

## **DOMESTIC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS**

Growth in global output remained unchanged in 2014 relative to 2013 and 2012. The global economy registered growth of 3.4 percent in 2014, the same rate as that of 2013 and 2012. This outcome reflected a deceleration in the pace of economic expansion in most of the larger emerging economies such as China, Japan and India. This however, was tempered by economic growth in many developed countries including the US, UK, Canada and the Euro Zone. Growth within CARICOM member states was constrained by high debt to GDP ratios and rising fiscal deficits which continued to be a common theme throughout the region. Economic activity within the Eastern Caribbean Currency Union (ECCU) expanded by 1.3 percent in 2014. This was as a result of increased visitor arrivals and a pick-up in construction activity. Inflationary pressures were minimal across the region consistent with declining fuel prices.

Economic activity in Saint Lucia contracted by 0.7 percent during 2014. This was driven by weak performances of most of the main sectors of the economy, Tourism being the exception. Construction activity is estimated to have declined by 14.1 percent in 2014, reflective of a fall in commercial bank credit for construction and land development and lower imports of construction materials. Real output in the agriculture sector fell by 11.5 percent in 2014 reflecting reductions in value-added in the banana, other crops and fisheries sub-sectors. On the other hand, value added in the tourism sector is estimated to have increased by 2.9 percent in 2014. The global economic recovery and increases in demand for international travel augured well for Saint Lucia's tourism industry in 2014.

Consistent with the reduction in overall economic activity, the rate of unemployment increased to 24.4 percent in 2014. The rate of inflation in the domestic economy increased to 3.5 percent in 2014 despite declining international oil prices. This was partly attributed to domestic policy measures implemented during the year such as the conclusion of the construction stimulus package in February 2014 which resulted in upward pressure on the prices of building materials.

## OVERVIEW OF THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR

Preliminary estimates indicate that the agriculture sector contracted by 11.5 percent in 2014, influenced by the decline in the banana sub-sector, with value-added estimated to have contracted by 37.9 percent. Value-added in the other crops and fisheries sub-sectors also declined by 7.7 and 0.6 percent respectively. Agriculture's contribution to GDP fell from 3.2 percent in 2013 to 2.8 percent in 2014 of which the banana industry contributed 0.5 percent to GDP.

## **Banana**

Banana exports to the United Kingdom contracted by 29.0 percent to 8,772 tonnes in 2014. The December 24<sup>th</sup>, 2013 trough coupled with drought conditions during the first half of 2014 contributed largely to the decline in banana exports. Notwithstanding the decline in UK banana exports, regional banana exports grew by 45 percent to 2,974 tonnes indicating burgeoning demand for bananas within the Caribbean, particularly Barbados and Trinidad.

## **Non-traditional Crops**

Purchases of non-traditional crops by the domestic and export market exhibited growth during the period under review. Domestic purchases of non-traditional crops, measured by sales to supermarkets and hotels grew by 2.5 percent to 4,658 tonnes in 2014, valued at EC\$18.4 million. The ongoing assistance provided to farmers through CFL's support programme contributed positively to the growth in supermarket purchases. Exports of non-traditional crops grew by 23.2 percent to 3,563 tonnes in 2014.

## **Fisheries**

The fisheries sub-sector recorded growth in fish landings of 3.4 percent in 2014. This followed a decline of 4.1 percent during the previous year. The continued deployment of Fish Aggregating Devices (FAD's) resulted in a higher level of capture of pelagic species, primarily dolphin and kingfish.

## **Livestock**

Output in the livestock sub-sector expanded in 2014. This growth was partly attributed to stable feed prices during the period under review. Local chicken production increased by 13.9 percent to 1925.2 tonnes while local pork purchases grew by 16.6 percent to 178.9 tonnes. St. Lucia regained self-sufficiency in egg production as there were no imports of eggs or any notable periods of shortages. Egg production increased appreciably by 14.6 percent to 1.3 million dozens amounting to an 11.5 percent increase in value to EC\$7.9 million.

## BANANA INDUSTRY



Banana exports to the United Kingdom declined by 29.0 percent to 8,772 tonnes in 2014. Drought conditions in the first half of 2014 coupled with the adverse effects of the December 24<sup>th</sup>, 2013 trough were major contributors to the reduction in the exports of bananas to the UK. All four quarters of 2014 registered declines in banana exports. During the first half of 2014, 5,129 tonnes of bananas were exported to the UK, a 20.1 percent decline compared to the corresponding period in 2013. The fall in exports was more pronounced in the third and fourth quarters, declining by 40.0 and 37.5 percent respectively. Accordingly, revenue earnings from bananas fell by 26.4 percent to EC\$16.2 million in 2014.

Despite the decline in UK exports, exports of bananas to the region rose by 45.0 percent to 2,974 tonnes in 2014. Banana exports to Barbados grew by 47.2 percent to 2,530 tonnes, while banana exports to Trinidad rose by 37.1 percent to 443.7 tonnes. Barbados accounted for 85 percent of total banana exports to the region, while Trinidad accounted for the remaining 15 percent of regional banana exports.

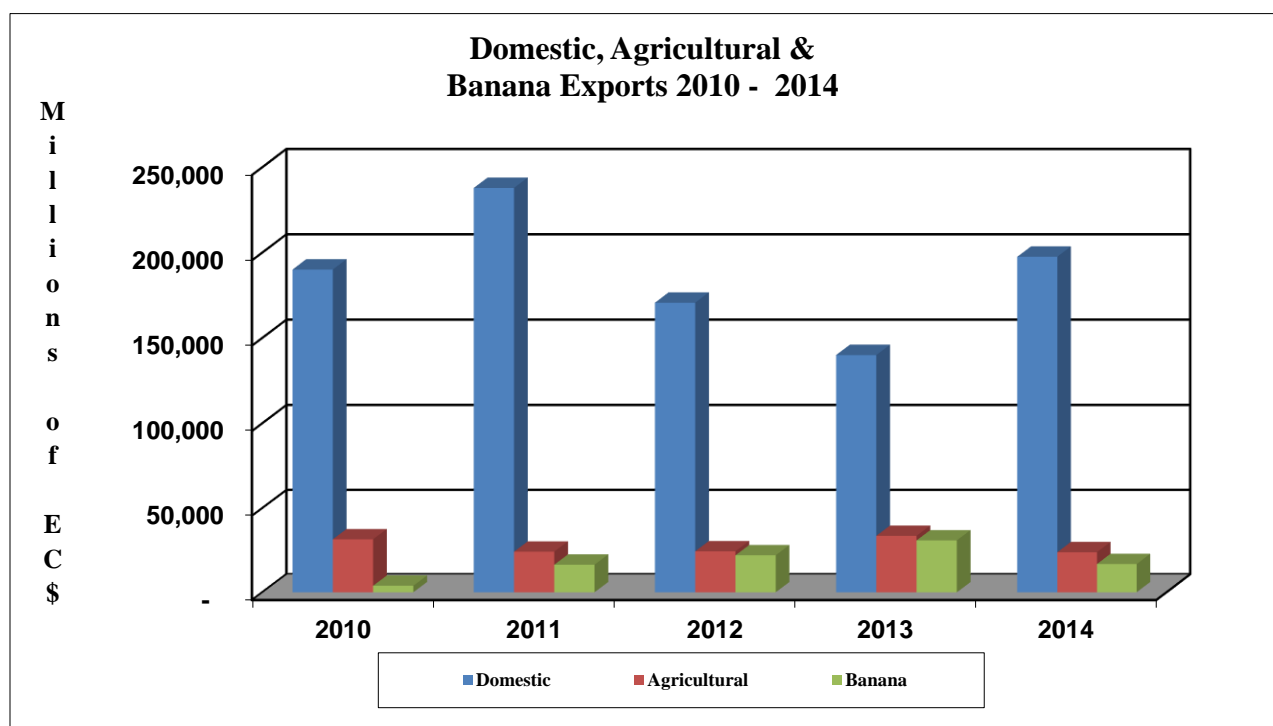

Total domestic exports rose by 41.2 percent to EC\$198 million in 2014. Total agricultural exports which accounted for 12 percent of total domestic exports declined by 29 percent to EC\$23.7 million. This decline was primarily attributed to a fall in total banana exports during the period under review. The total value of banana exports which accounted for 70.4 percent of total agricultural exports declined by 45.6 percent to EC\$16.7 million in 2014.

