spread of the Black Sigatoka epidemic resulted in reduced yields as some farmers were forced to destroy the majority of their banana plants coupled with the blockage of farm access roads following the passage of the hurricane were other contributory factors to the decline in exports. In keeping with the fall in exports due to widespread crop damage, banana revenue from UK exports declined by 63.0 percent to \$13.0 million in 2011.

The St. Lucia National Fair Trade Organization (SLNFTO) was the only banana company involved in the exports of bananas to the UK in 2011. The company exported 6,557 tonnes of bananas to the UK. Over 70 percent of the price range for banana inputs recorded increases in 2011, these increases varied from 0.2 percent to 33 percent. The price of all types of fertilizers, namely NPK and Sulphate of Ammonia rose significantly in 2011 compared to 2010. The price of various fungicides and nematicides also exhibited growth in 2011. On the other hand, the price range of most types of weedicides declined in 2011, notably Gramaxone price range fell from \$27.25 -\$29.00 in 2010 to \$25.00 -\$25.10 in 2011 and Touch Down Liter price range fell from \$39.00-\$39.50 in 2010 to \$31.25- \$33.00 in 2011. While the price range of twine remained constant in 2011, the price of Blue Diothene increased in 2011.

Banana exports to the region increased by 9.6 percent to 4,040 tonnes in 2011. Barbados and Trinidad continued to account for the largest share of regional banana exports in 2011. Barbados accounted for 52.4 percent of regional banana exports in 2011 while Trinidad accounted for 47.6 percent. Banana exports to Barbados rose by 48.3 percent to 2,117.8 tonnes in 2011 while exports to Trinidad declined by 14.9 percent to 1,921.7 tonnes.

The number of banana farmers within the industry stood at 1,290 in 2011, representing a 3.4 percent decline over 2010.



## Cocoa Industry

Cocoa beans production declined by 19.2 percent to 46.2 tonnes. This was occasioned by adverse weather conditions during the previous year, particularly the

passage of Hurricane Tomas which resulted in reduced yields in 2011.

Moreover, all four quarters of 2011 recorded declines in the production of cocoa beans compared to the corresponding periods in 2010. Production levels declined by 22.7 percent, 39.8 percent, 24.4 percent and 9.8 percent during the first, second, third and fourth quarters of 2011 respectively.

The production of Cocoa beans was at its highest levels during the first and fourth quarters of 2011, where 15 tonnes and 19.4 tonnes were produced respectively. Cocoa beans were only exported during the second quarter of 2011, 16.6 tonnes of cocoa valued at \$209,000.00 were exported. Although the quantity of cocoa exported remained unchanged, the value dipped by 0.9 percent indicating a decline in the cost per ton of cocoa. This was as a result of a reduction in the price offered by purchasers.



## Non-Traditional Crops



Total domestic sales of non-traditional crops to supermarkets declined by 35.2 percent to 1,494.1 tonnes in 2011. This is as a result of the decrease in sales for all categories of non-traditional crops including Fruit and Tree Crops, Vegetables, Musa species, Root Crops, Herbs and Spices and Miscellaneous Crops. The decline ranged from 9.2 percent to 44 percent. The Musa species (Bananas,

Plantain, Macambou) which accounts for a significant share of non-traditional crops (45.6 percent in 2011) purchased by supermarkets, declined by 41.6 percent to 680.8 tonnes in 2011. Output of non-traditional crops for the period under review was largely affected by the damage caused by Hurricane Tomas during the last quarter of 2010 and Black Sigatoka infestation which led to reduced output of plantain and bananas. The low supply resulted in a contraction in supermarket purchases during the period under review. On the other hand, stronger demand for non-traditional crops led to a notable increase in the volume of non-traditional crops purchased by the hotel sector. Hotel purchases rose by 25.1 percent to 1,126.1 tonnes in 2011. Although Fruit and Tree Corps and Musa Species account for the largest share of non-traditional crops

purchased by hotels (28 percent each), the largest increase was recorded for Root Crops, Condiments and Miscellaneous.

Breadfruit and plantain represented the largest quantity of non-traditional crops exported in 2011. Exports of both crops grew by 41.9 percent and 21 percent respectively.



## **Fisheries Sector**



The fisheries sector recorded a decline of 7.1 percent in the tonnage of fish landed in 2011. The total volume of fish landings was recorded at 1,628 tonnes in 2011, with a corresponding value of \$22.5 million. This was attributed to persistently strong currents and rough seas which resulted in a decrease in the number of fishing trips. Tuna, Dolphin and King Fish were the three major species landed in 2011. Landings of Tuna and King Fish declined by 11.7 percent to 541 tonnes and 1.0 percent to 197 tonnes respectively in 2011, while landings of Dolphin increased by 34.4 percent to 473 tonnes in 2011.

