FOREWORD

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Domestic Economic Developments

The impact of the Global financial crisis continued to be felt throughout the region in 2009. The world's largest economies experienced huge declines in economic growth and significant levels of unemployment. Given these conditions, St. Lucia experienced reduced tourism arrivals, a decline in output in the Manufacturing, Agriculture and the Construction sectors.

General economic activity in St. Lucia contracted by 5.2% in 2009. Weak domestic and external demand had an adverse effect on the economy which led to a fall in foreign direct investment, and by extension an increase in unemployment. A fall in world oil prices from the high prices of 2008, led to a relatively stable rate of inflation in 2009.

The world economy is estimated to have contracted by 0.8% in 2009. The downturn in global economic activity resulted in negative spill-over effects throughout the region as evidenced by the financial collapse of British American Insurance Company and CLICO. Revenues continued to decline while the governments of the region were pressed to increase their expenditure on salaries and social programmes aimed at protecting vulnerable groups and stimulating economic activity.

Overview of the Agricultural Sector

In 2009, the agricultural sector recorded mixed performances in the different subsectors, however the sector grew by 3.54%, thereby continuing its high performance from 2008 when compared to the previous years under review.

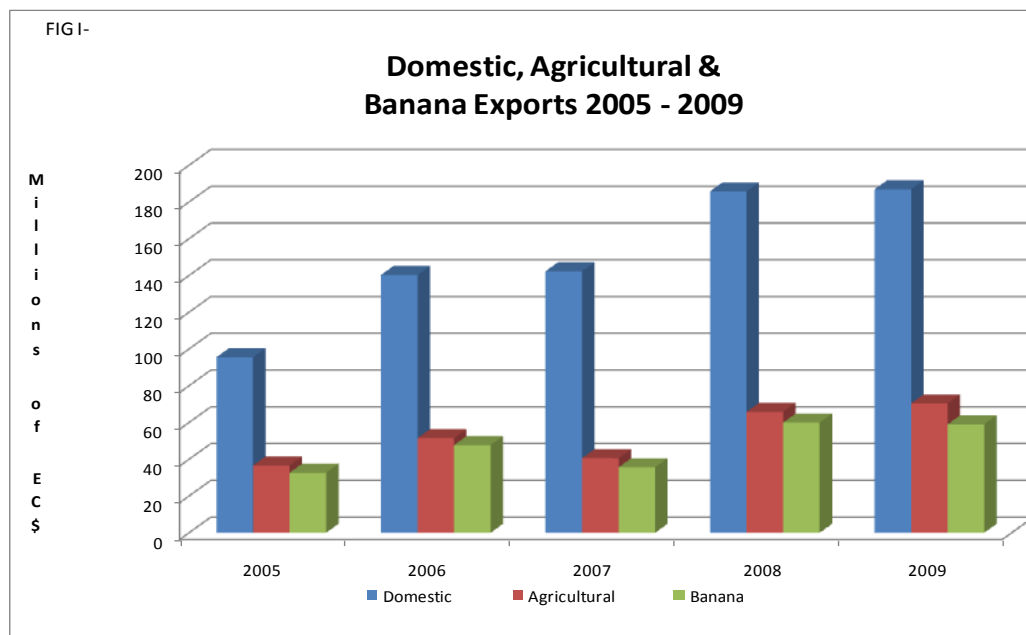

Banana

Banana exports to the U.K declined by 11.6% to 33,925 tonnes in 2009. This was mainly attributable to difficulties in controlling the rapid spread of leaf spot disease, rising input prices and drought conditions which resulted in reduced yields. Exports to the region, however more than doubled in 2009, and the volume of bananas sold to supermarkets increased by 21.5%.



Non Traditional Crops

There was an increase in the volume of non-traditional crops by supermarkets, hotels and for export. Total domestic sales to supermarkets and hotels increased considerably, with supermarket purchases accounting for 38.6% of total purchases. A major deciding factor for this increase in sales to supermarkets was due to the Farmer Certification Programme which led to an enhancement of agricultural production and the strengthening of marketing linkages between farmers and purchasers as well as the provision of technical assistance to farmers.

Fisheries

After growth of 12.3% in 2008, the fisheries sector further expanded in 2009 by 9.6%. This increase in volume was due mainly to the deployment of fish-aggregating devices. The fisheries sector also recorded a decrease in fish imports of 18.4%.

Livestock

2009 registered an improvement in the performance of the livestock sub-sector. Local whole chicken production grew by 26.2 percent to 714.4 tonnes while local pork purchases increased by 8.5percent to 145.51 tonnes in 2009.

The Banana Industry



Total banana exports to the United Kingdom from St. Lucia declined by 11.6 percent to 33,925 tonnes in 2009. Notwithstanding the overall downturn in banana exports over the review period, the first quarter registered growth of 13.7 percent to 8,679 tonnes in line with the increasing trends of the last eight months of 2008 which emanated from extensive rehabilitation efforts of the industry under the Post Hurricane Dean Rehabilitation Programme. Output in the second and third quarters of 2009 were adversely affected by high input cost and leaf spot disease. This led to the inadequate application of fertilizer to banana fields which negatively impacted the yield per acre. While leaf spot monitoring remained in place during the review period, unfavourable weather conditions led to the rapid spread of leafspot disease which affected banana production in the Roseau and Mabouya Valleys. This was reflected in a 24.0 percent and

21.2 percent decline in exports to the UK during the second and third quarters respectively, when compared to the corresponding period of 2008. This trend continued in the last quarter although at a slower rate. In keeping with the overall contraction in the volume of bananas exported to the UK, revenue earnings from bananas fell by 4.4 percent to \$56.3 million.

