

The Agricultural Statistical Digest, a publication of the Statistics Unit of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, is designed to provide information on the agriculture and fishing industries in St. Lucia.

This edition presents data specifically for the period January to December 2002, and it also includes data for the historical period from 1998 – 2001.

The Statistics Unit would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who so willingly supplied the data within the Digest. We would also like to extend our gratitude to those who assisted by providing suggestions or criticisms regarding the improvement of this digest and/or future publications. 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**The Agricultural Statistical Unit advises its readers to refer to the following notes before reviewing the tables. The notes are intended to offer clarity to the data as well as to acquaint readers with its sources.**

#### THE BANANA INDUSTRY

The figures published for banana production represent the total quantity of bananas purchased by the St. Lucia Banana Corporation (SLBC) from banana producers. However, since the privatization of the banana industry, the data is now being sourced from the Windward Island Banana Development Exporting Company Ltd. (WIBDECO).

The quantities of bananas purchased account for an estimated 90-95% of the island's total production, and are exclusively for exports mainly to the United Kingdom. Variations between the purchase and export figures are due to rejected fruit.

#### THE COCOA INDUSTRY

Data on cocoa beans are collected from the sole exporter of the crop – the St. Lucia Agriculturists' Association (SLAA). The SLAA also supplies cocoa beans to local private individuals for domestic and commercial purposes from time to time. Purchases of cocoa beans by SLAA represent an estimated 90% of the island's cocoa bean production. Cocoa bean exports are mainly to Europe—particularly to the United Kingdom—and the United States of America.

#### THE COCONUT INDUSTRY

Copra is produced from an estimated 85% of the island's total production of coconut and is purchased in bulk solely by the St. Lucia Coconut Growers Association (SLCGA). The SLCGA purchased the assets of the Copra Manufacturers Limited (CML). The SLCGA normally purchases all of the island's copra production for domestic use, and therefore, copra is not exported.

However, coconuts are exported in the green (water nuts) and dried forms. The early 1990's have witnessed an increasing demand for water nuts.

#### THE NON-TRADITIONAL CROP SECTOR

Presently, data concerning the quantities and prices of domestic agricultural produce are obtained from St. Lucia Marketing Board (SLMB) and leading supermarkets on a regular basis. The produce price is the price the farmer/producer is paid for his or her crop at the various market outlets.

THE FISHING INDUSTRY

These figures represent the estimated total amount of fish landed at the various fishing districts/landing sites. Fish landings are monitored daily at the various fishing districts by the Department of Fisheries of the Ministry of Agriculture Forestry and Fisheries. The fishing season extends from January to June, and there are approximately one thousand (1000) registered fishing vessels on the island.

An ongoing programme has been established for boat registration with the Fisheries Co-operatives. This is done on a voluntary basis by fishermen as is a prerequisite for receiving duty-free concessions such as rebate on fuel.

THE LIVESTOCK SECTOR

Table egg production data is sourced from an estimated 100 poultry farms island wide and are monitored on a monthly basis by the Livestock Division of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries. The table egg production data does not include figures for backyard production or subsistence farming.

AGRICULTURAL FINANCING

These figures are obtained from the Bank of St. Lucia (BOSL), formerly the National Commercial Bank of Saint Lucia. They relate to the number of loan applications that the BOSL has approved during each respective year, and the funding of these loans is facilitated by the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB). It should be noted that not all the funds were disbursed by the BOSL in the same year that the loans were approved.

THE TRADE BALANCE ON FOOD

The data in this section illustrates agricultural trade in non-traditional crops as well as fresh produce. Also presented in this section is the trade balance on food.

### OVERVIEW OF THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR

Agriculture's contribution to GDP continued its declining trend throughout the period from 1998 to 2002. In 2002 agriculture's GDP was EC\$65.5million a decline of EC\$0.7 million compared to 2001. Banana exports contributed EC\$30.57 million or 2.76% to total GDP and other crops accounted for 1.22% of the same total. Of the thirteen (13) sectors, Agriculture ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in its contribution to total GDP in 2002, unlike in 1998 when the sector ranked sixth.

