FOREWORD

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DOMESTIC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

The global economy gained momentum in 2012, following the fallout from the financial crisis. Recovery efforts within the advanced economy transpired at a faster pace than that of developing economies. World output expanded at a decelerated rate of 3.2 percent in 2012, when compared to 2011. The Caribbean regions were faced with the possible setbacks surrounding the fragile global recovery, as most of these countries depend on the external economies for their own economic growth. Economic activity within the Eastern Caribbean Countries contracted, primarily as a result of reduced output in the Tourism sector, emanating from declines in visitor expenditure and cruise arrivals.

Saint Lucia's economy contracted by 0.8, in 2012, following a revised growth of 1.5 percent in 2011. The overall decline in productivity was attributed to significant downturns in the construction, transport, communications and distributive trade services. Despite the recession in economic activity, the Agriculture Sector registered growth, particularly within the banana industry.

The issues surrounding social development, namely, unemployment continued to pose a hindrance to the economic development of the country, however, the establishment of job creating initiatives within the public service in 2012 have positively impacted on the unemployment rate. On the other hand, the rate of inflation increased to 4.2 percent in 2012, following the rising cost of commodities on the market, which was partially due to the introduction of the Value Added Tax (VAT) in October 2012. The VAT is expected to boost revenue and contribute to an overall improvement in the fiscal position for 2013 and beyond.

OVERVIEW OF THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR

During the period under review (2012), the Agriculture Sector showed signs of recovery by recording growth of 8.4 percent, following significant declines over the 2010/2011 period. The increased performance within the sector was mainly attributed to recovery efforts within the banana industry. Government's assistance through subsidies and management of diseases contributed to the upturn of the industry. Thus, the sector's contribution to total Gross Domestic Product (GDP) moved from 2.8 percent in 2011 to 3.10 percent in 2012.

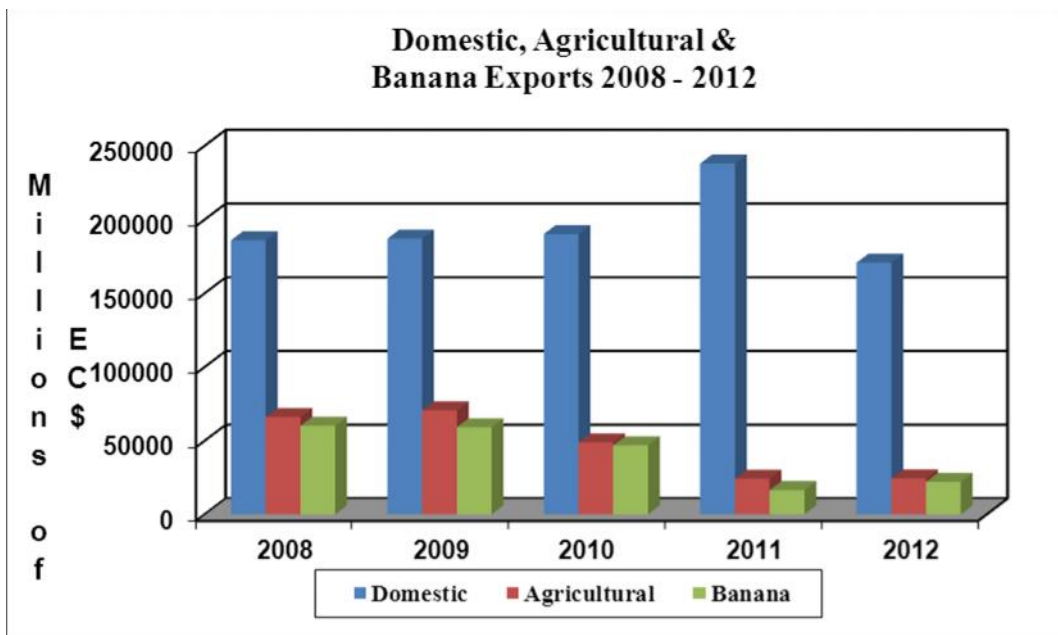

Banana

Total Banana exports increased by 37.4 percent to 14,557 tonnes in 2012. Eighty three (83) percent of bananas were exported to the United Kingdom (UK), whilst the remainder entered the regional markets of Trinidad and Barbados. Banana exports to the UK increased by 85.0 percent while exports to the Caribbean region dropped by 39.8 percent, highlighting the significant decline in exports to Trinidad. However, value added within the banana sub-sector expanded by 52.8 percent, mirroring the positive effect of Government's intervention.

Non-Traditional Crops

The volume of non-traditional crops purchased by supermarkets increased significantly, whilst declines were recorded within the hotel industry. The increased quantity of produce supplied to the supermarkets can be linked to CFL support programme for farmers, which contributed to the increased number of farmers supplying produce to the supermarket chain.