The Saint Lucia National Fair Trade Association handled the majority of bananas exported to the UK in 2014. The company exported 8,426 tonnes of bananas to the UK while Total Quality Fruit Company exported the remaining 347 tonnes of bananas to the UK.

There was a general decrease in the prices of most types of banana inputs in 2014 compared to 2013. The prices of all types of fertilizers namely N.P.K, Sulphate of Ammonia and Urea declined in 2014 compared to 2013. The wholesale prices of most types of weedicides declined in 2014, namely Gramoxone and Touch Down. The prices of fungicides remained constant in 2014 while the prices of nematicides rose slightly.

## COCOA INDUSTRY



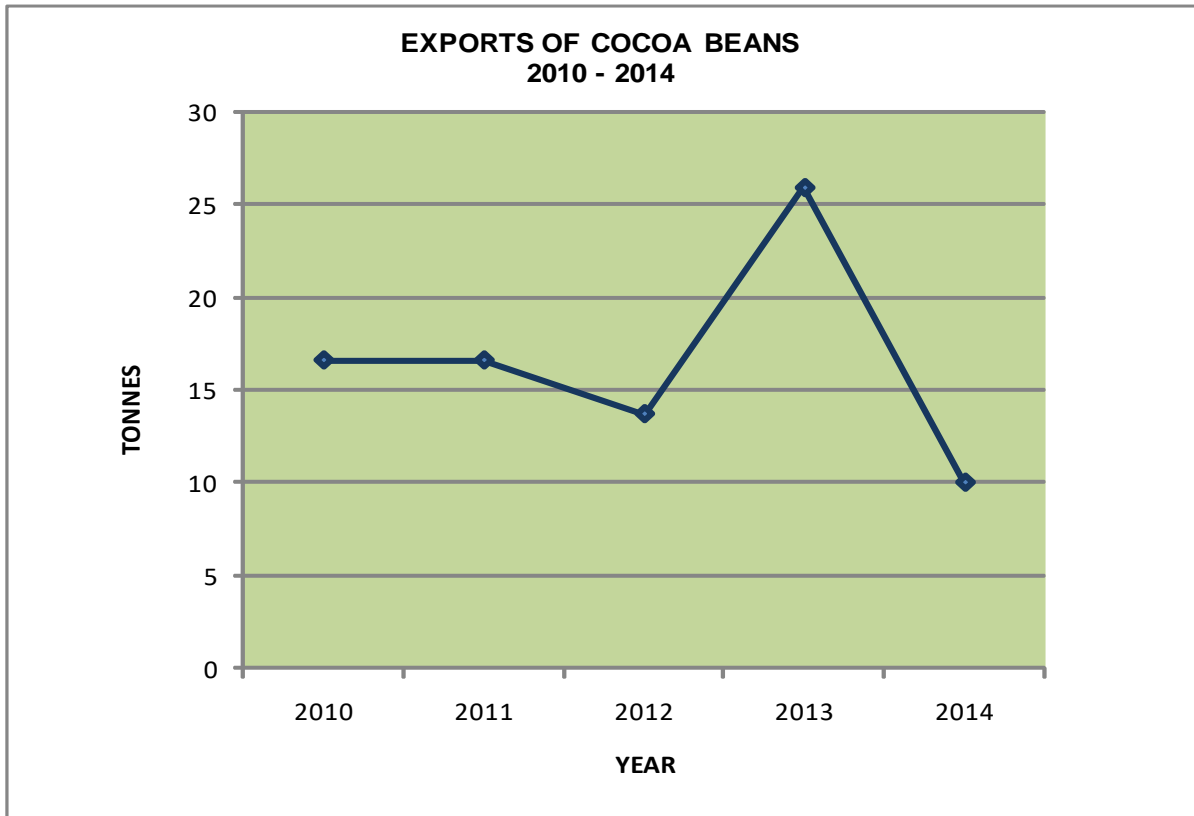
The production of cocoa beans declined by 67.1 percent to 19 tonnes in 2014. This was attributed to drought conditions during the first half of 2014, which resulted in reduced yields. Cocoa beans were only produced and exported during the third quarter of 2014. Following an 89.1 percent increase in cocoa exports during 2013, cocoa exports declined by 61.4 percent to 10 tonnes. Similarly, revenue from exports of cocoa beans contracted by 82.4 percent to 58 thousand in 2014.

## NON- TRADITIONAL CROPS



Preliminary data indicate that production of non-traditional crops, as measured by purchases from domestic consumption and exports rose during the period under review. Total domestic sales to supermarkets and the hotel sub-sectors rose by 2.5 percent to 4,658.2 tonnes in 2014. Revenue from these sales grew by 8.3 percent to EC\$18.4 million. Supermarket purchases which accounted for 73.6 percent of total domestic purchases of non-traditional crops grew by 1.5 percent to 3,428.2 tonnes in 2014. Drought conditions experienced in the first half of the year resulted in supply shortages and increases in prices. Revenue generated from supermarket purchases rose by 8.9 percent to \$11.6 million in 2014. While the volume of vegetables and musa species purchased increased during the period under review, there was a decline in the quantity of fruit and tree crops, root crops and herbs and spices purchased by supermarkets.

Consistent with the growth in stay-over arrivals, hotel purchases of crops increased by 5.4 percent to 1,230 tonnes while revenue grew by 7.3 percent to \$6.8 million. Increases were recorded for fruit and tree crops, musa species and herbs and spices while that of the vegetables and root crops categories declined.

Exports of non-traditional crops grew by 23.1 percent to 3,562.6 tonnes during the period under review. Total revenue derived from export earnings rose by 15.3 percent to \$3.4 million. With the exception of bananas, plantain and breadfruit represented the largest quantity of non-traditional crops exported in 2014. Exports of breadfruit declined by 32.9 percent to 248.6 tonnes while exports of plantain grew by 61.4 percent to 530.03 tonnes in 2014.

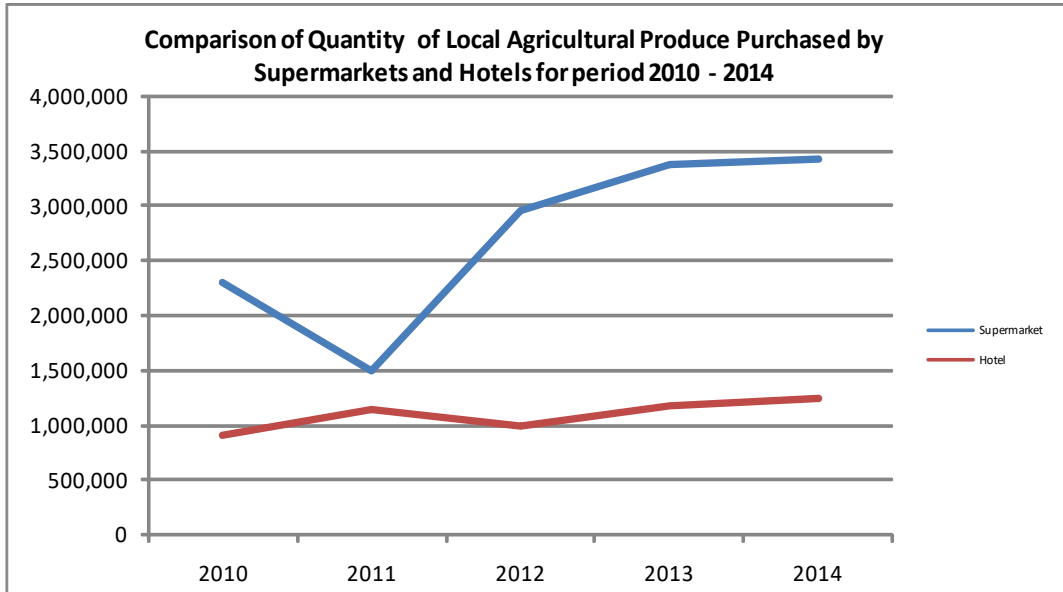

## FISHERIES SECTOR



The fisheries sector recorded growth in fish landings in 2014 following a decline of 4.1 percent in the previous year. Preliminary data indicate that there was a 3.4 percent increase in total fish landings to 1,695 tonnes. As a result, the estimated value of fish landed increased

by 1.2 percent to \$26.2 million. The increase in the number of fishing trips impacted positively on landings. The estimated number of fishing trips rose from 30,811 in 2013 to 32,224 in 2014. Landings of dolphin and kingfish grew by 5.2 percent and 5.4 percent respectively in 2014. Dolphin, the largest category of fish species landed rose from 387 tonnes in 2013 to 407 tonnes in 2014. Tuna, the second largest category of species landed in 2014 declined by 21.7 percent to 385 tonnes. Flying fish, which displays a large degree of natural variability declined by 20.6 percent to 85 tonnes during the period under review. Other types of fish landed increased by 32.3 percent to 659 tonnes

The major landing sites, Vieux-Fort and Dennery continued to account for the largest shares of fish landings with 32.0 percent and 19.1 percent of fish landings respectively. Decreases in fish landings were recorded at Gros-Islet, Choiseul, Laborie, Micoud and other sites while Castries, Soufriere, Vieux-fort and Dennery posted increases in fish landings.