The fishing sub-sector accounted for just over 1% of GDP whilst the livestock and forestry sub-sectors accounted for 0.80% and 0.10%, respectively.

In 2002, agricultural exports totalled approximately EC\$64.1 million, EC\$4.87 million less than in 2001. Banana exports fell by EC\$7.28 million, from EC\$52.7 in 2001 to EC\$45.4million in 2002. To date banana exports continue to decline in relation to agricultural and domestic exports.

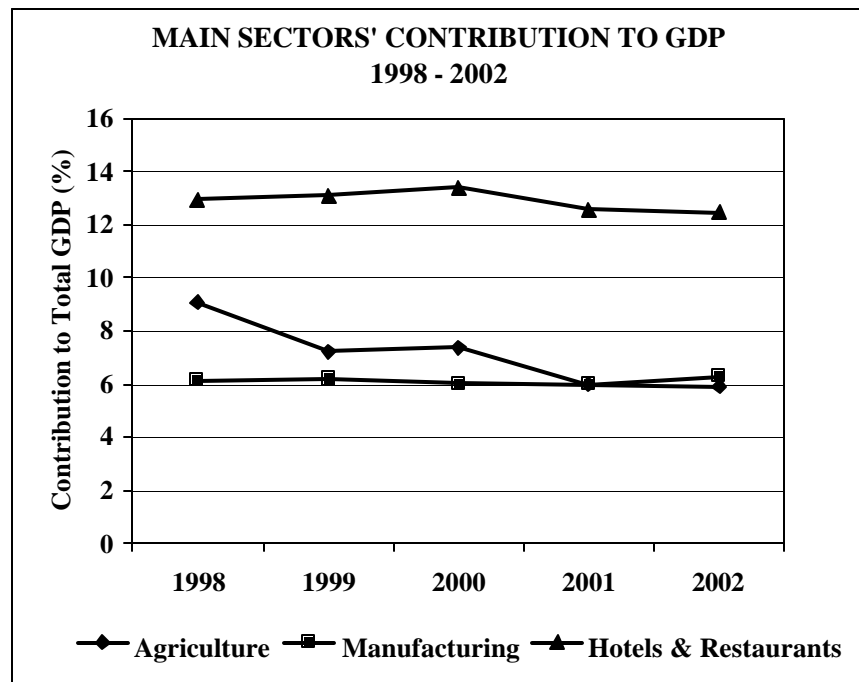

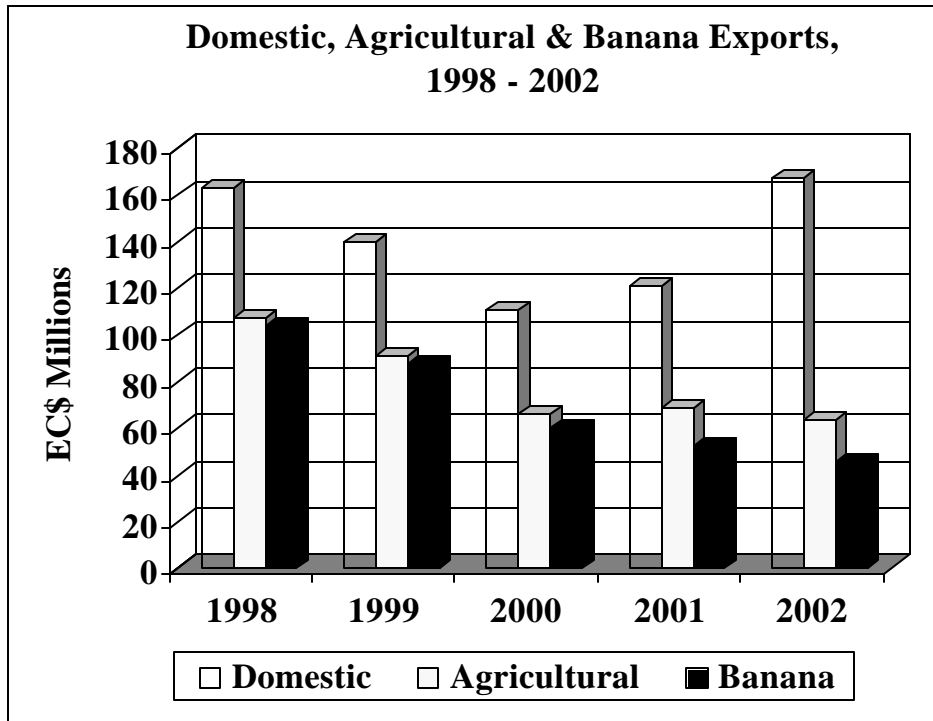

**THE BANANA INDUSTRY**

St. Lucia remains the leading banana exporter in the Windward Islands, and in 2002 accounted for 48.7% of the total banana exports by the region. In 2002, banana exports in St. Lucia rose by 13.8 tonnes, representing an increase in revenue of EC\$16.6M.

Of the three (3) established banana exporting companies, the St. Lucia Banana Corporation (SLBC) was the largest exporter of bananas for the last five (5) years. In 2002, the company accounted for almost sixty percent (60%) of total banana exports in St. Lucia. However, export volumes have dropped over the last three (3) years, and in 2000 and 2001, banana exports by SLBC accounted for 71.1% and 66.3%, respectively, of total banana exports.