The increase in landings of small dolphin was attributed to the unusually high quantities of sargassum seaweed within regional waters during 2011. Juvenile Dolphins tend to take shelter under these floating seaweed mats. Landings of Flying Fish which display a large degree of variability declined by 79.8 percent to 22 tonnes, landings of other species of fish declined by 16.5 percent to 394 tonnes during the period under review.

The districts of Vieux-Fort, Dennery and Soufriere were the three major landing sites in 2011. The tonnage of fish landed at Vieux-fort increased by 13.6 percent to 535 tonnes in 2011. Fish landings in Dennery declined by 25.5 percent to 280 tonnes while Soufriere posted a 28.3 percent decline in fish landings which were recorded at 115 tonnes.

There was a 13.4 percent decrease in the number of fishing trips in 2011 compared to the same period in 2010. There were decreases in the number of fishing trips at most of the landing sites with the exception of Choiseul, Anse La Raye and Other Sites which posted increases of 2.2 percent, 17.5 percent and 25.0 percent respectively.

Fish imports increased by 0.9 percent (14 tonnes) to 1537 tonnes in 2011 with a corresponding value of \$21.6 million. Canned fish which accounts for 47.4 percent of total imported fish declined by 6.9 percent, followed by Frozen and Chilled fish which decreased by 1.2 percent. An increase of 9.6 percent or 491 tonnes was recorded for other fish. The first half of 2011 registered an increase in the importation of fish; during that period, fish imports grew by 14 percent to 774 tonnes when compared to 2010. Lower fish import levels were recorded during the second half of 2011, imports for that period declined by 12.4 percent to 763 tonnes compared to the same period of 2010.

## **Livestock Subsector**

### **Poultry Imports**

Total imports of poultry grew by 37.4 percent to 9,236 tonnes with a corresponding value of \$38.6 million in 2011. Chicken imports increased by 40.1 percent to 8,279 tonnes, valued at \$33.3 million.

Turkey imports grew by 16.3 percent to 914 tonnes, valued at \$4.9 million while imports of other meats rose by 59.3 percent to 43 tonnes, valued at \$453,000 in 2011. Chicken imports increased by 40.1 percent to 8,279 tonnes, valued at \$33.3 million. Turkey imports grew by 16.3 percent to 914 tonnes, valued at \$4.9 million while imports of other meats rose by 59.3 percent to 43 tonnes, valued at \$453,000 in 2011. Imports of whole chicken decreased by 50 percent to 9 tonnes in 2011 which indicates growing consumer demand in the local market.

This signals the need for increased production of chicken by local farmers. Imports of whole turkey remained constant in 2011. Imports of Poultry necks, backs and wings which accounted for fifty percent of total poultry imports in 2011 grew by 27.5 percent to 4,577 tonnes, valued at \$16.2 million. Imports of chicken necks, backs and wings grew by 29.7 percent to 4,028 tonnes in 2011, while turkey necks, backs and wings rose by 13.2 percent to 549 tonnes during the review period. Total imports of other parts increased by 49.9 percent to 4,574 tonnes, valued at 21.8 million in 2011. Imports of chicken other parts which comprise 92.7 percent of total imported poultry other parts in 2011, grew by 51.6 percent to 4,242 tonnes, valued at \$19.8 million.

## Egg Production



Notwithstanding the increasing cost of feed, egg production increased by 9.6 percent to 1.3 million dozen eggs, valued at \$6.9 million in 2011. All four quarters of 2011 recorded growth in local egg production compared to 2010. The average laying flock on farms increased by 6.6 percent to 65,000 hens.



## Local Poultry Production

The production of local chicken grew by 11.1 percent to 1408.1 tonnes, valued at \$16.5 million. This corresponded to the 9.1 percent increase over the previous period. Local production of whole chicken increased by 14.2 percent to 807.9 tonnes, valued at \$9.4 million in 2011.



### Local Pork Purchases



Despite the decrease, the period under review recorded the second highest level of local pork purchases since 2004. During the first, second and fourth quarters of 2011, local pork purchases declined by 8.3 percent, 18.2 percent and 15.5 percent respectively.

However, during the third quarter of 2011, Pork purchases grew by 9.8 percent to 52 tonnes with a corresponding value of \$667,000.00.

## Meat Imports

In 2011, there was a decline in the importation of most meats with the exception of beef which grew in 2011. Imports of beef increased by 17.5 percent to 603 tonnes, with a corresponding value of \$11.3 million in 2011.



The first, second and fourth quarters recorded growth of 32.5 percent, 37.7 percent and 28.6 percent respectively. Imports of beef declined by 14.4 percent to 143 tonnes during the third quarter of 2011. Imports of pork declined by 14.8 to 499 tonnes, valued at \$3.7 million. All four quarters of 2011 recorded declines in the importation of pork compared to 2010. Imports of mutton declined by 7.2 percent to 413 tonnes. The corresponding value for mutton imports rose by 11.9 percent to \$5.8 million, indicating an increase in the price of mutton. Imports of chevron recorded the highest decline among all types of imported meats including pork and mutton. Imports of chevron declined by 45.9 percent to 20 tonnes in 2011, with a corresponding value of \$242,000.00.