Fish imports increased by 31.2 percent to 1500 tonnes in 2014 with a corresponding value of \$20.6 million. All four quarters of 2014 registered increases in the importation of fish with growth in the second quarter being more pronounced at 65.0 percent. All categories of imported fish registered growth in 2014. Canned fish which represented the largest category of fish imported in 2014 rose by 27.7 percent to 757 tonnes. Frozen and chilled fish which accounted for the second largest category of imported fish grew by 22.3 percent to 378 tonnes. Imports of other fish increased by 52.1 percent to 365 tonnes during the period under review.

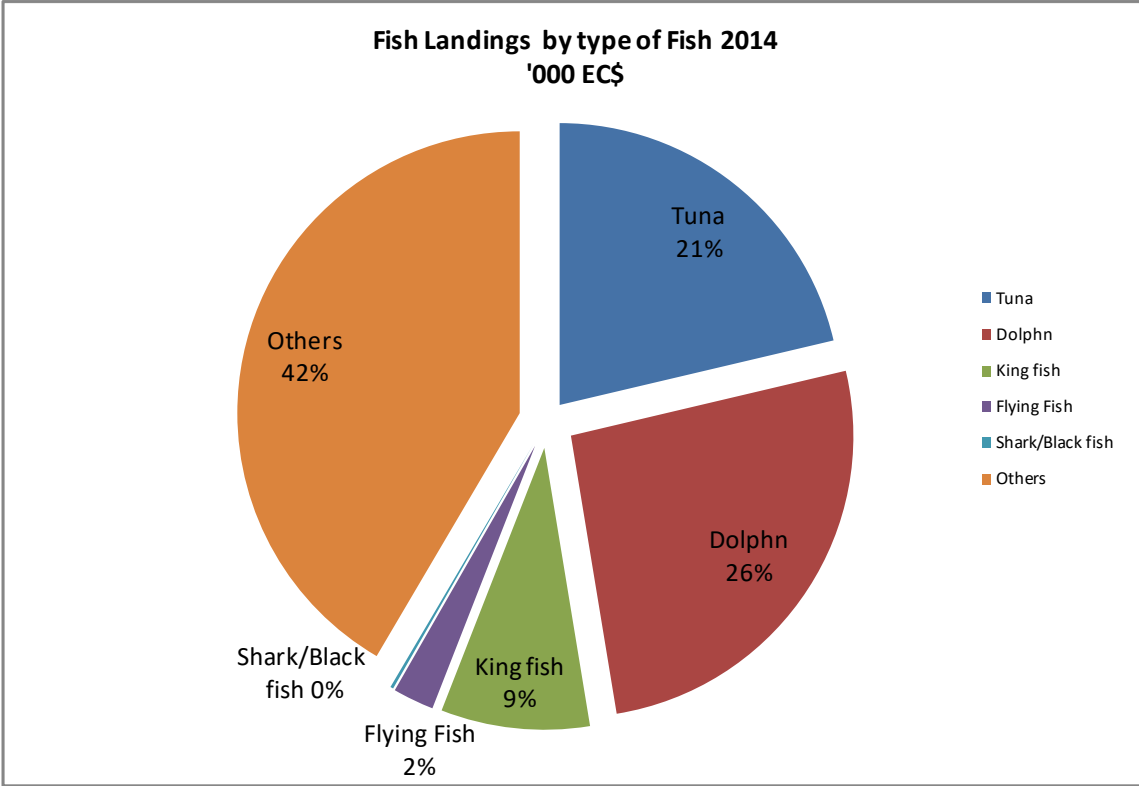

## **LIVESTOCK SUBSECTOR**

### **Poultry Imports**

Total poultry imports rose by 43.9 percent to 13,712 tonnes in 2014 with a corresponding value of EC\$58.2 million. This was primarily driven by an increase in the importation of chicken which grew by 50.3 percent to 12,850 tonnes, valued at EC\$53.5 million during the period under review. Imports of chicken necks, backs and wings more than doubled in 2014, increasing from 4,003 tonnes in 2013 to 8,472 tonnes in 2014. Imports of whole chicken declined from 6 tonnes in 2013 to 2 tonnes in 2014 while chicken other parts declined by 3.7 percent to 4,376 tonnes during the review period. Imports of turkey which represented 6.2 percent of total poultry imports in 2014 declined by 8.6 percent to 856 tonnes. Meats from other types of birds decreased from 44 tonnes in 2013 to 7 tonnes in 2014.

## Egg Production

Local egg production increased by 14.6 percent to 1.3 million dozen eggs in 2014. Total revenue generated from the production of table eggs grew by 11.5 percent to EC\$ 7.9 million. Saint Lucia regained self-sufficiency in the production of eggs in 2014 following a local shortage of eggs in 2013 which resulted in the importation of 24 thousand dozen eggs during the last quarter of 2013.

The average laying flock on farms increased by 20.7 percent to 70,000 hens in 2014. The late receipt of replacement flocks from traditional sources in the US and Barbados led to a great number of layers reaching maturity during the second half of the year which resulted in the upturn in production in 2014.