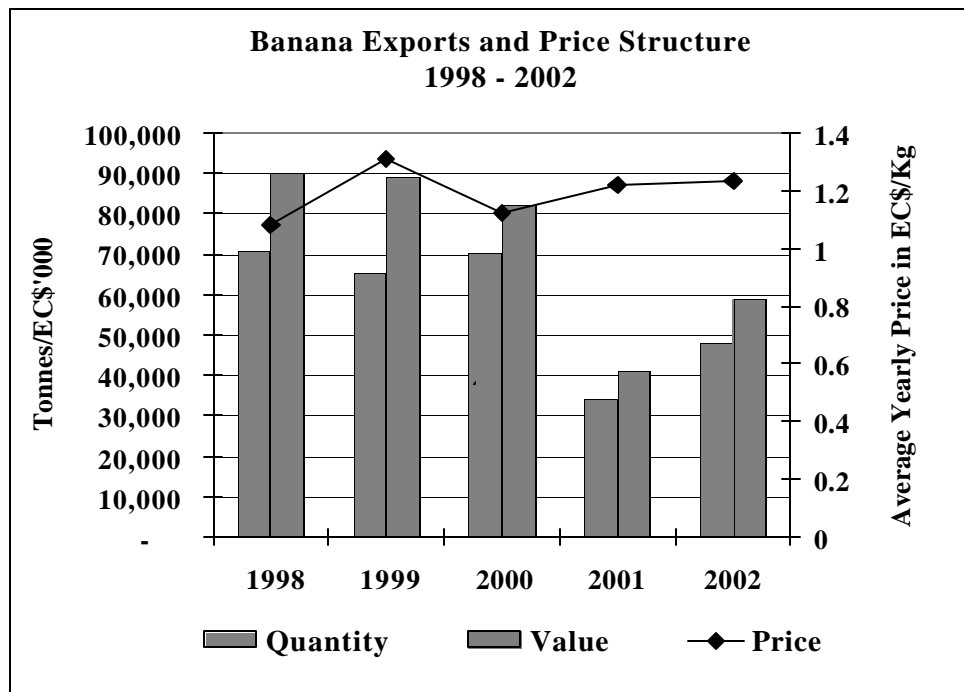

### THE COCOA INDUSTRY

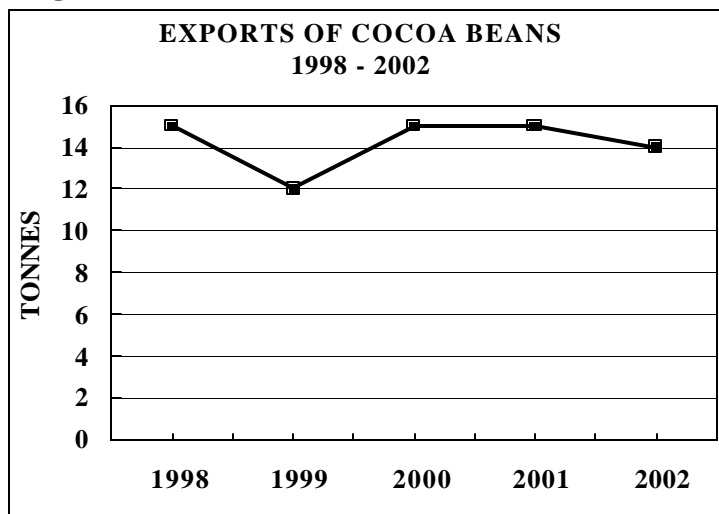
In 2002, purchases of cocoa beans by the St. Lucia Agriculturists' Association (SLAA) amounted to 14 tonnes. Nevertheless, exports of cocoa decreased by one tonne in 2002 relative to the previous year, amounting to EC\$70,000 in revenue.

### THE COCONUT INDUSTRY

The volume of copra purchased in 2002 declined by 41.9% relative to 2001. However, there was an overall increase in the production and exports of copra products. In 2002 revenue generated from copra products increased by 150.7% over 2001. Subsequently, over the period in review, exports revenue