Fisheries

The fisheries sector contracted by 0.6 percent in 2012. The continuous decline in fish landings may be attributed to unusual sea conditions in addition to the high quantities of sargarssum seaweed in the region seas. Furthermore, the fisheries sector posted increases of 8.4 percent in the level of fish imports.

Livestock

The review period registered improved performance in the livestock sub-sector. Production levels within the poultry and pork industry expanded by 5.1 percent and 8.7 percent respectively, positively portraying Government's commitment in repositioning the livestock sub-sector. On the other hand, the increased cost of feed adversely impacted egg production, which posted a decline of 5.9 percent. Imports of Meat and Poultry both increased during the review period. Meat and Meat preparations accounted for the largest share of food imports in 2012.

Banana Industry



Total banana exports (UK and region) increased by 37.4 percent to 14,557 tonnes in 2012. Revenue for that period increased by 35.0 percent to \$22.7 million. The increase is primarily due to increased exports to the United Kingdom. However, despite measures taken to revitalize the industry, the total number of banana farmers within the industry dropped to 950, a 26.3 percent decline over 2011 and an overall decline of 40.6 percent over the past

decade. The decline was as a result of the widespread infestation of Black Sigatoka disease.

Banana exports to the United Kingdom (UK) significantly increased by 85.0 percent to 12,126 tonnes, generating revenue of \$21.1 million compared to \$13.0 million in 2011. During the first half of 2012, banana exports to the UK grew by a remarkable 81.3 percent to 6008 tonnes when compared to the same period of 2011, where a mere 1,124 tonnes were exported due to the cessation of exports to the UK for the first four months. Total banana exports to the UK in the second half increased by 12.6 percent to 6117, exports during the third quarter grew by 27.8 percent while exports during the last quarter dwindled by a mere 0.4 percent. The upturn in the banana industry for 2012 is due to Post Tomas rehabilitation efforts and Government's intervention for the management of the Black Sigatoka Disease. As a result of measures taken to address the decline in banana production and exports, revenue derived from banana exports to the UK increased significantly by 63.0 percent (\$8.2 million) to \$21.9 million following a decline of 65.0 percent in 2011.

For the second consecutive year, the St. Lucia National Fair Trade Organization (SLNFTO) remained the only banana company involved in the exports of bananas to the UK in 2012.

The review period recorded a 39.8 percent decline in regional banana exports with a corresponding 58.7 percent drop in revenue. Banana exports to the region moved from 4040 tonnes in 2011 to 2432 tonnes in 2012, valued at \$1.6 million. Although, Barbados and Trinidad remained the main destination for regional exports, banana exports to Trinidad declined significantly by 94.0 percent to 121.65 tonnes, indicating a drop of 93.5 percent or \$2.0 million in revenue. The decline in exports to Trinidad may be as a result of the inability of exporters to meet their quotas. On the other hand, exports to Barbados increased by 9.1 percent to 2310.1 tonnes, valued at \$1.5 million.

In 2012, the prices of banana inputs generally increased. The price range of all types of weedicides grew however, the prices of fertilizers varied. The price of boraticide and nematicides also exhibited growth in 2012, whilst most of the price range for fungicides remained unchanged excluding Amistar, which grew by 8.3 percent.

The Cocoa Industry



The production of cocoa beans recorded its third year of negative growth. Cocoa bean production declined by a further 45.5 percent to 25.2 tonnes. This represents the lowest level of cocoa bean production over the last five years. This may be as a result of major cocoa producers exiting the industry. During the review period, cocoa bean production occurred only in the second and fourth quarter. The latter posted a decline of 56.5 percent while the former recorded an increase of 204 percent when compared to the same period of 2011.

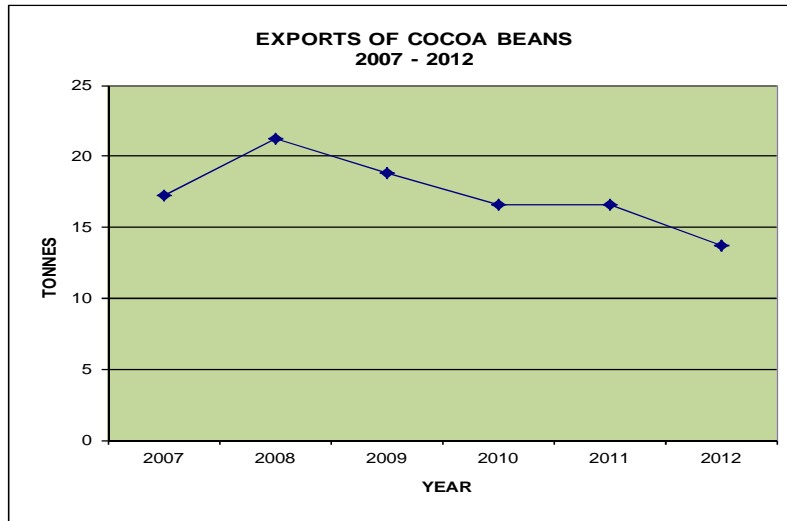
In keeping with the overall decline in cocoa bean production, total exports of Cocoa beans decreased by 17.5 percent to 13.7 tonnes with a corresponding value of \$173,500.00. However, it is anticipated that an expansion project for cocoa will be implemented within the latter part of 2013. The Cocoa Agro Forestry Project, as it is termed will be funded under the Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre (5 c's). The Ministry of Sustainable Development, Energy, Science and Technology, will be spare heading the implementation of the project.