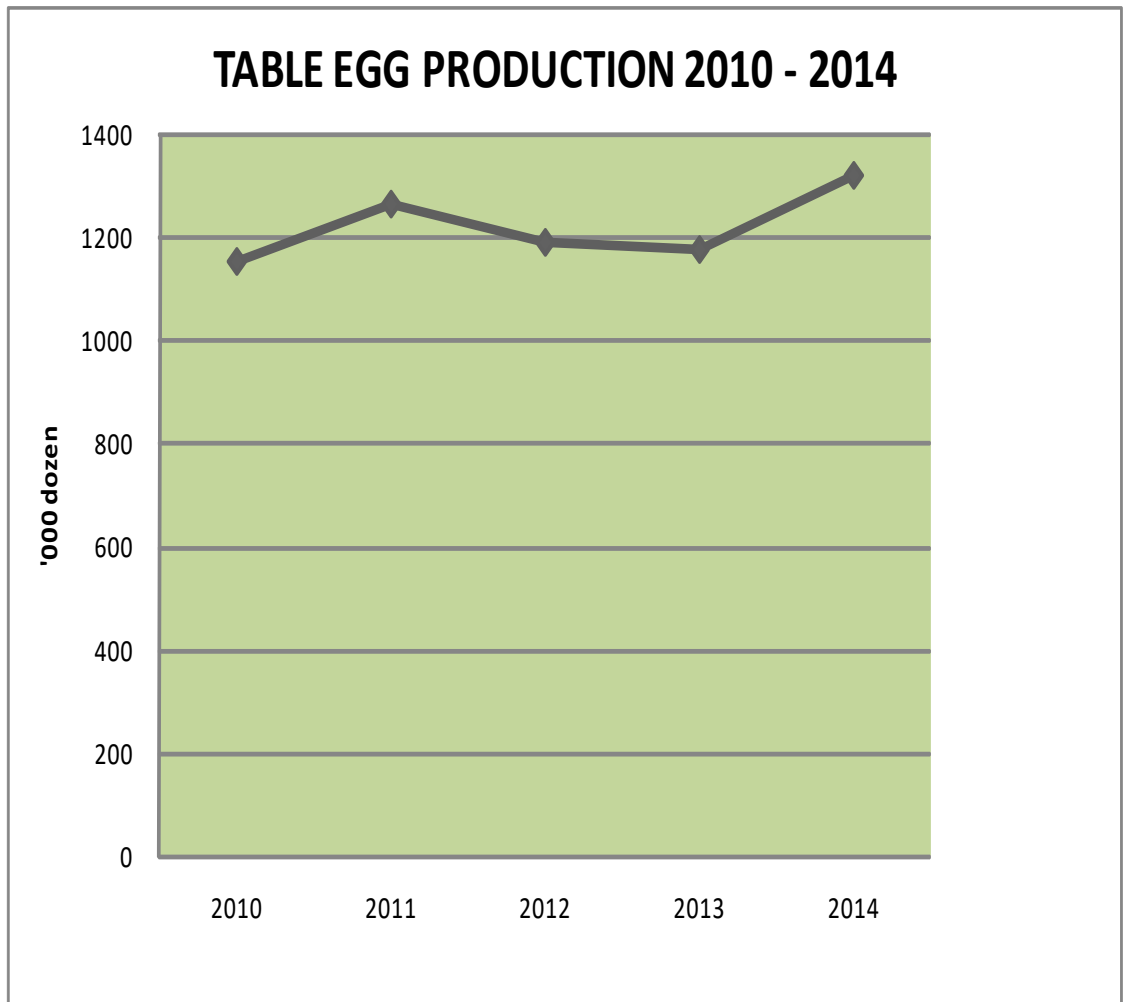

## Local Poultry Production

Local chicken production increased by 13.9 percent to 1,925.2 tonnes in 2014, following growth of 14.2 percent during the previous year. Total revenue derived from local chicken rose by 18.1 percent to EC\$22.5 million. Stable prices for both local and imported feed coupled with the entrance of new poultry farmers and expansions by existing poultry farmers were contributory factors to the growth in chicken production in 2014. Production of whole chicken declined by 3.3 percent to 732.2 tonnes, valued at EC\$8.6 million. Production of whole chicken declined by 19.2 and 19.0 percent during the first and fourth quarters of 2014 respectively, while the second and third quarters registered growth of 6.5 and 33.8 percent respectively. Local production of mixed parts grew by 27.9 percent to 1,193 tonnes during the period under review. All four quarters of 2014 registered growth in the production of mixed parts. Accordingly, revenue derived from the production of mixed parts grew by 35 percent to EC\$13.9 million in 2014.

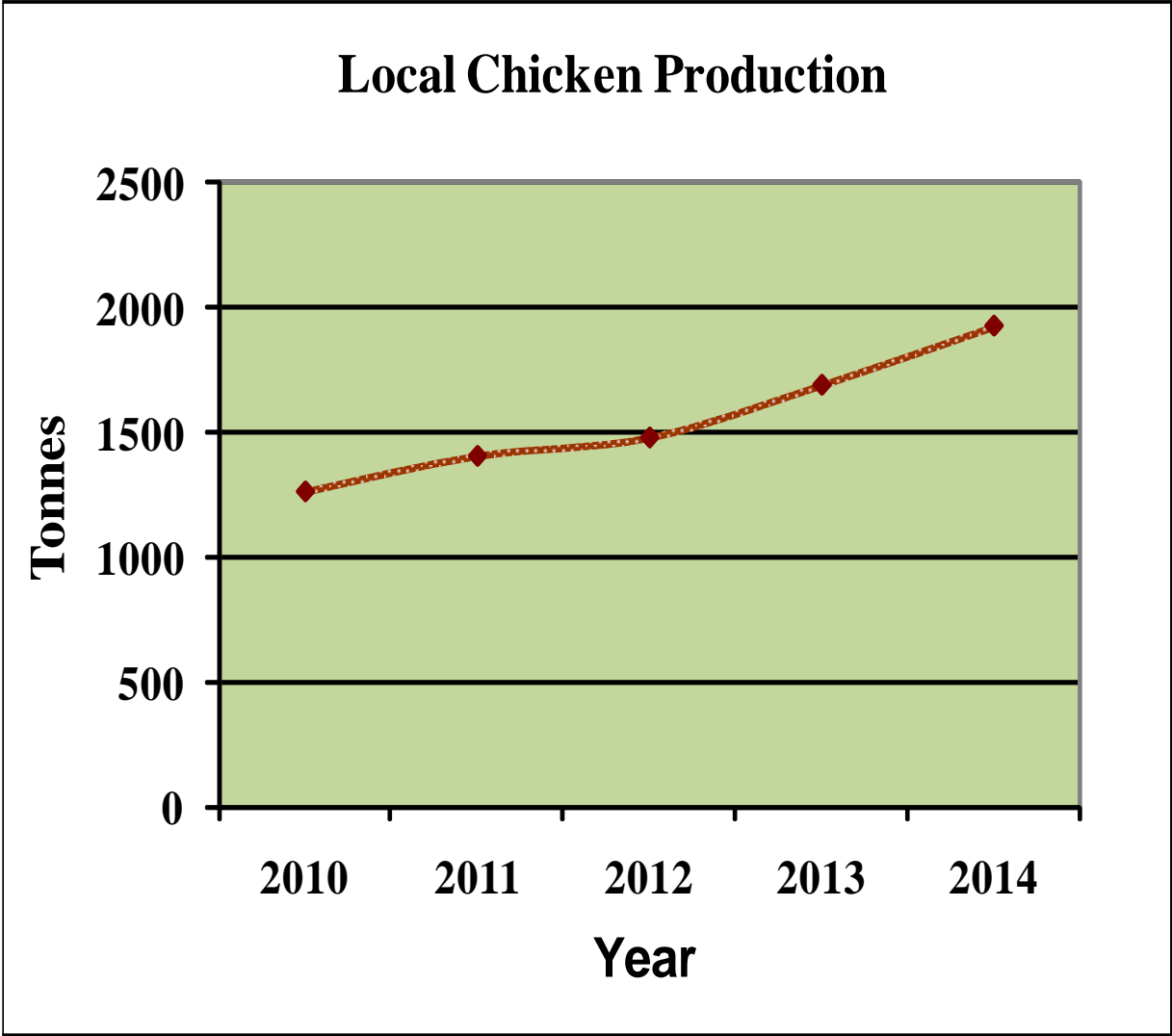

## Local Pork Purchases



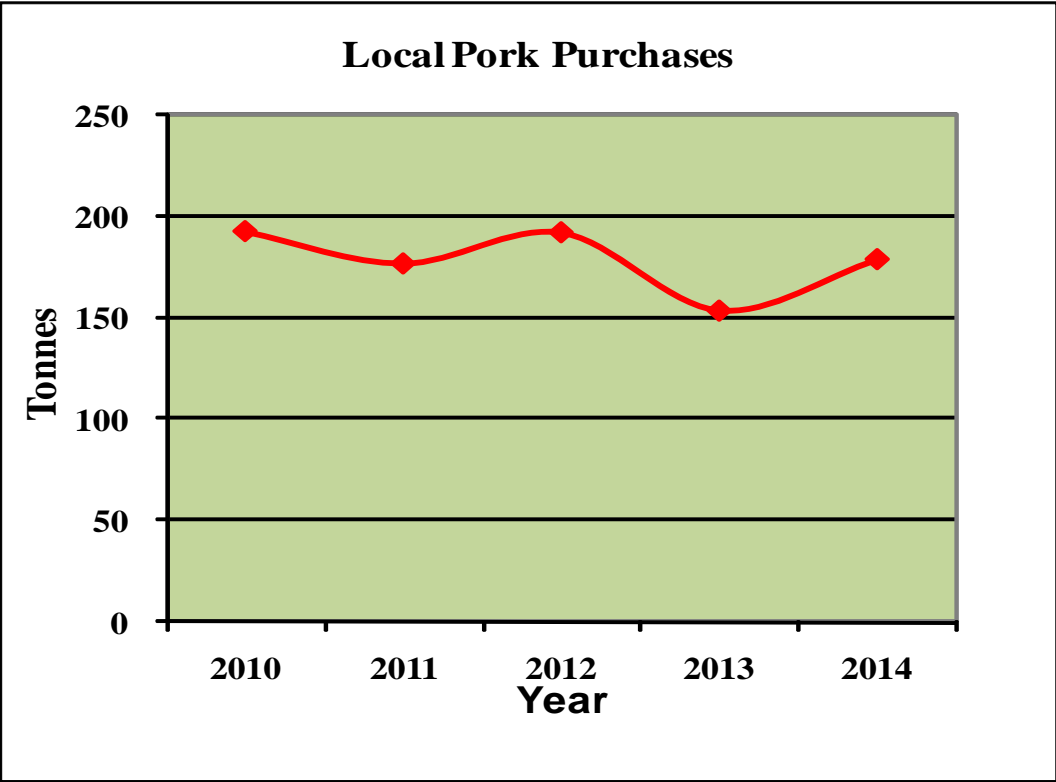
Local pork purchases increased by 16.6 percent to 178.9 tonnes in 2014 after declining by 20.1 percent during the previous year. Growth in pork production was partly driven by the stabilization of prices of both local and imported feed in 2014. Revenue generated from local pork production grew by 17.2 percent to EC\$2.4 million during the period under review. Pork production grew during the first three quarters of 2014, while the last quarter registered a decline of 1.4 percent in local pork purchases.