scored highest in 2002, amounting to EC\$351,000 - two and a half times the revenue earned in 2001.

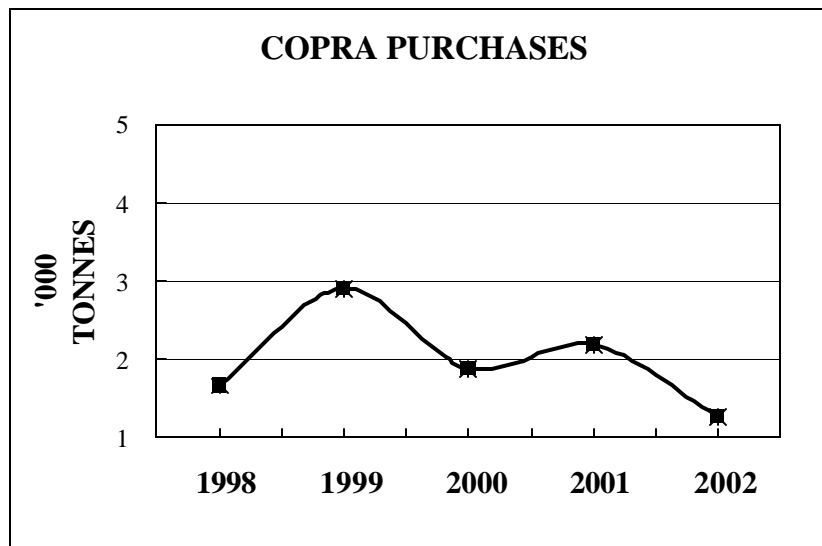
The relatively insignificant volumes of coconut oil (refined and unrefined) exported between 1998 and 2001 was followed by the export of 86,000 litres in 2002, generating EC\$220,000 in revenue. This noteworthy increase in the volume of exported coconut oil was as a result of the previous years' production of the unrefined oil.

**THE NON-TRADITIONAL CROP SECTOR**

The total volume of fresh agricultural produce purchased by selected marketing outlets and hotels in 2002 declined by over 470 tonnes compared to 2001.