Non-Traditional Crops



The volume of local agricultural produce purchased by supermarkets increased considerably by 97.5 percent to 2,950 tonnes in 2012, representing the highest quantity of produce purchased by supermarkets over the past five years. Significant increases for all produce were recorded for the review period compared to 2011, in particular, purchases of herbs and spices accounted for the highest percentage increase (159.7 percent). Musa species (bananas, plantain, macambou) which represents 41.3 percent of total agricultural purchases by supermarkets, grew substantially by 78.2 percent, Fruit & Tree Crops and Vegetables also posted triple digit growths of 108 percent and 122.4 percent respectively. Increased production in this subsector is attributed to the post-Tomas vegetable crop rehabilitation programme along with the CFL support programme. Despite the significant increase in supply, revenue generated increased by a mere 2.0 percent to \$9.1 million compared to 2011, indicating a reduction in the unit prices of the commodities.

Consistent with the reduction in stay-over arrivals, hotel purchases of agricultural produce contracted by 13.0 percent to 979.3 tonnes in 2012, following a 25.1 percent increase in 2011. Lower demand for produce led to declines in all commodities during 2012, causing revenue to fall by 12.2 percent to \$4.9 million, compared to the \$5.6 million earned in 2011.

Breadfruit and plantain remain the dominant exports for other crops. However, during the review period, both produce posted declines of 6.2 percent and 0.03 percent respectively.

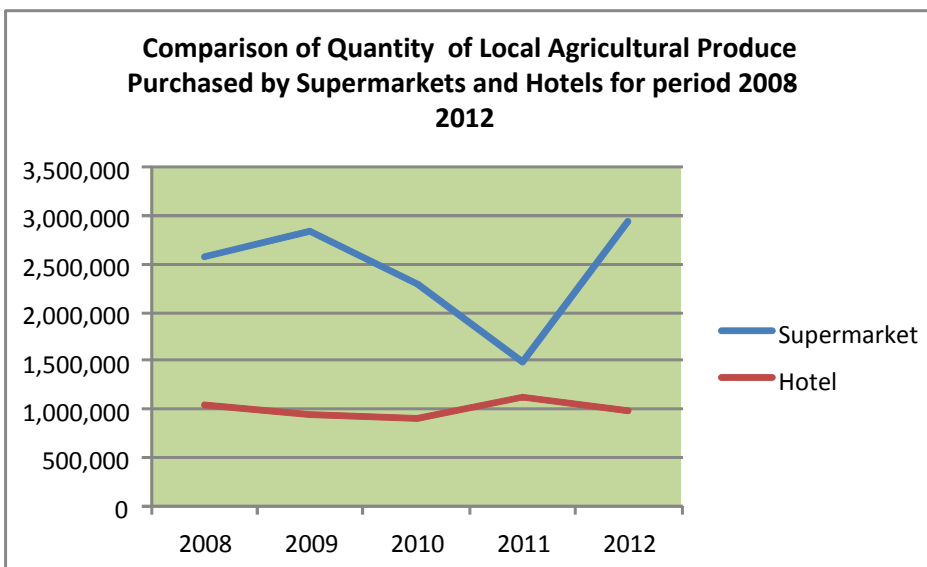

Fisheries Sector



In 2012, the fisheries sector recorded its third consecutive year of negative growth albeit at a decelerated rate. The tonnage of fish landed for 2012, when compared to 2011, declined by 0.6 percent to 1618 tonnes, causing revenue to dip by 6.8 percent to \$20.9 million.

The island continued to experience strong currents and rough seas which affected the quantity of fish landings. The major species of fish landed in 2012 were Tuna, Dolphin and King Fish. Landings of Tuna and King Fish declined by 18.3 percent to 442 tonnes and 23.4 percent to 151 tonnes respectively in 2012, while landings of Dolphin maintained its growth path by increasing by 6.6 percent to 504 tonnes. Landings of Flying fish posted a significant decline of 82 percent compared to 2011. This may be attributed to changes in environmental conditions and the unusually high quantities of sargassum seaweed in the regions seas. Landings of other species of fish increased by 28.7 percent to 507 tonnes during the review period.