## Meat Imports

Following a decline of 9.0 percent in 2013, imports of beef declined by 22.5 percent to 499 tonnes in 2014. The value of imported beef rose by 4.4 to EC\$12.7 million in 2014, indicating an increase in the price of imported beef. The first, third and fourth quarters of 2014 recorded declines of 49.5, 23.5 and 28.5 percent in beef imports while the second quarter recorded growth of 27.1 percent in beef imports. Imports of pork, which accounted for 46 percent of the total tonnage of imported meats declined by 5.6 percent to 738 tonnes in 2014, valued at EC\$5.7 million. The first two quarters of 2014 registered growth in pork imports, while the last two quarters of 2014 registered declines in the importation of pork. Imports of mutton grew by 16.7 percent to 349 tonnes in 2014 while imports of chevron remained constant at 37 tonnes compared to the corresponding period in 2013.

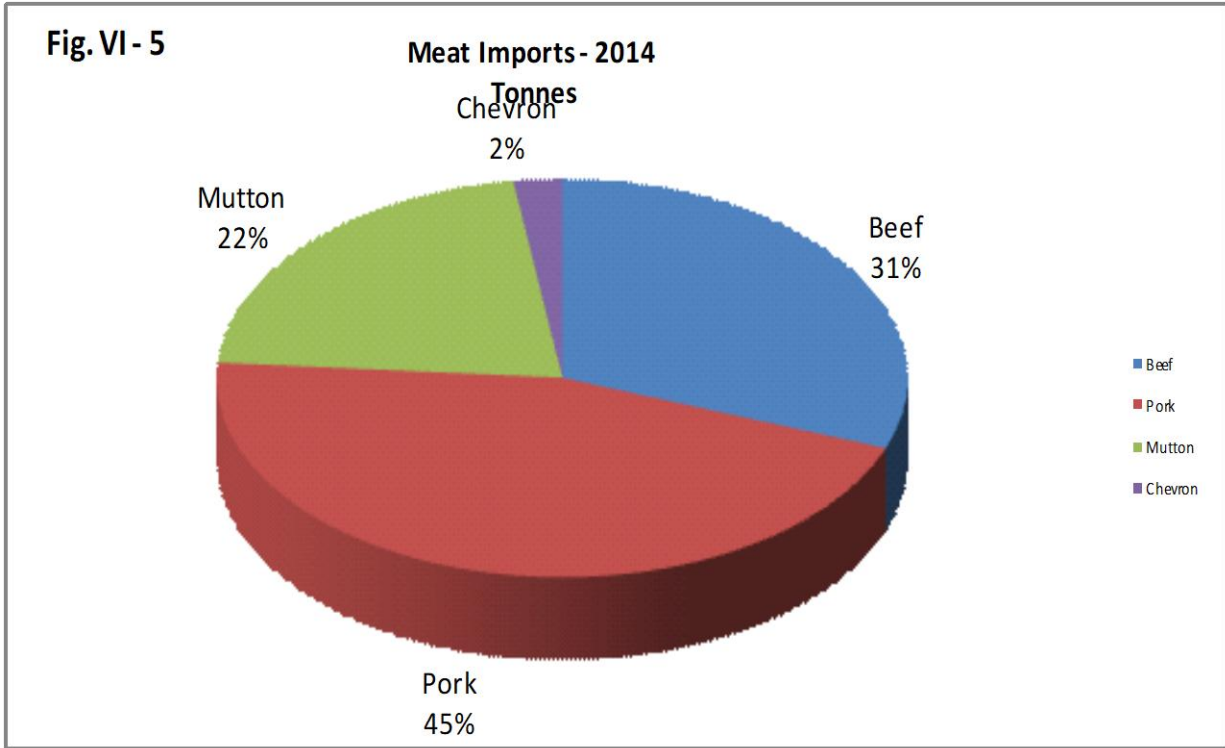
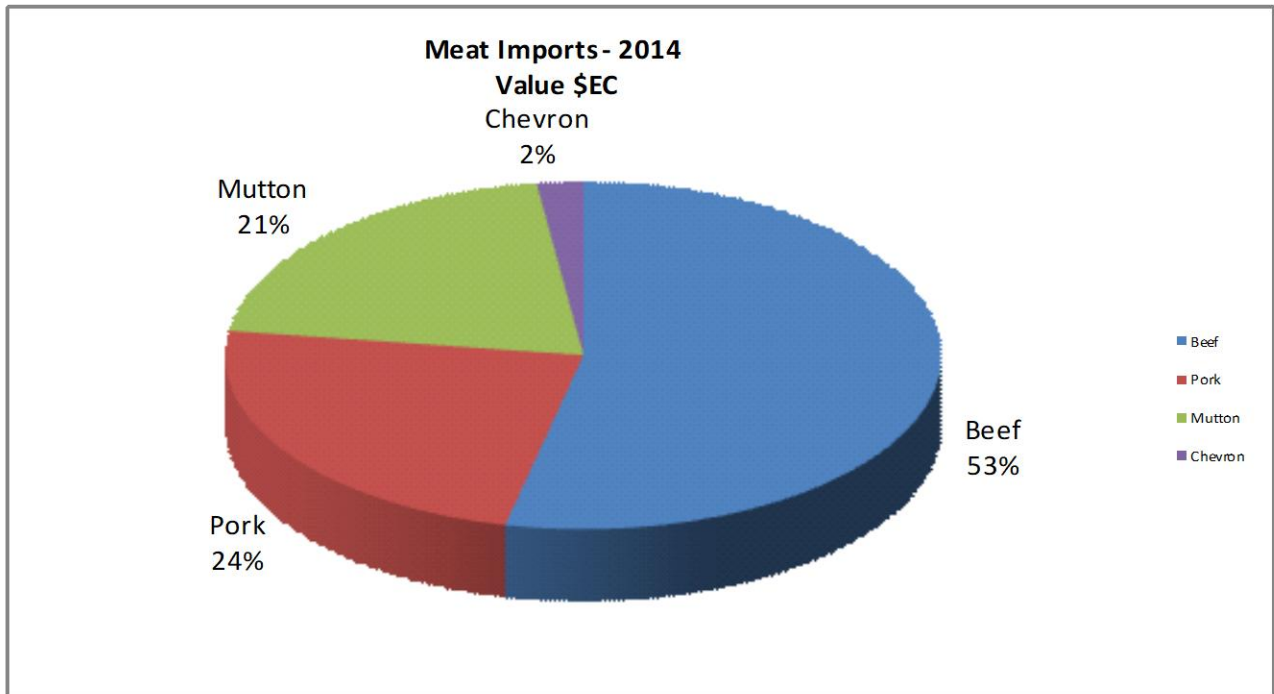

## Imports of Selected Livestock Products

Following a decline in total imports of selected livestock products in 2013, imports of milk, cheese and butter declined in 2014. Imports of milk declined by 3.1 percent to 3,976 tonnes in 2014. Accordingly, the value of imported milk declined by 5.0 percent to EC\$22.8 million. While the first two quarters of 2014 saw declines of 14.4 and 7.4 percent respectively in the volume of milk imports, the third and fourth quarter saw increases of 2.4 and 7.4 percent respectively in milk imports.

Imports of cheese declined by 10.4 percent to 969 tonnes in 2014 while the value of imported cheese increased by 2.3 percent to EC\$16.0 million. With the exception of the third quarter which registered growth of 23.8 percent in the volume of cheese imports, the remaining quarters of 2014 saw declines in cheese imports compared to the corresponding period in 2013.

Imports of butter declined by 23.2 percent to 139 tonnes in 2014 valued at EC\$2.0 million. Imports of butter declined by 40.4 percent and 50.8 percent during the first and third quarters of 2014 respectively, while the second and fourth quarters of 2014 registered growth of 11.8 percent and 7.5 percent respectively compared to the corresponding period of 2013.

## **AGRICULTURAL FINANCING**

In 2014, a total of 25 loans valued at EC\$780,000 were approved for agricultural and fishing activities. This represents a 30.6 percent decline in the total number of loans approved for agricultural and fishing activities over the previous year. Farmers and fishers continued to face challenges in accessing credit from the commercial and development banks as evidenced by the declining number and value of loans approved for agricultural and fishing activities.