Production by the entire Windward Islands region declined by 13.7 percent to 47,518 tonnes valued at \$78.1 million. St.Lucia remained the largest contributor to the group with its output accounting for 71.4 percent of the total. The other main Windward Island producers also recorded a reduction in output. St.Vincent's production fell by 8.7 percent to 7,704 tonnes, valued at \$12.7 million. The third largest producer, Dominica, also recorded a decline in banana output by 28.9 percent to 5,889 tonnes.

Exports of bananas to other countries (excluding the United Kingdom) grew by 67.5 percent to 2,051.2 tonnes in 2009. Barbados and Trinidad accounted for the largest share of banana exports to the region. Together they accounted for 99.6 percent of regional banana exports. Exports of bananas to Barbados grew by 13.9 percent to 1,393.6 tonnes in 2009, while 647.9 tonnes of bananas were exported to Trinidad.

Total domestic exports rose by 0.6% to \$186.9 million in 2009. Total agricultural exports grew by 6.9 percent to \$70.4 million in 2009 and accounted for 37.6 percent of total domestic exports. In line with the decrease in the volume of bananas exported to the UK in 2009, the total value of banana exports declined by 1.5 percent to \$ 59.0 million and accounted for 83.9 percent of total agricultural exports in 2009, compared to 91.1 percent in 2008.

The St. Lucia National Fairtrade Organization, a FLO –certified group, handled the majority of bananas (29,992 tonnes of the total 2009 export tonnage) exported to the UK in 2009. There were no exports of bananas by the SLBC in 2009. This followed the decision by WIBDECO to terminate its annual supply contract with banana companies that were not certified by the German –based Fairtrade Labelling Organisation (FLO) which purchases bananas at a higher price per pound. There was an increase in the amount of fruit handled by TQFC, which became Fair Trade compliant in February 2009. The company recorded a 74.9 increase in bananas exported to the UK, 3,933 tonnes of bananas were exported to the UK in 2009 compared to 2,249 tonnes in the previous year.

The prices of banana inputs varied in 2009. While there was an overall decrease in the prices of fertilizers and nematicides in 2009 compared to 2008, there was a general increase in the prices of weedicides and fungicides in 2009.

The Cocoa Industry



The production of cocoa beans continued its upward trend in 2009. This was primarily attributed to increases in both the local and international demand for cocoa. Production grew by 9.9 percent to 110.2 tonnes in 2009. Production of cocoa beans was at its highest during the first and fourth quarters of 2009 where 32.6 and 55.0 tonnes of cocoa beans were produced respectively, whereas the second and third quarters of 2009 recorded the lowest levels of production, 16.6 and 6.0 tonnes

respectively.

Cocoa exports declined by 11.3 percent to 18.8 tonnes in 2009. Accordingly, the value of cocoa exported contracted by 8.2 percent to \$211,600 in 2009. This was attributed to the drought conditions during the second half of 2009, which resulted in reduced yields during the latter half of 2009. Cocoa beans are usually exported during the second and third quarters of the year.

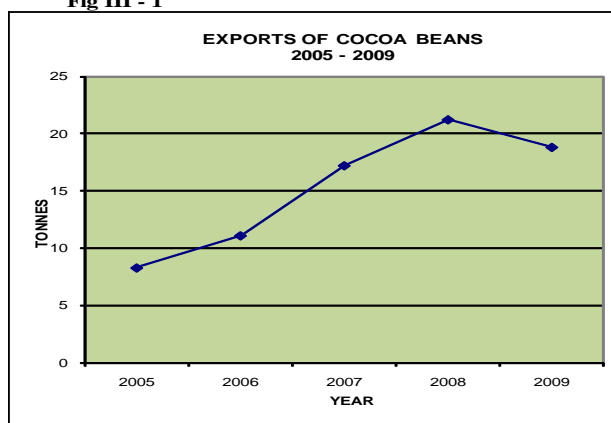

The Coconut Industry



For a number of years, coconut in St. Lucia was cultivated primarily for the production of copra (shelled and dried coconut) and processing of cooking oil. However, the increasing demand for fresh water (jelly) nuts which continues to fetch an attractive price has resulted in decreases in the quantity of coconut available for copra production.

In 2009, there were 76 coconut farmers engaged in selling fresh coconuts to the local market. The average volume of coconuts sold per week by a farmer was recorded at 250

coconuts. During 2009, 53 farmers sold their coconuts to Dlo Koko, a company involved in selling bottled coconut water. The company purchased 503 coconuts from farmers on a weekly basis and sold one hundred (100) 1.5 litre bottles of coconut water to the local market. However opportunities exist to sell greater volumes of coconut to the local market. Currently, the company is not engaged in the export of coconut water due to the limited volumes of coconuts available; great potential exists for export of bottled coconut water.