The three major landing sites in 2012 were the districts of Vieux-Fort, Dennery and Micoud. Fish landings at Dennery and Micoud increased by 8.2 percent to 303 tonnes and 14.9 percent to 116 tonnes in 2012. Notably, the volume of fish landings in Micoud represents the highest quantity over the past five years. Although, Vieux Fort maintained the largest share of total fish landings, the tonnage of fish landed at Vieux Fort in 2012 dipped by 1.9 percent to 525, this represented the first year of decline over the preceding five years. Soufriere, which was one of the three major landing sites over the past two years, recorded a significant drop of 28.7 percent in the tonnage of fish landings.

The number of fishing trips in 2012 increased by 4.4 percent compared to the same period in 2011. There were significant increases in the number of fishing trips for all three major landing sites and Gros Islet. The remaining sites of Anse La Raye, Castries, Choiseul and Soufriere recorded declines of 2.7 percent, 10.6 percent, 7.0 percent and 18.0 percent respectively in the number of fishing trips for 2012.

The volume of fish imports grew by 8.4 percent (129 tonnes) to 1,666 tonnes in 2012, with a corresponding value of \$25.5 million. The rise in total fish imports is mainly attributed to the significant increase in the importation of frozen & chilled fish, which grew by 41.8 percent. Imports of Canned fish grew slightly by 1.1 percent while imports of other fish declined by 2.4 percent in 2012. Total fish imports recorded increases in all quarters excluding the first quarter which posted an 8.9 percent decline. The second, third and fourth quarter posted increases of 15.8 percent, 1.2 percent and 29.6 percent respectively in 2012.

Livestock Subsector

Poultry Imports

Total imports of poultry increased at a decelerated rate of 4.7 percent to 9,671 tonnes in 2012 compared to 2011. The associated value increased by 2.8 percent to \$39.7 million. The review period represented the highest levels of poultry imports over the preceding five years. Chicken imports which accounted for 90.2 percent of total poultry imports increased by 5.4 percent to 8,725 tonnes in 2012, with a corresponding value of 34.8 million. Alternatively, imports of Turkey and other poultry accounted for 9.3 percent and 0.5 percent respectively of total poultry imports. Turkey imports declined by 1.4 percent to 901 tonnes while other poultry imports increased by 4.7 percent in 2012.

Imports of whole chicken declined by 66.7 percent to 3.0 tonnes in 2011 which positively emulates Government's intervention in creating the enabling environment to increase local chicken production. Increased import was also posted for whole turkey, which grew by 7.9 percent to 82 tonnes. Total imports of poultry necks, backs and wings declined by 1.9 percent to 4,490 tonnes, while total imports of other parts increased by 10.9 percent to 5,072 tonnes, valued at 23.2 million.

Egg Production



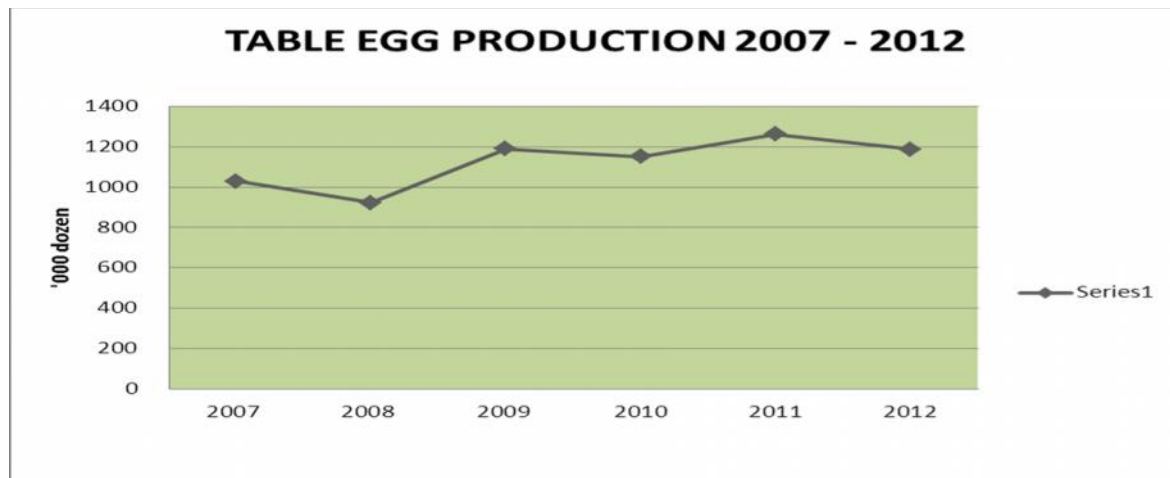
Egg production decreased by 5.9 percent to 1.2 million dozen, valued at \$7.1 million in 2012. Lower egg production may be attributable to the increased cost of feed and chicks during the review period. The overall decline was caused by reduced egg production in the second and third quarter which dwindled by 19.9 percent and 6.2 percent respectively. Egg production within the fourth quarter remained constant while a 2.1 percent increase was posted for the first quarter of 2012. The average laying flock on farms dipped slightly by 3.1 percent to 63,000 hens. The country has been self-sufficient in table eggs for the past five years, this policy has positively impacted on local egg production.