A decline in total purchases was recorded for three (3) of the five (5) categories of agricultural produce. Total purchases of fruit and tree crops declined by 299 tonnes, of which 289 tonnes represented the decline in purchases by the marketing outlets and the remaining 10 tonnes, a decline in purchases by the hotels. Most significantly, was the fall in total purchases of citrus fruits, particularly grapefruit and sweet orange—the purchases of which declined by 61 tonnes and 41 tonnes, respectively. Total mango purchases by the marketing outlets decreased by approximately 97 tonnes in 2002 compared to 2001. Paw Paw was the only fruit to have shown an increase in purchases by the marketing outlets.

Total vegetable purchases declined by 175 tonnes. This decrease was mainly attributable to the decline in purchases by the marketing outlets, whereas hotels purchases rose by nearly two (2) tonnes.

There was an overall drop in the total volume of tomato purchased—a decline of 57.7 and 6.5 tonnes by the marketing outlets and the hotels, respectively. Significant falls in purchases were also reported for cucumber, 64 tonnes, and cabbage, 27 tonnes.

Purchases of root crops by the marketing outlets decreased by 7 tonnes, whereas hotel purchases recorded an increase of 5 tonnes. Although there was an overall decline in the quantity of root crops purchased, more specifically by the marketing outlets, there was an increase in the amount of sweet potato and white yam purchased. This increase in purchases was due to an increase in the production of these crops. In 2002, hotel purchases of dasheen increased by 6.5 tonnes.