Through its Crop Development Programme, the Ministry of Agriculture has been continuing its work of revitalizing the Coconut Industry through the implementation of programmes that seek to rehabilitate existing acreages and further expand acreages in an effort to meet the growing demand for coconuts. This involves initiatives such as the Coconut Revitalization Programme to be instituted in the upcoming year which will encourage the expanded production of coconut.

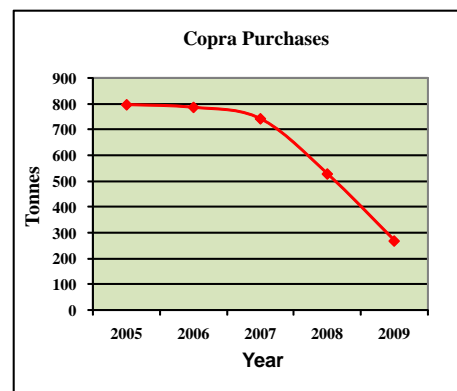
The St. Lucia Coconut Growers Association (SLCGA) manufactured and sold five value added products to various supermarkets, pharmacies and farmers which included cooking oil massage oil, fixcion, dishwashing liquid and coconut meal. Total sales value of these products was recorded at \$51,485.01 in 2009 compared to \$139,236.14 in 2008. This decline in sales value in 2009 was attributed to the closure of the SLCGA during the period January to May 2009 as a result of financial difficulties. The company recommenced production in June 2009.

Non- Traditional Crops



There was an overall increase in the volume of non-traditional crops purchased by the supermarkets, hotels and export sub-sectors during the period under review. Total domestic sales to supermarkets and the hotel sub-sectors rose by 4.6 percent to 3,789.2 tonnes in 2009. Revenue derived from these sales grew by 7.6 percent to \$12.9 million.

Supermarket purchases which accounted for 38.6 percent of total purchases of non-traditional crops grew by 9.9 percent to 2,833.7 tonnes in 2009, while revenue

generated from supermarket purchases rose by 16.4 percent to \$8.5 million, indicating an increase in the average prices of non-traditional crops purchased by supermarkets. There was an increase in the quantity of most categories of crops purchased with the exception of the fruit and tree crop and traditional vegetables categories which declined by 12.8 and 4.6 percent respectively.

While the volume of non-traditional crops purchased by the hotel sector declined by 8.5 percent to 955.5 tonnes in 2009, revenue derived from these sales declined by 6.1 percent to \$4.4 million. This moderate decline in revenue may be attributed to an increase in the average unit price paid to farmers. There was a decrease in all categories of crops purchased by hotels during the period under review. This is in keeping with the performance of the tourism sector which posted declines in the number of stay-over arrivals in 2009.

Exports of non-traditional crops grew by 51.8 percent to 3,551.9 tonnes during the period under review. Accordingly, total earnings derived from exports of non-traditional crops increased by 54.6 percent to \$4.0 million. In order to increase the production of non-traditional crops, a greenhouse project was implemented along with the continued support by the Ministry of Agriculture by providing incentives and technical services to farmers in the sub-sector. Other initiatives include the upgrading of the Union Agricultural Station, such as a state of the art Orchid Greenhouse Facility and the tissue culture laboratory with the capacity to produce large volumes of quality planting material. In the upcoming year, a new Marketing Infrastructure will be commissioned which will assist farmers in the marketing of their produce. This will be further supported by the opening of the Fond Assau Agro Processing Plant.

Fish Landings



Total fish landings in 2009 recorded an increase of 9.6 percent over fish landings in the previous period of 2008. This increase in fish landings was attributed to the deployment of additional fish aggregating devices (FADs). There has been a gradual upward trend in fish landings from 2005 to 2009. The highest amounts of fish landings were from Dennery, which recorded 431.3 tonnes, followed by Vieux – Fort with 406.9 tonnes and other sites (Canaries, Praslin, Marisule, River Doree and Roseau) which recorded 403.5 tonnes in total.

Total volume recorded was 1,857 tonnes in 2009, with a corresponding value of \$24.1 million. Dolphin landings grew by 36.3% to 464.61 tonnes while 485.8 tonnes of tuna was landed in 2009, representing a decrease of 1.3% from the previous year. Decreases were noted in flying fish landings and shark/blackfish. There was an 8.5% increase in king fish in 2009 over the similar period in the previous year.

There was a decrease in fish imports of 18.3% in 2009. Last year also recorded the lowest amount of fish imported for the past 5 years. The first quarter registered the lowest fish imports (320 tonnes) and the third quarter (322 tonnes), imports were relatively high in the second and fourth quarters.

308 tonnes of frozen and chilled fish was imported in 2009, a decrease of 115 tonnes from 2008. There was also a decrease in the importation of canned fish of approximately 138 tonnes. This represents the lowest amount of canned fish imported for the past 5 years.

The development of training programmes designed to educate existing and new fishers and other persons who work in the fishing industry, on the advancement of best fishing practices, in order to optimize catches is expected to contribute to further increases in fish landings along with further reductions in the importation of fish. The fishing industry will be further boosted by a recently completed Fish Complex in Anse la Raye, and a high-quality aquaculture facility at Union.