Local Poultry Production



Local chicken production grew by a further 5.1 percent to 1480.6 tonnes in 2012. The corresponding value of \$16.9 million reflects a 2.3 percent increase over the previous period. Local production of whole chicken increased by 3.2 percent to 834.1 tonnes, generating revenue of \$9.5 million in 2012. Increased production levels were recorded in the first three quarters of 2012. The last quarter, posted a decline of 10.3 percent, while the preceding quarters recorded increases of 14.0 percent, 4.3 percent and 7.2 percent respectively. In addition, local production of mixed parts rose slightly by 7.7 percent to 646.5 tonnes with corresponding revenue of \$7.3 million. The overall increase in chicken production is attributed to Government's continued effort in developing the livestock sub-sector, which positively impacts farmer behavior. Furthermore, during the latter part of 2012, Government guaranteed an increase in the local market share of chicken from 20 percent to 25 percent.

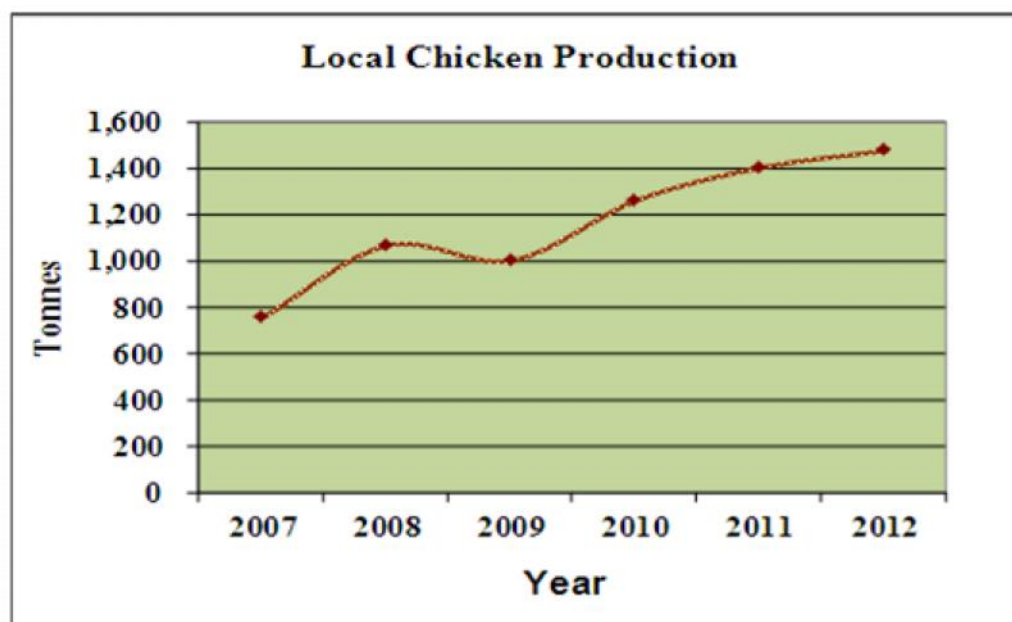

Local Pork Purchases



Local pork purchases grew by 8.7 percent to 192.2 tonnes in 2012, with a corresponding value of \$2.2 million, following a decline of 8.3 percent in 2011. The increase can be attributed to Government's plans in developing the livestock sub-sector, through the implementation of various initiatives aimed at repositioning the sector. Although, local pork purchases dipped slightly by 2.4 percent in the second quarter, the total level of pork purchases for the year was offset by the moderate increases in the remaining quarters of 2012.

Meat Imports

The review period recorded increases in most meat imports with the exception of mutton, which continued its downward trend for the fourth consecutive year. Mutton imports declined by 33.0 percent to 277 tonnes, valued at \$3.8 million, a significant reduction of 136 tonnes. On the other hand, imports of beef and chevron in 2012, posted the highest meat imports level over the preceding five years. Chevron imports increased by 105 percent to 41 tonnes, valued at \$335,000 in 2012 while beef imports grew by 17.4 percent to 708 tonnes valued at \$12.6 million. Despite the increased level of beef imports in 2012, the average unit cost for beef declined by 6.9

percent to \$17. Pork imports grew by 23.0 percent to 614 tonnes, valued at \$4.7 million, the average unit cost for pork also increased by 2.7 percent to \$7.70. All four quarters posted increases in pork and beef imports for 2012.