While the total number of loans approved for livestock activities increased from 4 in 2013 to 7 in 2014, the value of loans for livestock activities declined from EC\$482,000 in 2013 to EC\$263,000 in 2014. The number of loans approved for poultry production remained constant in 2014 at 3 loans when compared with the corresponding period in 2013. There was a notable decline in the value of loans approved for poultry production in 2014. Loans for poultry activities declined from EC\$433,000 in 2013 to EC\$130,000 in 2014. The total number of loans approved for fishing activities fell from 9 in 2013 to 3 loans valued at EC\$120,000 in 2014. A total of 8 loans valued at EC\$132,000 were approved for crop development purposes in 2014. This figure represented the lowest number of loans approved for crop development since 2010.

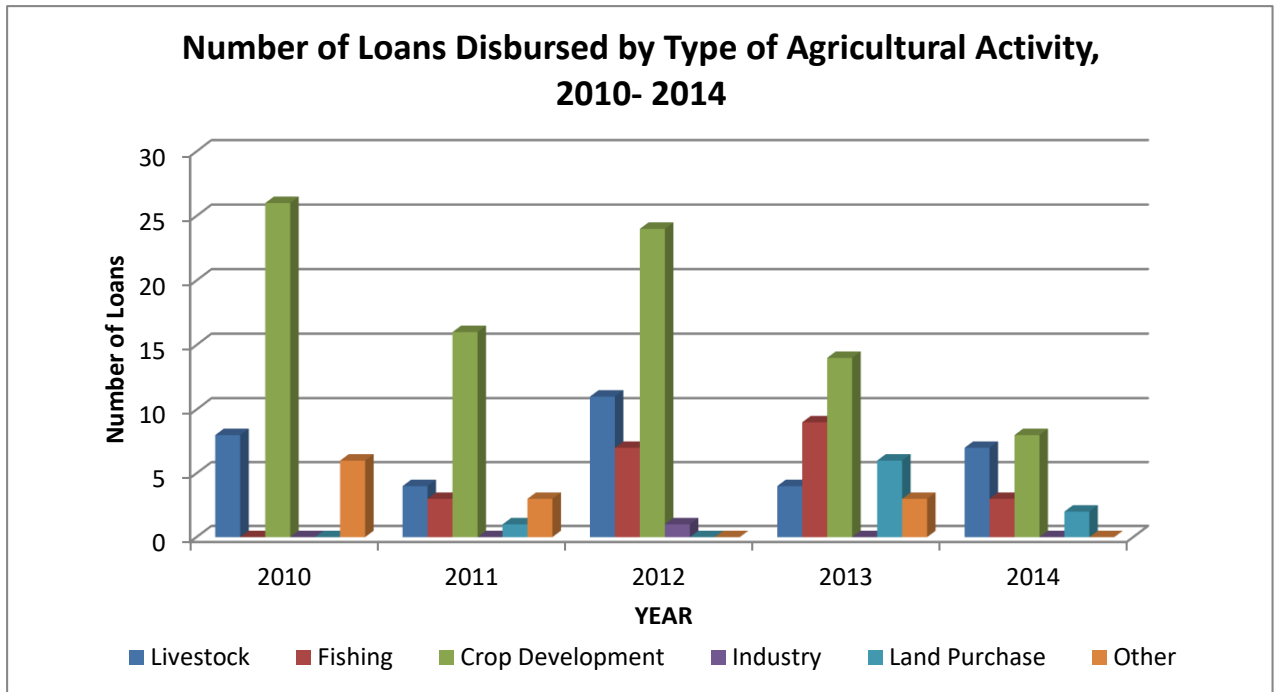
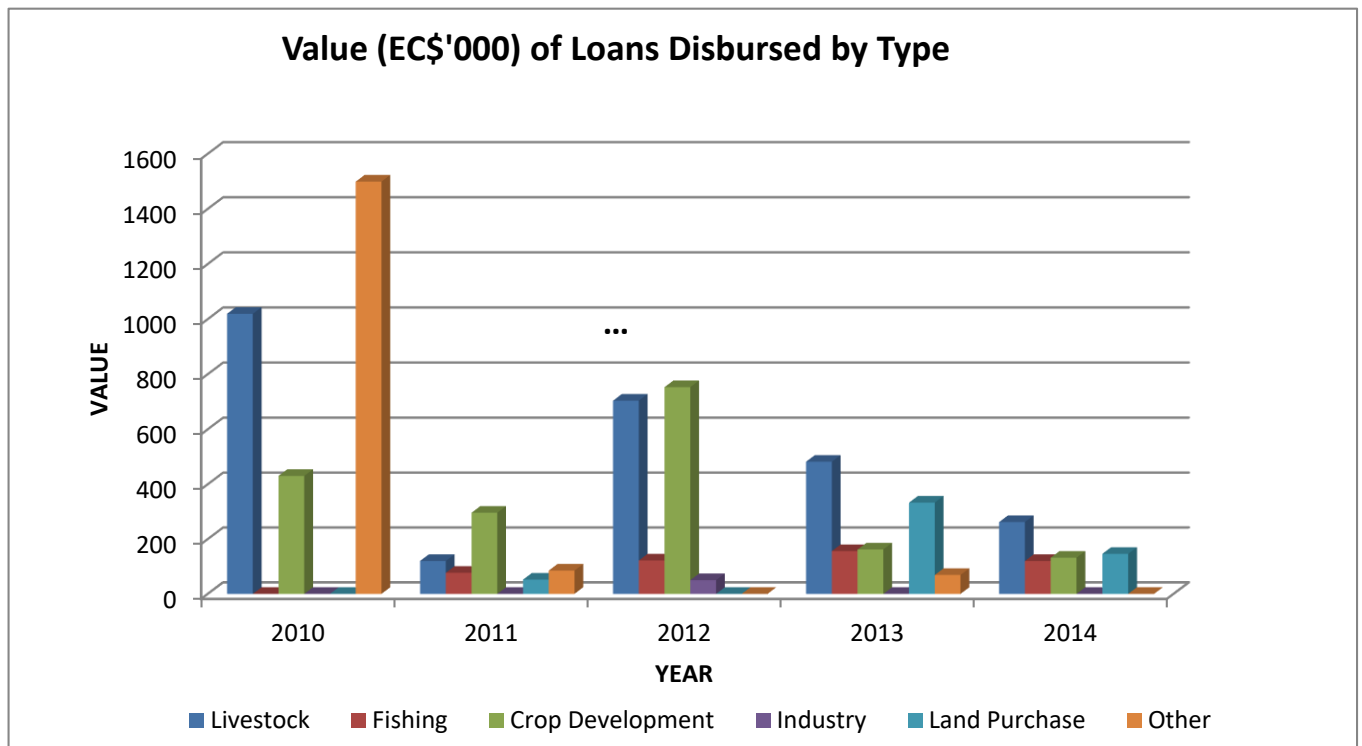

## **FOOD TRADE BALANCE**

There was a widening of the deficit on the trade balance on food in 2014 by 4.4 percent to 339.6 million. The deficit on the food trade balance grew from 325.2 million in 2013 to 339.6 million in 2014. This was attributed to an increase in food imports coupled with a decline in food exports in 2014. Food imports as a percentage of total imports rose from 16 percent in 2013 to 21 percent in 2014, while food exports as a percentage of domestic exports fell from 24 percent in 2013 to 12 percent in 2014.

Domestic exports rose by 41.2 percent to EC\$ 197.5 million in 2014. Domestic exports rose during the first three quarters of 2014 and fell during the last quarter of 2014. Growth in domestic exports was more pronounced during the second and third quarters of 2014 during which domestic exports rose by 50.7 percent and 81.5 percent respectively.

Total imports declined by 22.8 to EC\$1.7 billion in 2014. The first, third and fourth quarters of 2014 registered growth of 27 percent, 8.0 percent and 6.3 percent respectively. Total imports fell from EC \$1.1 billion during the second quarter of 2013 to EC\$427.5 million during the corresponding period in 2014. This represents a 60.8 percent decline in total imports and was a major contributor in the narrowing of the deficit on the overall trade balance in 2014.