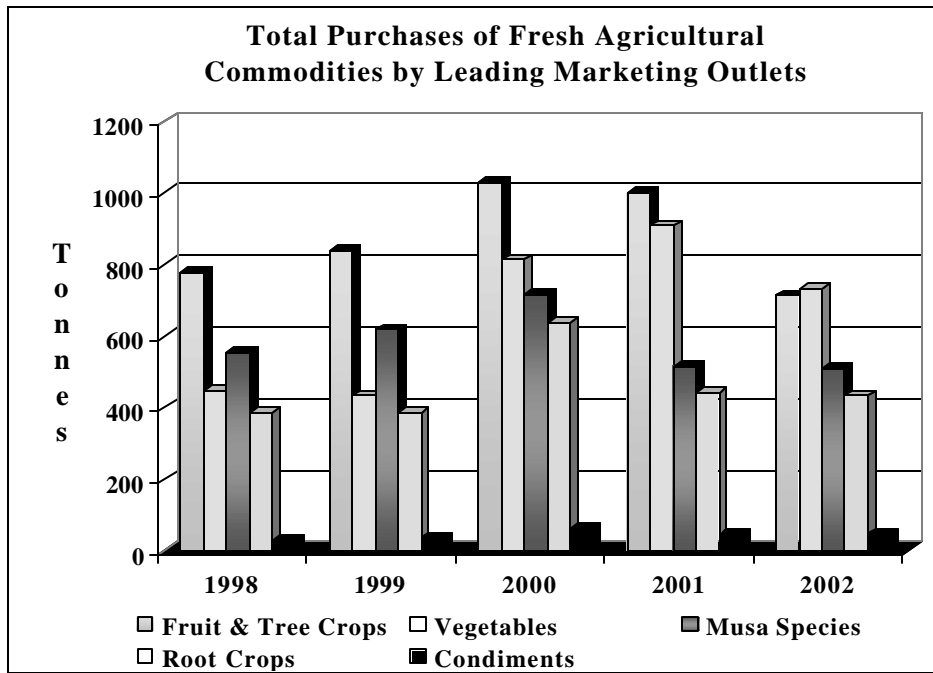

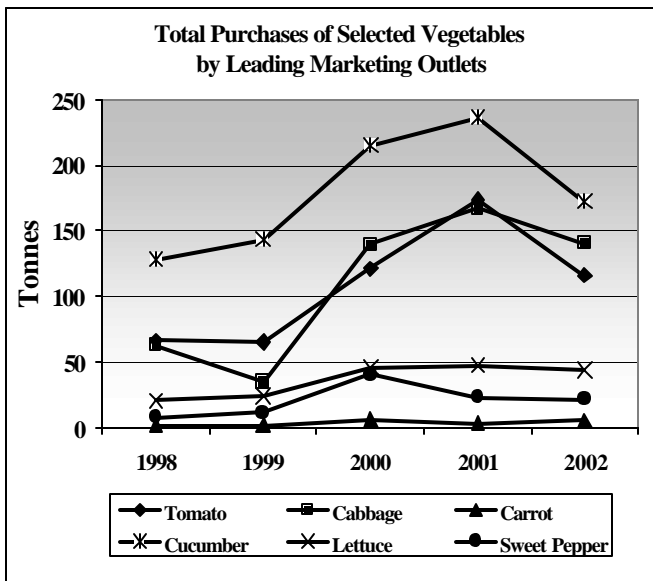
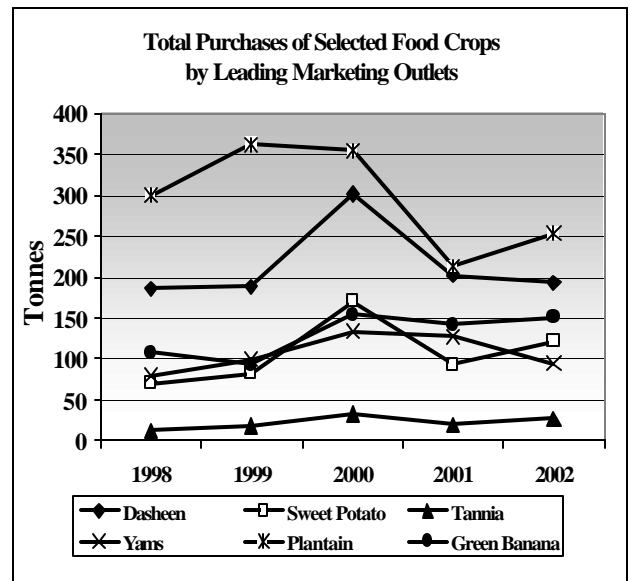