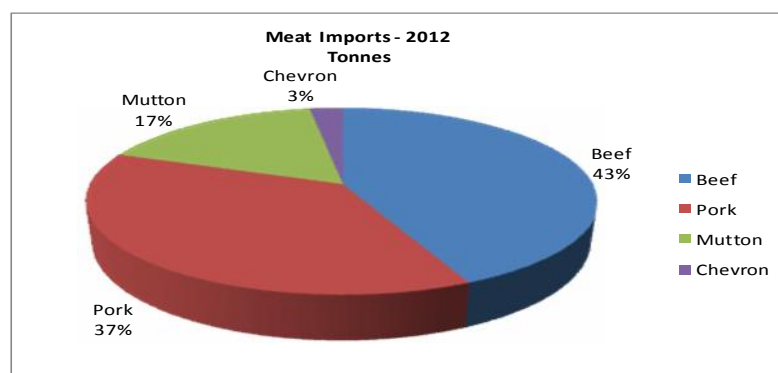

Imports of Selected Livestock Products

The review period reported increased imports of milk and decreased cheese and butter/butterfat imports. Imports of milk increased further by 11.6 percent to 4,319 tonnes with a corresponding value of \$22.7 million. For the first half of 2012, imports of milk rose by 22.0 percent, while,

imports during the second half increased slightly by 1.5 percent. Alternatively, imports of cheese and butter/butterfat were both on the decline. Cheese imports dipped by 5.6 percent to 1,004 tonnes, valued at \$13.3 million, while imports of butter/butterfat declined by 12.4 percent to 106 tonnes, with a corresponding value of \$1.4 million. Cheese imports as well as butter imports exhibited similar patterns throughout the year, both products recorded significant increases during the first quarter of 11.4 percent and 153.8 percent respectively. However, the remaining quarters posted declines.

Agricultural Financing

Agricultural financing for the review period increased by 59.3 percent to \$1.6 million. The total number of loans issued for Agricultural and Fishing activities rose from twenty seven (27) in 2011 to forty three (43) in 2012, signaling recovery within the industry following the unfavorable agricultural environment in 2010/11, namely, the drought, Hurricane Tomas and the widespread infestation of Black Sigatoka disease. Notable increases were recorded for all sub-sectors. Loans issued for livestock grew by 175.0 percent to \$704,000.00, while loans for farm development and fishing activities increased by 50.0 percent to \$753,000 and 133.0 percent to \$122,000 respectively. The large increase in loans issued to the livestock sub-sector is mainly attributed to an increase in the number of loans issued for poultry farming, which is partially linked to Government's intervention in increasing the safety net for chicken.

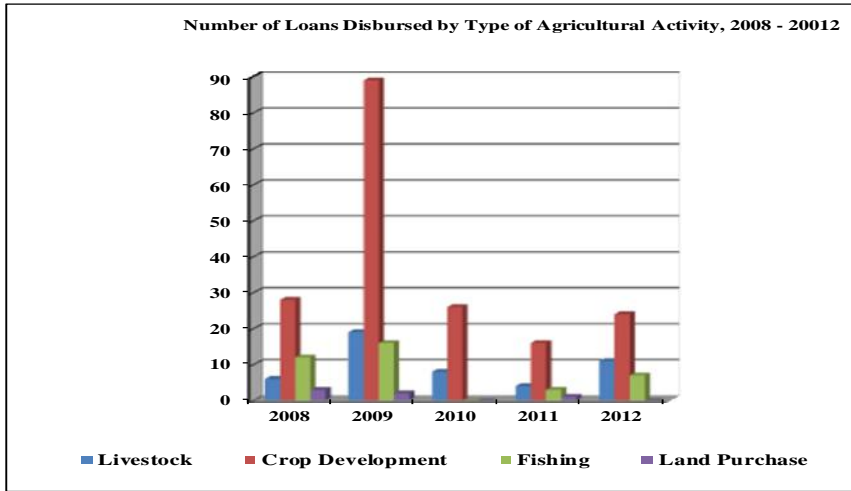
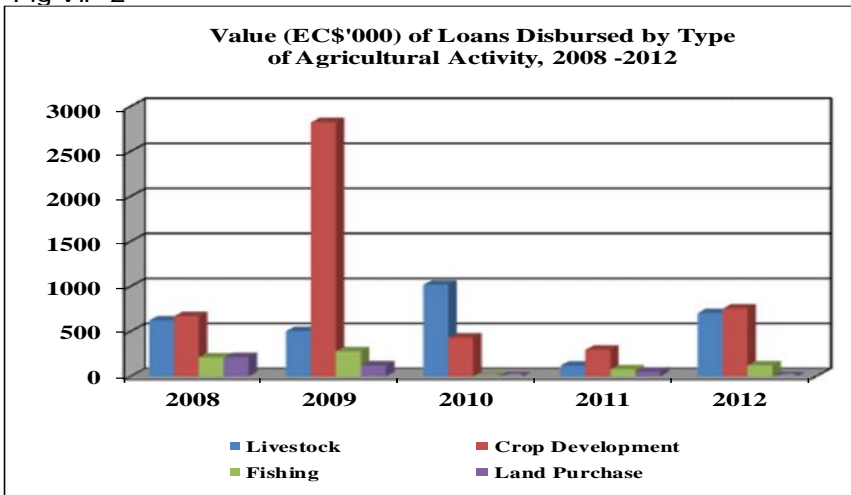

Food Trade Balance

There was a moderate increase of 1.4 percent in the food trade balance in 2012. The trade balance on food grew by an additional \$4.5 million to \$335.9 million when compared to 2011. Food exports which represents 14.2 percent of domestic exports, increased by 0.8 percent to \$24.3 million. The level of exports varied throughout the quarters of 2012, the first and third quarters posted reasonable increases of 56.5 percent and 8.7 percent respectively, compared to the second quarter which recorded a decline of 12.4 percent while the last quarter dipped by 13.6 percent.