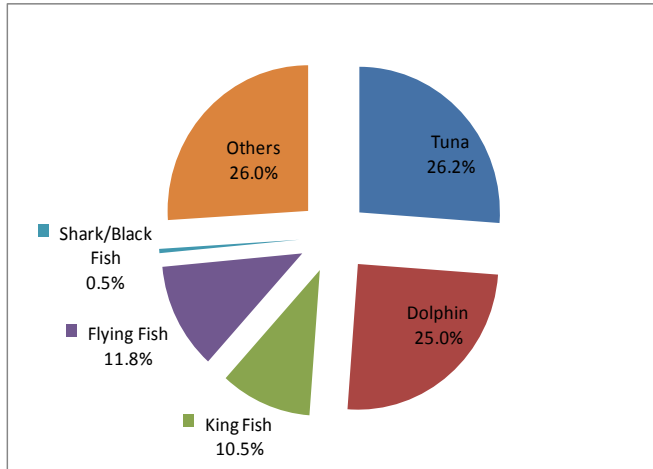
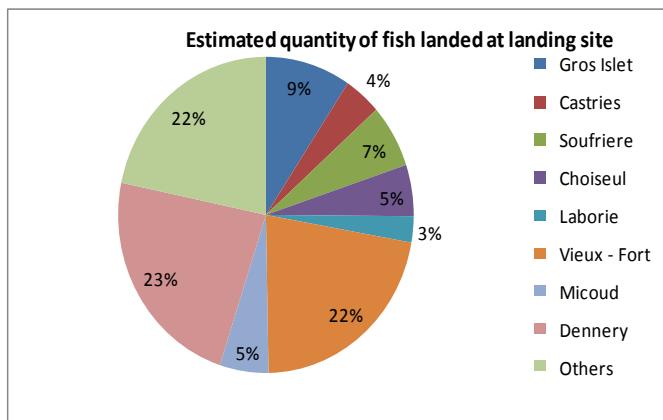

Livestock Sector

Poultry Imports

There was a minimal increase in imports of poultry of 2 tonnes. Chicken imports increased by a marginal 2.2% while turkey imports decreased by 13.1 % to 168 tonnes. Meats from other types of birds grew by 26.7 percent to 57 tonnes. The importation of whole chicken decreased by 1 tonne. These figures indicate that there has been a fairly stable level of imports of whole chicken since 2007. The importation of other parts declined by 7.1% to 3,908 tonnes, valued at \$17.9 million.

An increase was recorded in the importation of necks, backs and wings in 2009 of 7.4% with an increase in dollar value spent of 21.9%. This was due to the absence of local production of necks, backs and wings.

Egg Production



In 2009 the trend of total self-sufficiency in table egg production from 2008 continued. There were no imports of table eggs in 2009.

The average laying flock on farms increased in 2009 by 15%, with a corresponding increase in local egg production of 29.1% in 2009 over the previous year. A value of \$6.5 million was recorded for table eggs in 2009 compared to \$4.6 million in 2008.

Local Poultry Production



There was an increase in the local production of whole chicken in 2009 of approximately 148.5 tonnes with an increase in value of \$8.5 million in 2009 compared to \$6.3 million in 2008. The lowest production levels were recorded in the first quarter with 87.5 tonnes produced. Production increased and was fairly stable in the second, third and fourth quarters with 207.1, 203.8 and 216.0 tonnes being produced respectively. The period under review recorded a decrease in local production of mixed

parts after an increase was recorded in 2008 over the preceding year. Production fell by 213.1 tonnes in 2009. This represented a 42.2 percent decrease from 2008, where production had increased by 41.7% from 2007. Accordingly, the total value of mixed parts declined by 40.2 percent to \$3.4 million in 2009. This resulted in an overall contraction in local poultry production during the period under review. Local chicken production declined by 6.0 percent to 1006.6 tonnes. This was occasioned by a reduction in the number of poultry farmers. During the review period a number of farmers ceased production. Accordingly, total revenue declined by 1.0 percent to \$11.9 million in 2009.