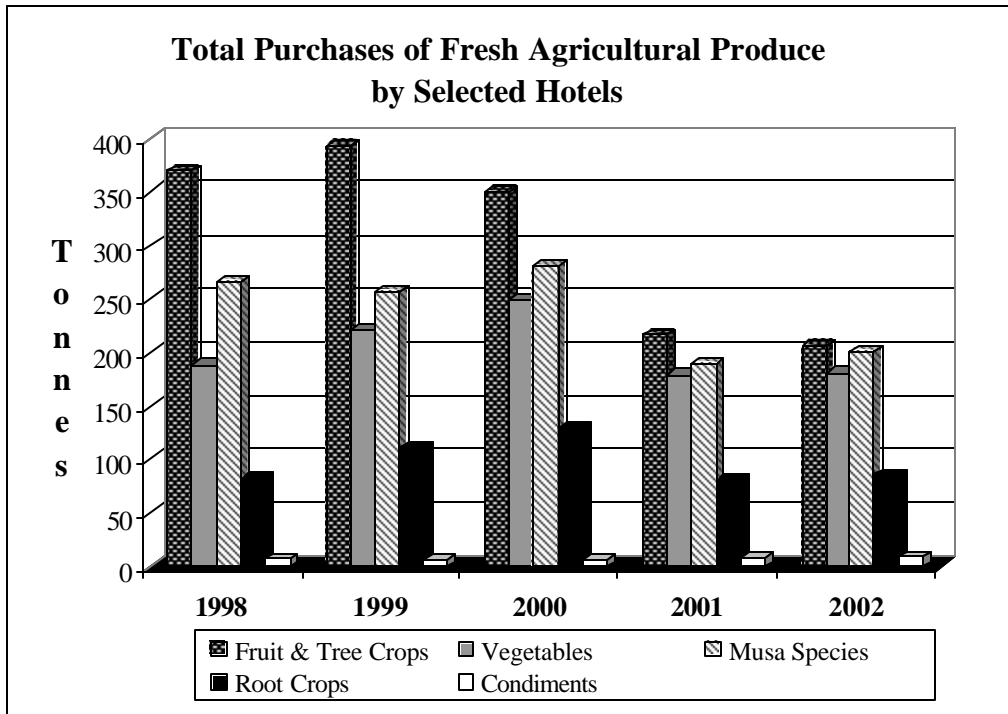

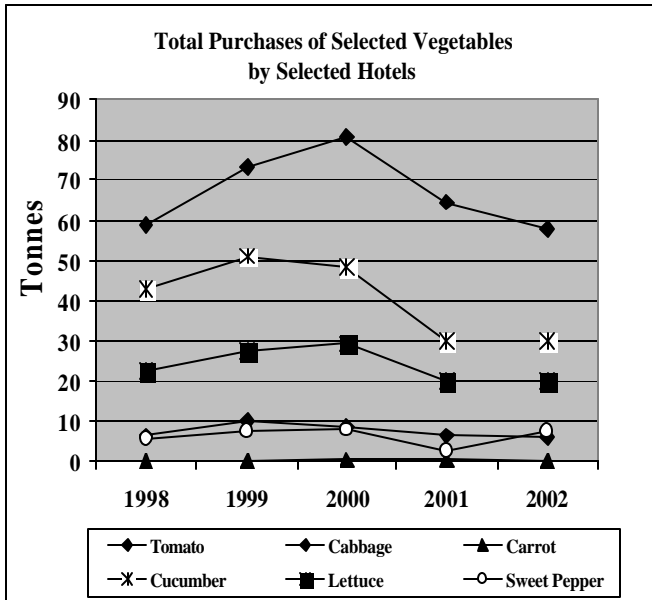
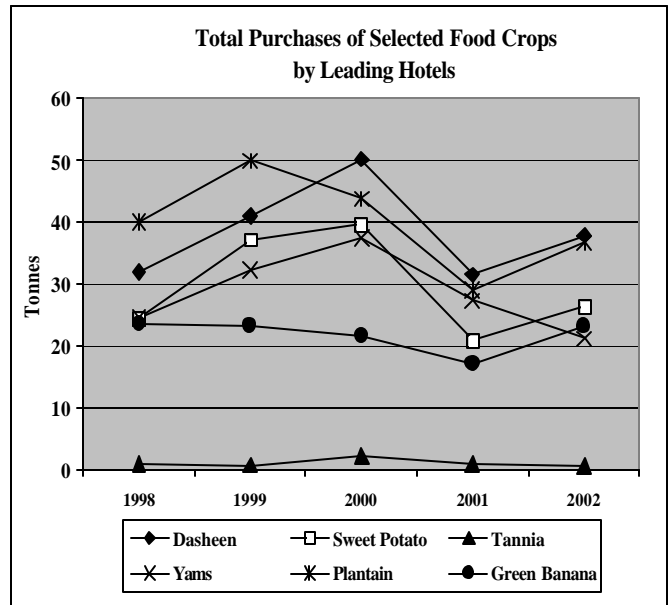

### THE FISHING SECTOR

In 2002, the estimated fish landings fell by over 300 tonnes compared to 2001. A fall in fish landings was recorded for all sites, except for Soufriere, where an increase of 6 tonnes was recorded. Data for the non sample sites showed a decline of 67% in 2002 in comparison to 2001. This decline in fish landing is attributed to the decline in tuna and flying fish landed in the period under review. Tuna landings fell by 196 tonnes and flying fish by 153 tonnes whilst the landing site of Choiseul reported a drop in catch of 87 tonnes for the same review period.

The total volume of fish imported during the review period increased by 115 tonnes, from 1,072 in 2001 to 1,187 in 2002 with total expenditure also reporting an increase of \$770,000.