Food imports continued to rise in 2012, albeit at a decelerated rate of 1.3 percent compared to 2011. Total food imports peaked at \$360.2 million in 2012, representing the highest level of imports. Increases were posted for all four quarters excluding the third quarter, which recorded a decrease in imports of 11.6 percent. The first, second and fourth quarter recorded declines of 1.2 percent, 5.2 percent and 10.2 percent respectively.

Composition of Food Imports

Total food imports increased by 1.3 percent to \$360.2 million in 2012. This was mainly attributed to increased import levels of 70 percent of food products. In particular, imports of live animals grew by 42.0 percent followed by fish and fish preparations import, which increased by 21.4 percent. Moderate declines were noted for Meat and Meat preparations, dairy products and eggs and vegetables and fruits. While, Meat and Meat preparations accounted for the largest share of food imports or 22.0 percent, its level declined by a mere 0.1 percent in 2012. A similar trend was followed by Dairy products & eggs and vegetables & fruits which decreased by 5.2 percent and 4.5 percent respectively.

Cereal and cereal preparations which represents the second largest(19.5 percent) share of food imports increased by 1.6 percent to \$70.2 million, indicating the highest level of cereal imports over the past five years.

Exports of Selected Agri-Produce

In 2012, the major exports of agricultural produce (excluding bananas) were once again, breadfruit and plantain, followed by mangoes and avocados. Breadfruit exports peaked at 422.11 tonnes earning revenue of \$1.3 million, while plantains generated revenue of \$400,710 with a corresponding 415.02 tonnes exported. Mango and avocado exports totaled 47.03 tonnes and 22.34 tonnes respectively during the review period.

As a result of low quantities of breadfruit on the market, breadfruit exports dipped by 6.21 percent or 27.95 tonnes in 2012. Despite the drop in breadfruit exports, revenue increased by 53.0 percent, indicating a 64.2 percentage increase in the unit cost of breadfruit. On the other hand, plantain exports decreased slightly by 0.03 percent or 0.12 tonnes, however, a 19.2 percent drop in unit cost for plantains was realized. Exports of mangoes increased by 68.0 percent or 19.05 tonnes while avocado exports declined by 19.2 percent or 5.32 tonnes.