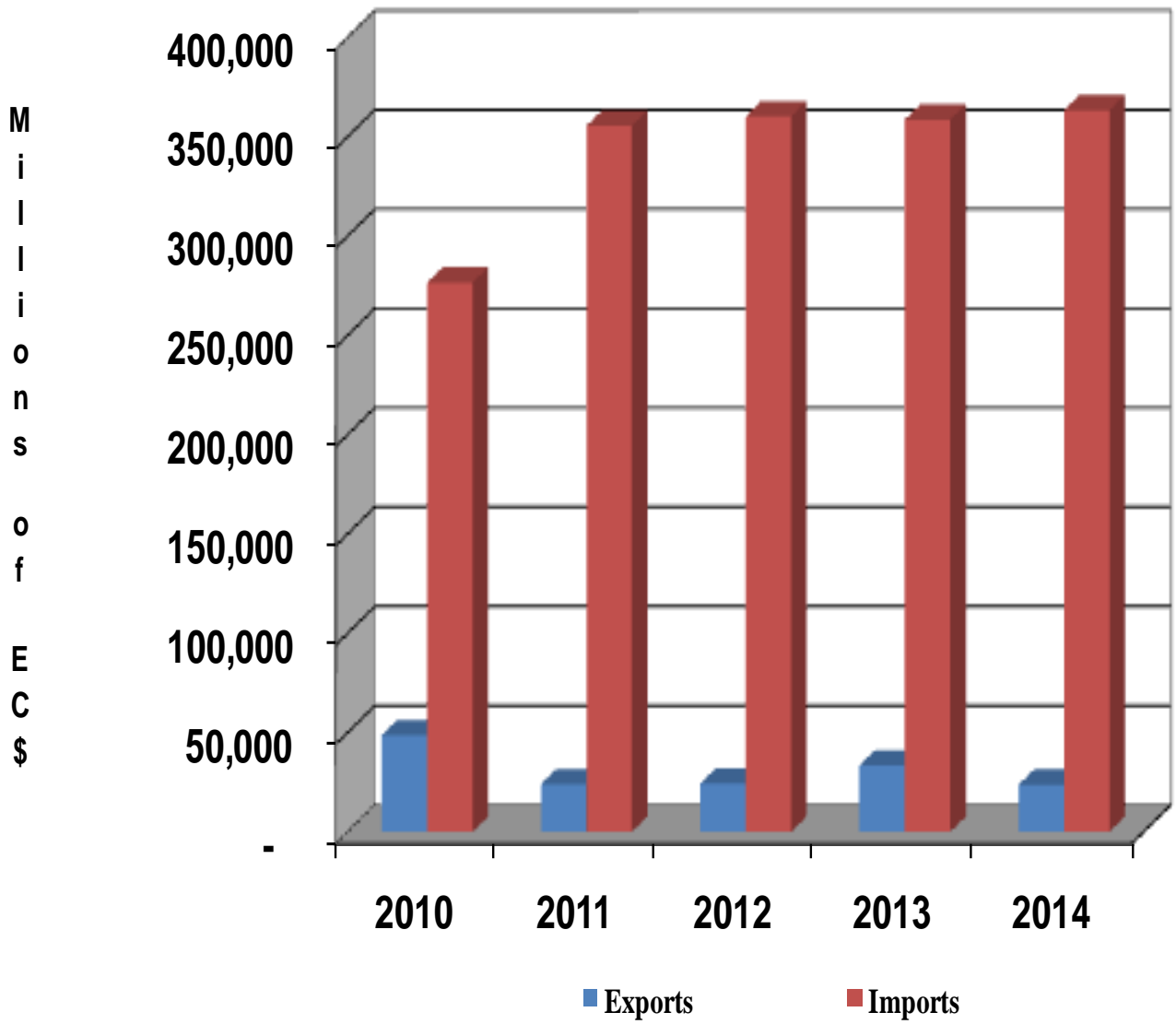

## **Composition of Food Imports**

The composition of food imports remained fairly constant in 2014 when compared with the corresponding period in 2013. Total food imports grew by 1.3 percent to EC\$363.3 million in 2014. Meat and meat preparations, cereal and cereal preparations, vegetables and fruits and dairy products were the four major categories of food items imported in 2014. Meat and meat preparations which accounted for 22 percent of total food imports in 2014 rose from EC\$79.0 million in 2013 to EC\$80.2 million in 2014. Cereal and cereal preparations which accounted for the second largest category of food items imported in 2014 fell from EC\$76.3 million in 2013 to EC\$74.0 million in 2014. Imports of dairy products and eggs declined by 3.0 percent to EC\$46.5 million as Saint Lucia regained self-sufficiency in the production of eggs in 2014. In 2014, EC\$57.3 million was spent on the importation of vegetables and fruits, an increase of EC\$3,014,000 from the previous year.

## **Exports of Selected Agri-Produce**

During the period under review, total exports of selected agricultural produce, with the exclusion of bananas grew by 5.6 percent to 878.4 tonnes valued at EC\$1.4 million. Exports of agricultural produce inclusive of bananas rose by 23.1 percent to 3,563 tonnes valued at EC\$3.4 million in 2014. Plantain, breadfruit, mangoes and avocados accounted for the highest proportion of agricultural produce exported in 2014. Exports of plantain increased by 61.4 percent to 530 tonnes in 2014 and generated revenue of EC\$698,000. Breadfruit was the second major commodity exported in 2014. Exports of breadfruit fell from 370 tonnes in 2013 to 249 tonnes in 2014. Accordingly, earnings from breadfruit exports declined from EC\$1.5 million in 2013 to EC\$422,000 in 2014. Exports of mangoes rose significantly in 2014, 68 tonnes of mangoes valued at EC\$136,000 were exported in 2014, compared to 19 tonnes of mangoes valued at EC\$20,000 in 2013. A decrease was recorded in the exports of avocados of approximately 15.2 tonnes in 2014, representing a fall in value of 40.4 percent. This decline in avocado exports was attributed to burgeoning local demand for avocados, particularly during the Creole season.