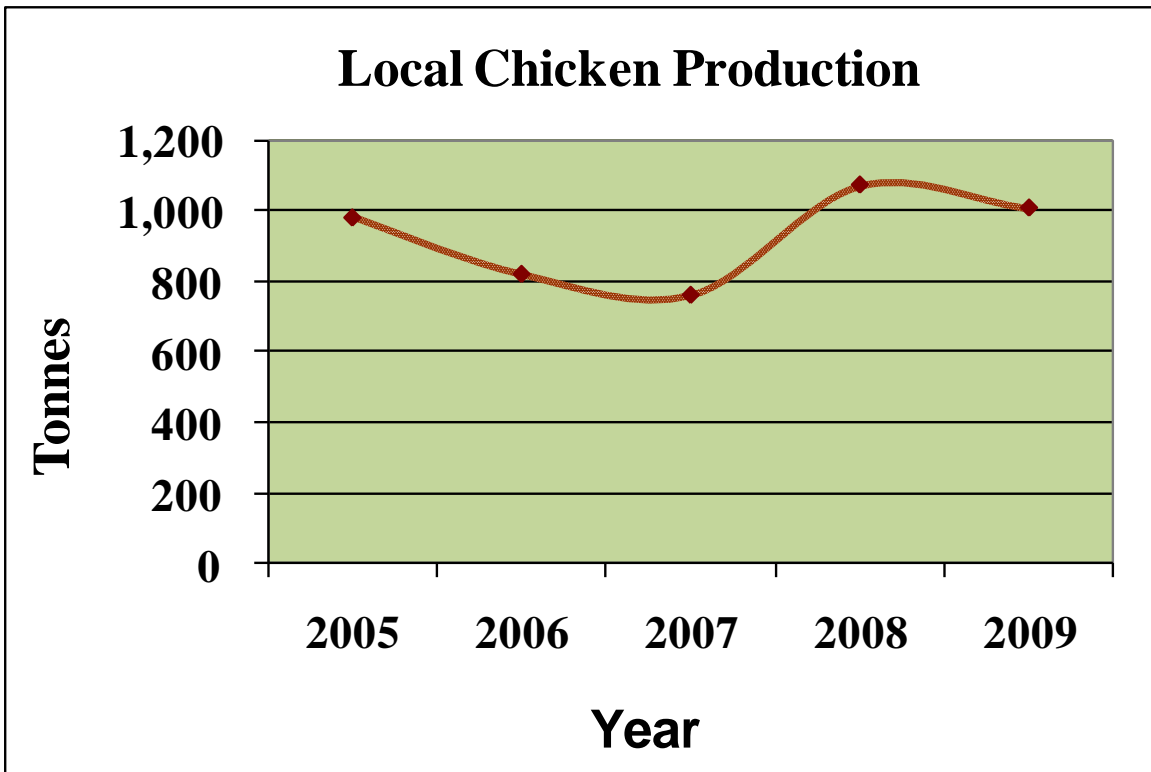

Local Pork Purchases



Local pork purchases increased in 2009 by 8.5% after a dip in 2008. This represented an increase in value of 11.4 % to \$1.8 million. The first two quarters of 2009 represented the lowest production periods of pork in 2009, 26.95 tonnes of pork was produced in the first quarter and 23.40 tonnes in the second quarter, while the third and fourth quarters recorded increases, with 52.81 and 42.35 tonnes of pork being produced in the third and fourth quarters respectively.

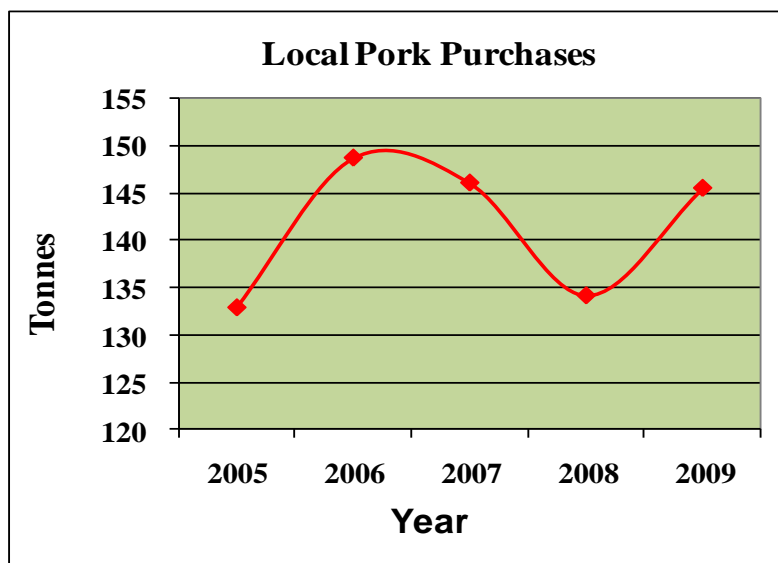

Meat Imports

Following an increase of 20.4 % in 2008, imports of beef declined by 27.2% to 473 tonnes in 2009. The first, second and fourth quarters of 2009 registered declines in beef imports while the third quarter recorded growth of 21.3 %. There was a pronounced decrease in the importation of beef during the second quarter of 2009. Beef imports fell by 60.7% to 84 tonnes, compared to the corresponding period of 2008, while the first and fourth quarters of 2009 recorded declines of 15.3% and 31.4% respectively. This was partly due to the economic downturn which led to declines in hotel occupancy rates.

After declining by 9.9% to 556 tonnes in 2008, pork imports declined by 25.0 % to 417 tonnes in 2009. Imports of mutton decreased by 163 tonnes or 21.8%. Chevron imports increased by 18 tonnes, an 85.7% increase from the previous year.

The opening of the Meat Processing Facility in the south of the island is expected to result in a significant reduction in meat imports.

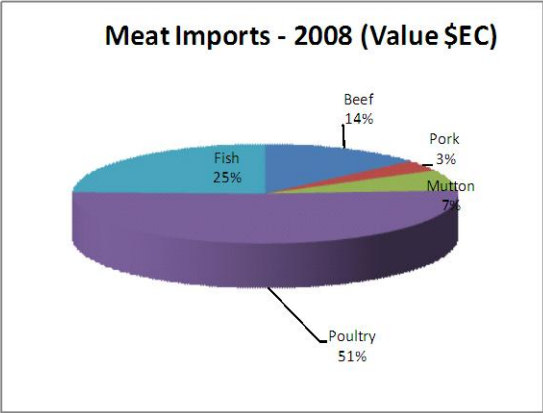
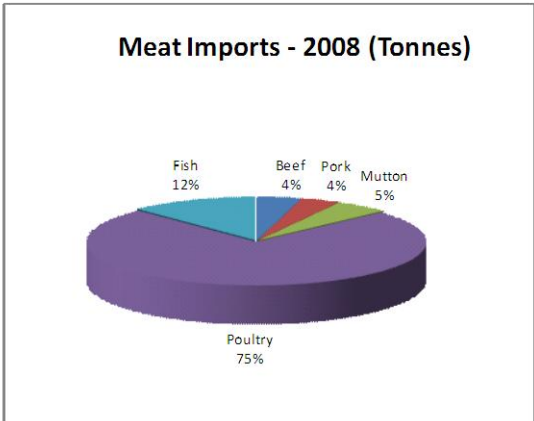

Imports of Selected Livestock Products

The prices of selected livestock products imported grew in 2008 mainly on account of the food crisis in that year. In 2009, there was some normalization in food prices resulting in decreases in value for milk, cheese and butter.