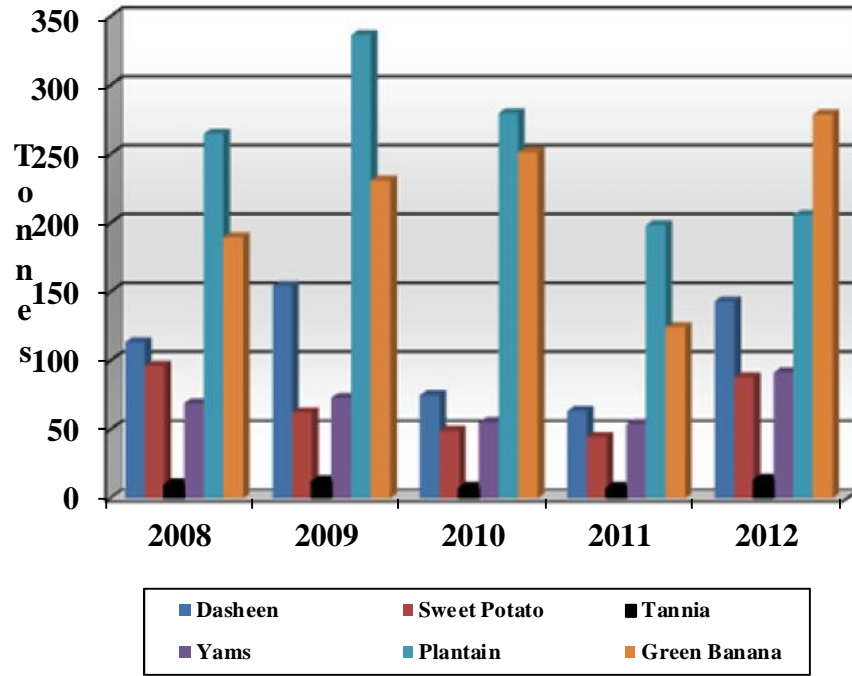

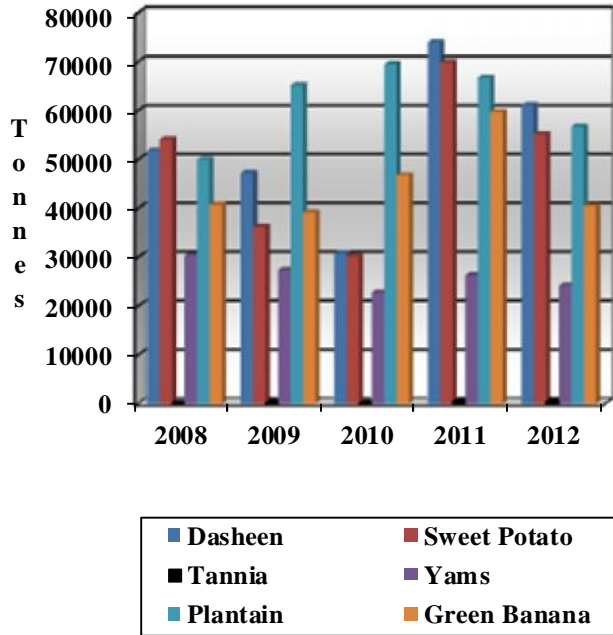

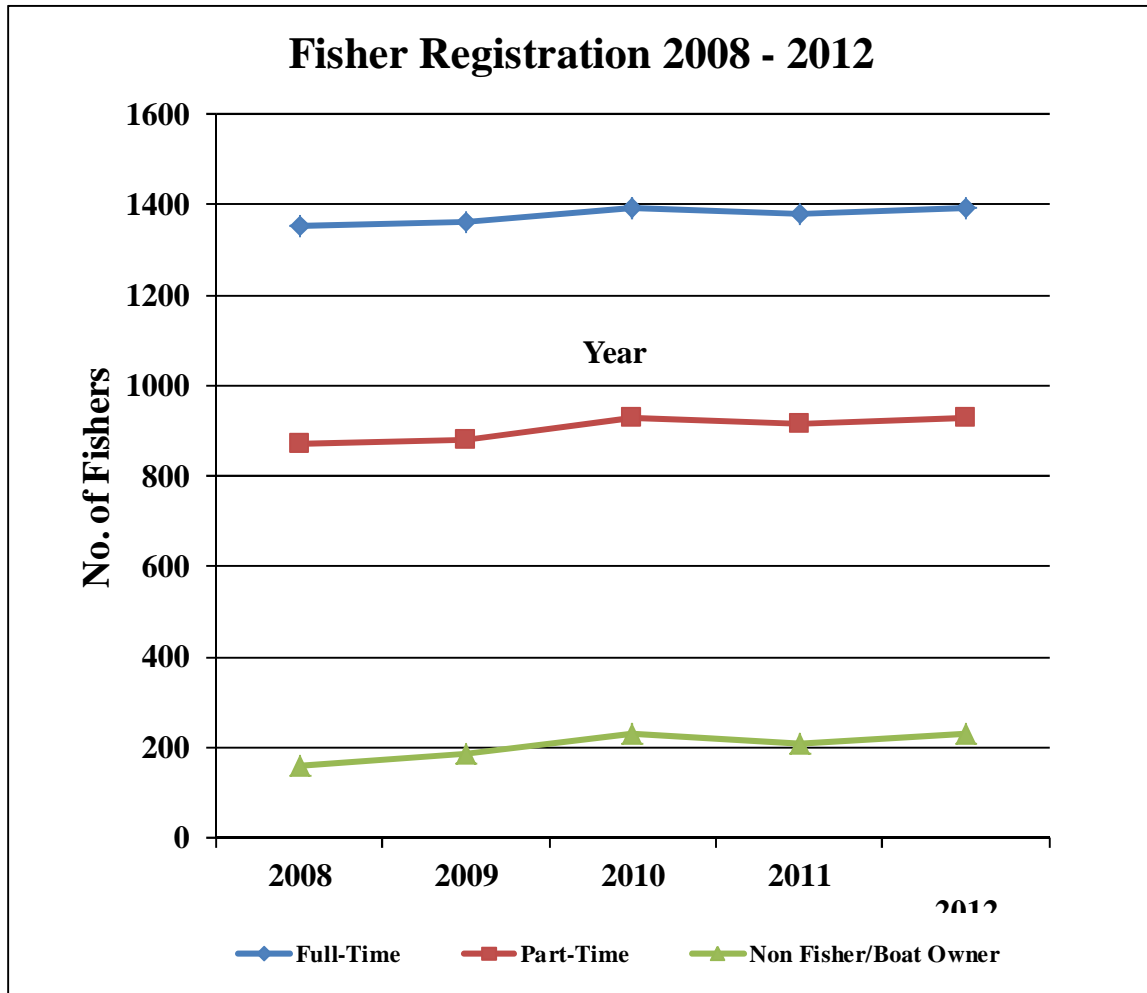