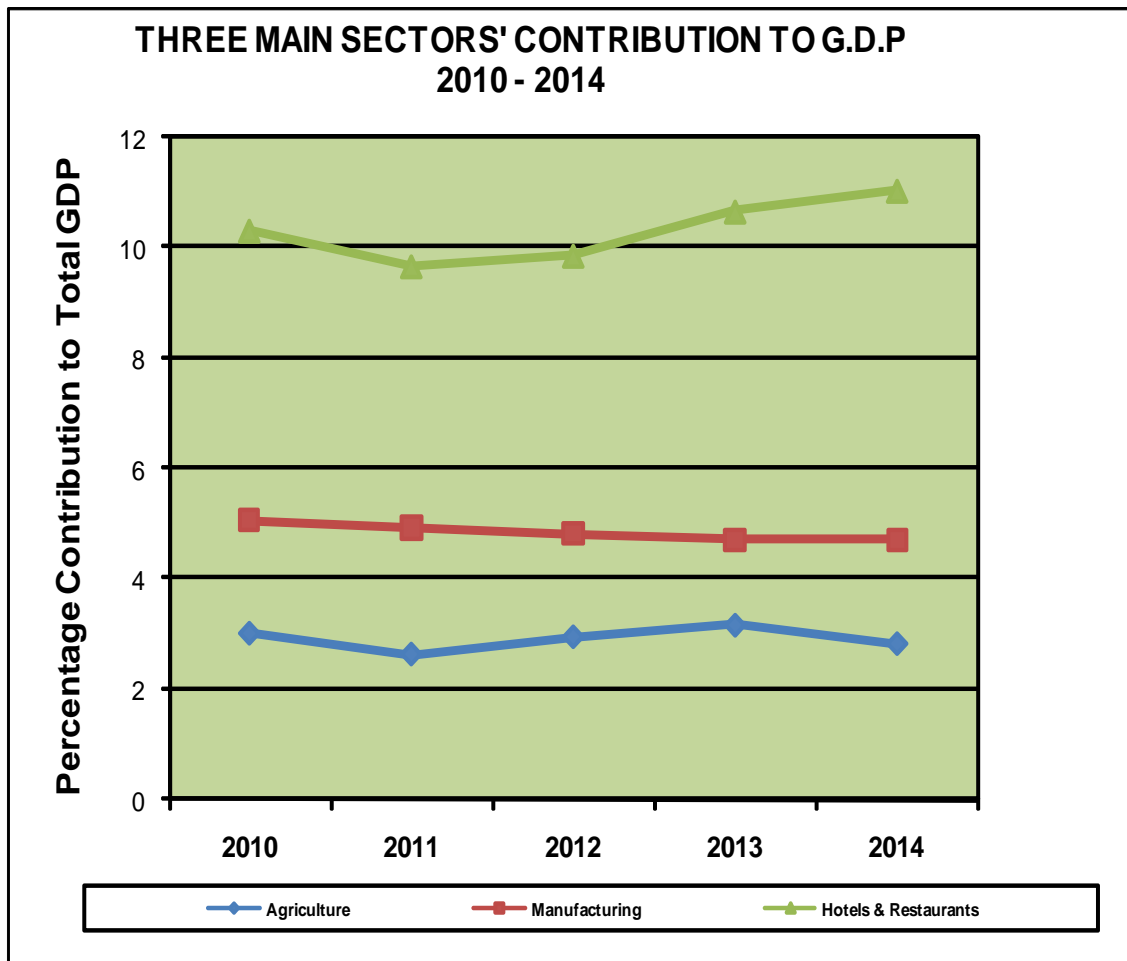

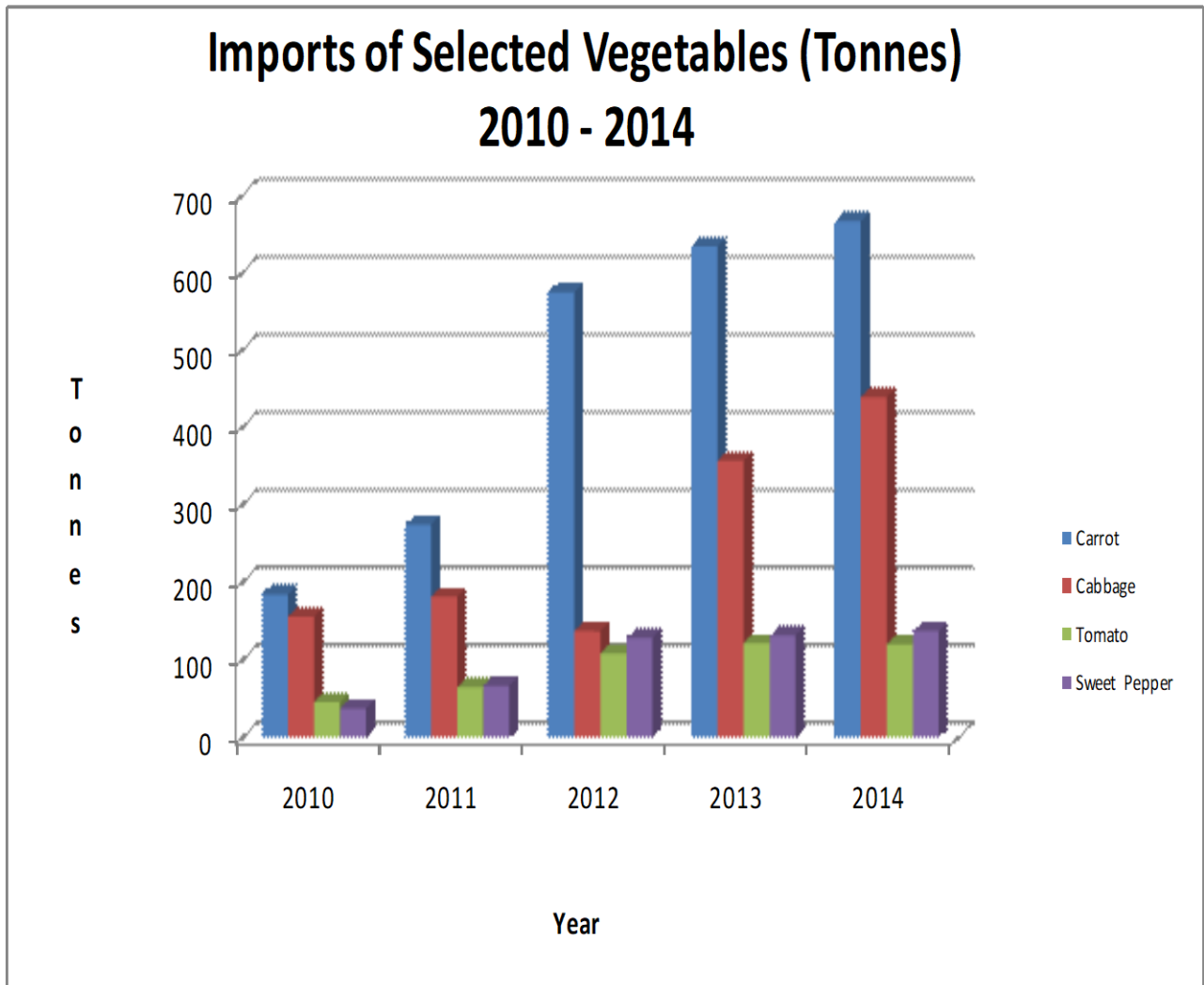

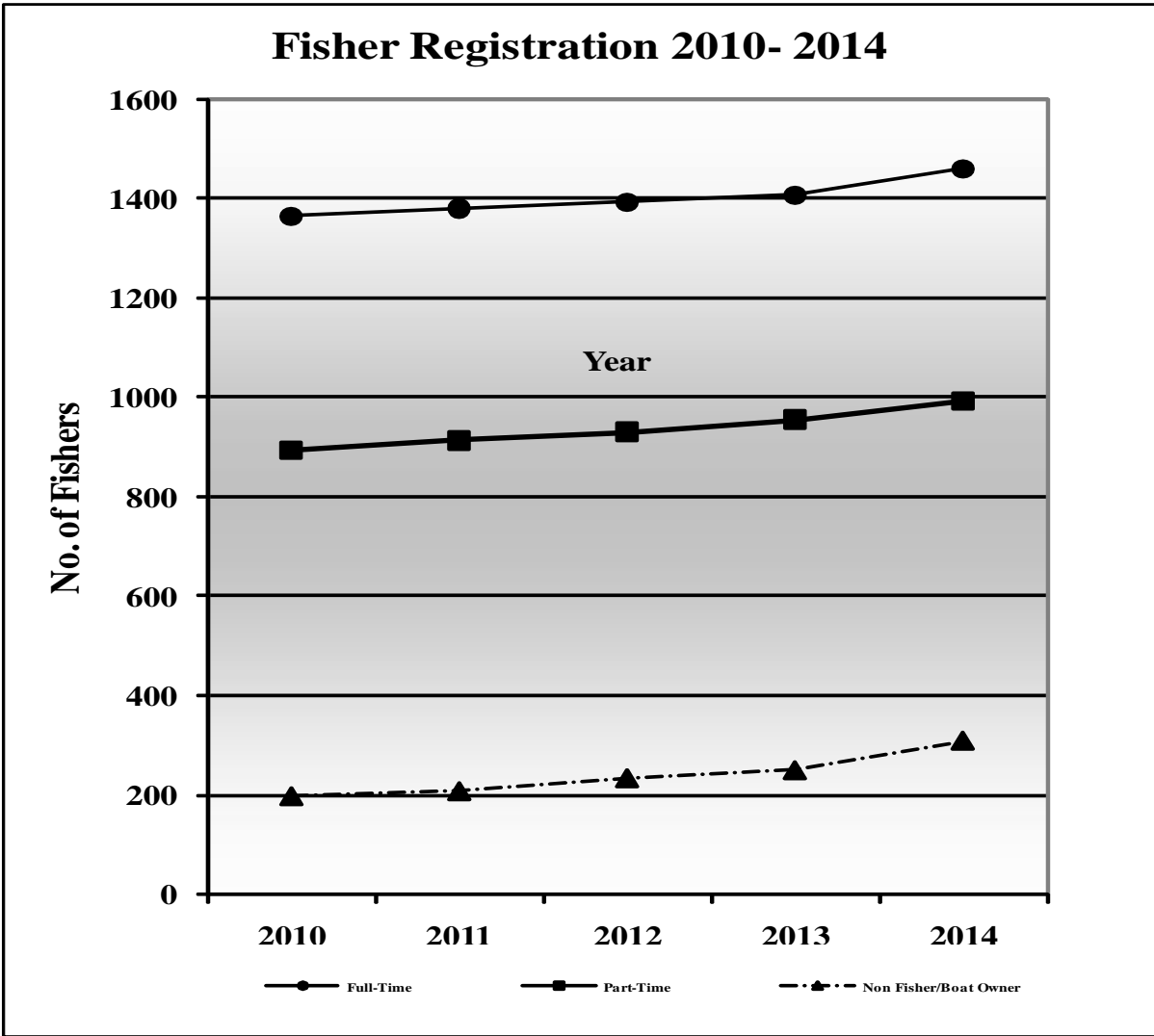