Milk imports increased by 12.3% in 2009, with a fall in value of 19.9%. Cheese imports increased by 21.8%, and recorded a fall in value of 19.1%. Imports of butter fell by 11.8% to 90 tonnes in 2009. Imports of milk grew by 6.0 and 15.5 % during the first and second quarters of 2009. The third quarter of 2009 recorded the largest increase in imports of milk. Imports of milk grew by 30.5 percent during the third quarter of 2009 compared to the corresponding period of 2008. Cheese imports declined by 28.9 % during the first quarter of 2009 while imports of cheese grew by 23.0, 52.7 % and 40.9% respectively during the second, third and fourth quarters of 2009 compared to the corresponding period of 2008.

Imports of butter declined by 57.1 percent to 3 tonnes during the first quarter of 2009, while the second, third and fourth quarters recorded declines of 8.3, 19.0 and 5.3 percent respectively compared to the corresponding period of 2008.

Agricultural Financing

In 2009, a total of 19 loans related to livestock activity were approved. This represents the highest number of loans for that kind of activity for the past 5 years. These loans were valued at \$504,000 while in 2008 6 loans were approved for similar activity at a value of \$621,000. 16 loans at a value of \$278,000 were approved for fishing activity in 2009, compared with 12 loans for the previous period valued at \$212,000. This figure also represents the highest number of loans approved for fishing activity since 2005.

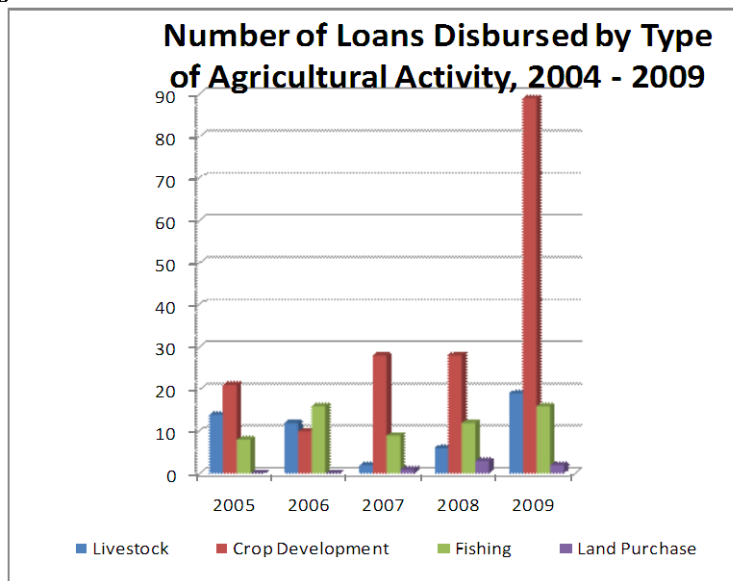
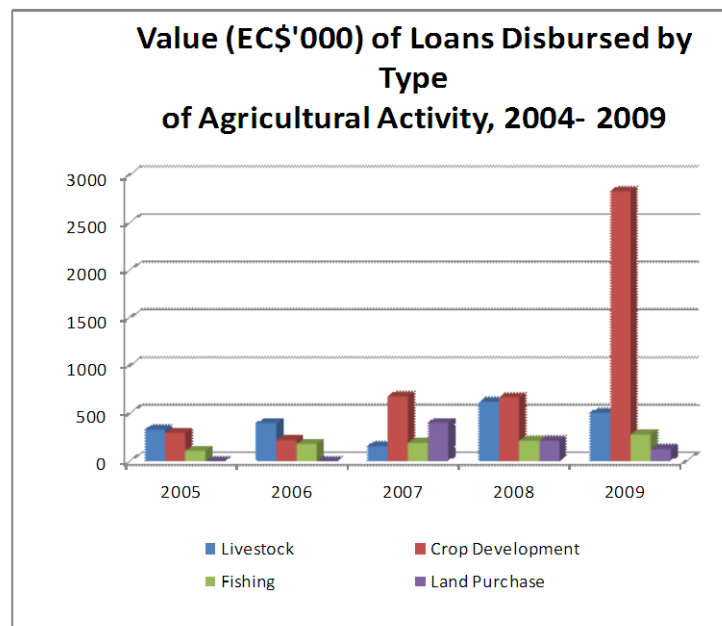

In 2009, 89 loans were approved for crop development, compared to 28 for the previous year. 2009 also recorded the highest number of loans approved for crop development since 2005. These loans were valued at \$2,824,000 compared to \$668,000 in 2008. A total of 127 loans were approved for agricultural and fishing activity in 2009, an increase of 149% from 2008. This increase in loans approved may be attributed to the addition of the St. Lucia Development Bank to the pool of financing sources which facilitates agricultural financing.