## **Imports of Selected Livestock Products**

Imports of selected livestock products, including milk, cheese and butter grew in 2011, compared to the corresponding period of 2010. Imports of milk increased by 33.9 percent to 3,869 tonnes with a corresponding value of \$21.3 million, during the first half of 2011, imports of milk rose by 150 percent, conversely, milk imports during the second half declined by 8 percent.

The imports of milk throughout 2011 were well balanced as compared with 2010 which recorded extremely low milk imports in the first and second quarters. Cheese imports rose by 29.3 percent to 1,063 tonnes, valued at \$15.1 million, imports of butter increased by 19.8 percent to 121 tonnes. The value of imported butter increased by 19.0 percent to \$2.0 million in 2011 compared to the corresponding period of 2010.

## **Agricultural Financing**

During the review period, a total of 27 loans valued at \$545,000.00 were approved for Agricultural and Fishing Activities. This signifies a 32.5 percent decline over 2010 and represents the lowest number of loans issued for the sector over the past 5 years. The loans issued were for Livestock, Fishing, Crop Development, Land Purchase & Development, and Other. A total of 16 loans with corresponding value of \$296,000.00 were approved for livestock, which accounted for 59 percent of the total number of approved loans.

The drop in Agricultural Financing as indicated by the number of loans approved for the period was attributed to Livestock, Crop Development and other, which declined by 50 percent, 38.5 percent and 50 percent respectively. Despite the significant dip in most of the agricultural activity, growth was recorded under Land Purchase and Development as well as Fishing, this represents significant improvement given that loans were not issued under the previous period.

## Food Trade Balance

The trade balance of food increased considerably by 45.5 percent to \$331.4 million, compared to 2010 where trade balance on food was \$227.8 million. This large increase in the food trade balance is as a result of the decreased level of food exports. Food exports, which accounted for 10 percent of total exports declined further by 20.6 percent to \$24.1 million. This represents the lowest level of food exports for the past five years. For the first three quarters, food exports declined significantly by 88 percent, 65 percent and 30.2 percent respectively. Although negative growth was recorded for the previous quarters of 2011, the fourth quarter showed notable signs of recovery. During the fourth quarter, food exports grew by 46.7 percent to \$8.7 million.



On the other hand, food imports, increased by 28.5 percent to \$355.5 million and accounted for 19 percent of total imports in 2011. Total food imports in 2011 represented the highest level of food imports over the past 5 years. All four quarters of 2011 recorded increases in food imports when compared to the previous period. The first quarter represented the highest increase (146.8 percent) in food imports, the second quarter increased by 42 percent, whilst the third and fourth quarter recorded a negligible increase of 0.4 percent and 0.8 percent respectively.

## Composition of Food Imports

The composition of food imports in 2011 comprised mainly of Meat and Meat Preparations, Cereal and Cereal Preparation, Vegetables and Fruits, Dairy Products & Eggs.

Meat and Meat Preparations represented the largest share or 22 percent of Food imports and has maintained this average for the past 5 years.

The imports of meat and meat preparations increased by 41.6 percent to \$79.1 million in 2011, food imports of Cereal and Cereal Preparation, Vegetables and Fruits as well as Dairy Products and Eggs increased significantly by 35.8 percent, 32.2 percent and 31.4 percent respectively. Increases in total food imports were recorded for all produce excluding Miscellaneous Food Preparation. Food Imports for Miscellaneous Food Preparation declined by 10.5 percent as compared to the previous period.

## Exports of Selected Agri-Producte

In 2011, exports of agricultural produce exclusive of bananas earned \$1.5 million with a corresponding 972.74 tonnes exported. The major exports of agricultural produce, were Breadfruit (450.06 tonnes) and Plantain (415.14 tonnes). Breadfruit and Plantain which accounted for 46.3 percent and 43 percent of the total exports (exclusive of bananas) had a corresponding value of \$861,610.00 and \$482,470.00 respectively. Breadfruit Exports increased by 41.9 percent in 2011, following a drop of 29.1 percent in 2010. Plantain exports also increased by 21 percent to 415.14 tonnes in 2011. Moreover, sweet oranges increased from 0.4 tonnes in 2010 to a remarkable 36.8 tonnes in 2011. The period under review recorded the highest level of sweet oranges exports for the past 5 years. Conversely, the exports of mangoes

continued its downward path and declined further by 36.7 percent, indicating the lowest mango export over the preceding 5 years.



**Average Price Per KG. Of Selected Agricultural Produce**