Food Trade Balance

There was a narrowing of the deficit on the food trade balance in 2009 by 1.7 percent to 222.5 million. The deficit on the food trade balance narrowed negligibly from 226.3 million in 2008 to 222.5 million in 2009, due to a less than 1 percent increase in total domestic exports coupled with a 22.2 percent decline in total imports. There was a decline in domestic exports during the first and second quarters of 2009 compared to the corresponding period of 2008. Domestic exports fell by 2.7 and 10.4 percent respectively during the first and second quarters of 2009. Domestic exports registered an improvement in the third and fourth quarters of 2009 compared to the corresponding period of 2008, where domestic exports rose by 8.3 and 5.7 percent respectively. There was a decline in total imports during all four quarters of 2009 compared to the same period in the previous year. Food imports as a percentage of total imports rose from 16 percent in 2008 to 21 percent in 2009, while food exports as a percentage of domestic exports grew from 35 percent in 2008 to 38 percent in 2009.

Exports of agricultural produce continued its upward trend in 2009. These exports rose by 51.8 percent in 2009 to 3,551.9 tonnes. This reflected a significant increase in exports of bananas to the regional market which saw an increase in exports of 118.9 percent in 2009. All other major export crops particularly breadfruit, plantain, mango and avocado recorded declines in exports in 2009.

Composition of Food Imports

Meat and meat preparation, dairy products, cereal and cereal preparations, vegetables and fruits and miscellaneous food preparations all formed a major part of food imports. A marginal decrease was recorded in 2009 of 1% in the importation of meat and meat preparations as a percentage of total food imports, and a 1% increase in dairy products and eggs, fish and fish preparations and miscellaneous food preparation as a percentage of total food imports.

The composition of food imports has remained fairly constant throughout the five-year period under review. In 2009, \$64,002,000 was spent on the importation of meat and meat preparations, a decrease of \$3,525,000 from the previous year. Decreases in value spent were also recorded in all the other major components of food imports with the exception of cereal and cereal preparation whose value rose in 2009.

Meat and Meat preparations which accounted for 22 percent of total food imports in 2009 fell from \$67.5 million in 2008 to \$64.0 million in 2009. Cereal and cereal preparations which accounted for the highest proportion of food imports in 2009 grew by 20.4 percent to \$68.4

Exports of Selected Agri -Produce

The major exports of agricultural produce in 2009 were breadfruit (447.20 tonnes), Plantain (326.68 tonnes), and to a lower degree Avocados (35.74 tonnes) and Mangoes (32.39 tonnes). Total exports of agricultural produce, with the exclusion of bananas earned \$1.35 million. Exports of Agricultural produce inclusive of bananas totaled \$4.02 million with a corresponding 3,551.90 tonnes exported.

In 2009, there was a fall in the export of avocados of 39.92 tonnes, a 52.8% decrease from 2008. There was also a decrease recorded in the exports of mangoes of approximately 55.3 tonnes, representing a fall in value of 41.1%. Export of breadfruit also fell by 80 tonnes, a similar trend was also followed by plantain with a decrease of 16 tonnes in 2009. A remarkable fall in exports in 2009 was in hot peppers, a category in which 28.99 tonnes less was exported compared to the previous year. This decline in exports of agricultural produce was primarily attributed to drought conditions during the latter half of 2009 which resulted in reduced yields of agricultural output.

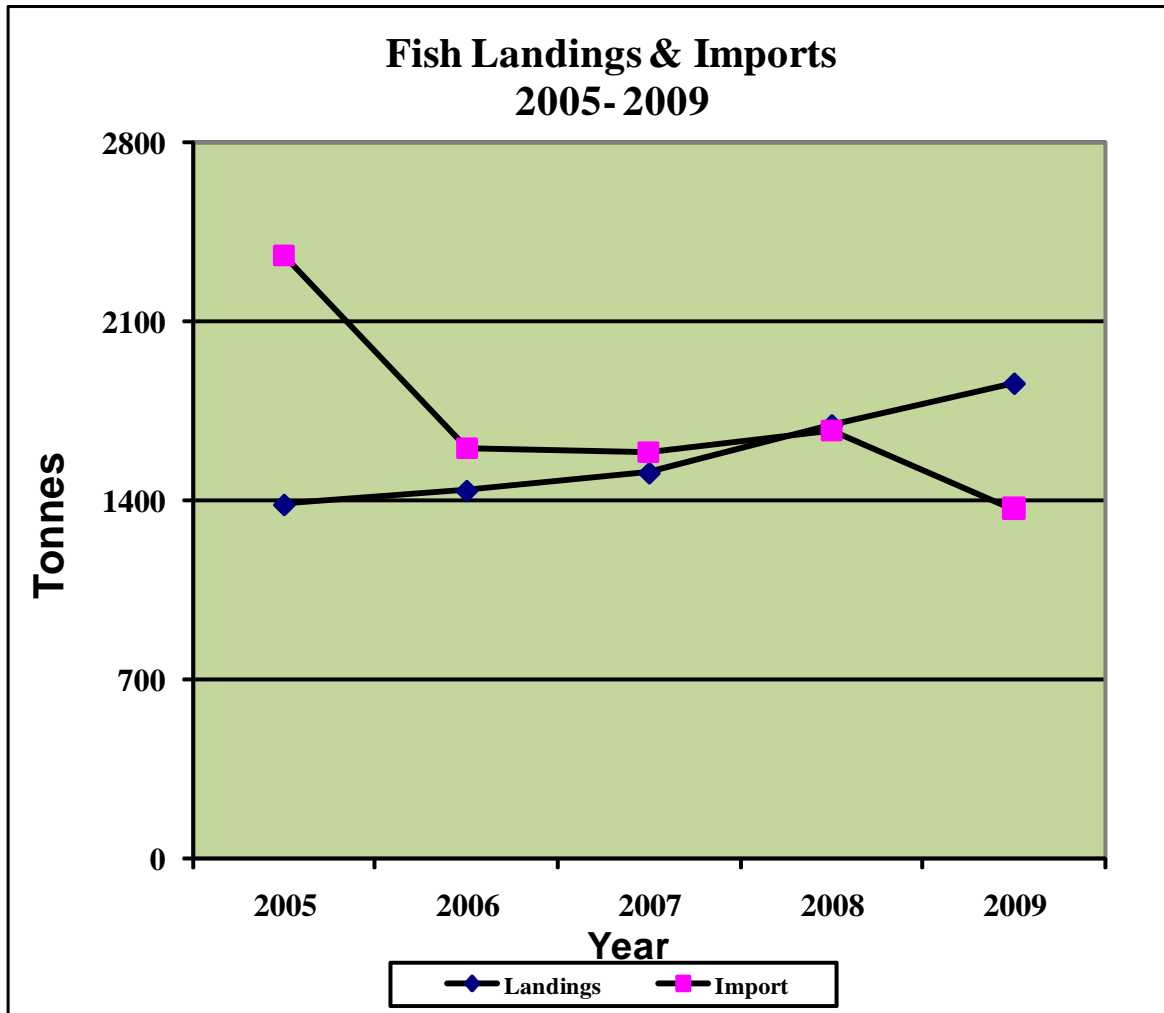

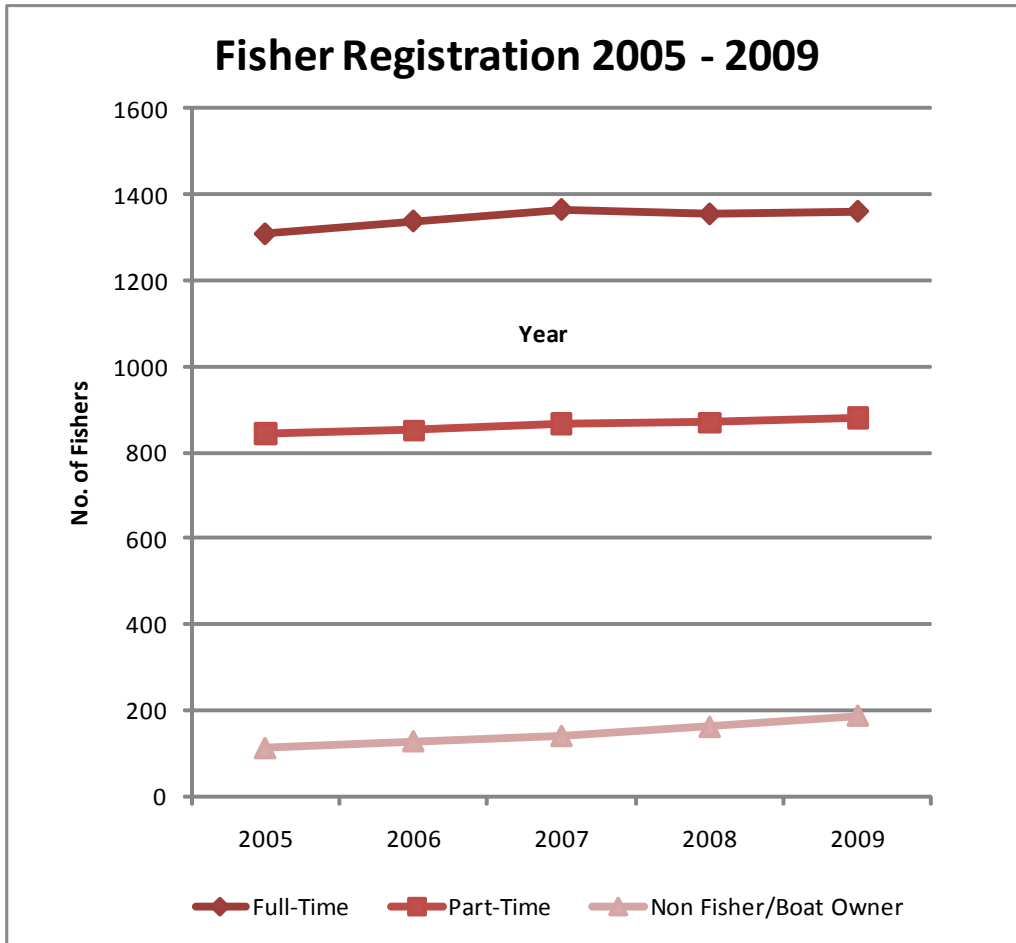