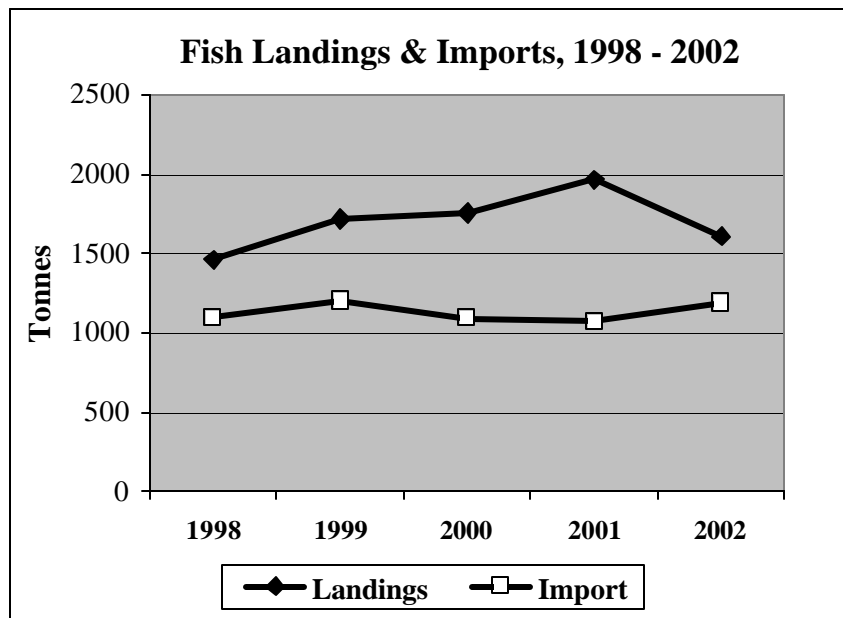

### THE LIVESTOCK SECTOR

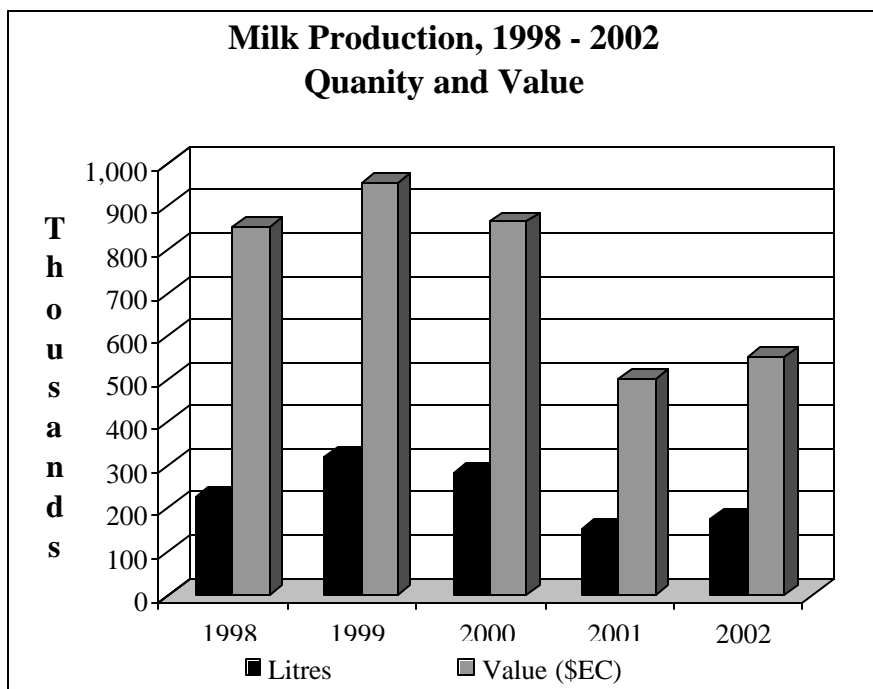
Local milk production in 2002 increased by just over 21,000 litres compared to 2001, and correspondingly, earnings amounted to over EC\$550,000.

In 2002 the amount of livestock slaughtered fell by approximately twenty-six percent (26%) or 695 heads.

Poultry imports reached its highest of 8,616 tonnes in 2002 for the review period from 1998 to 2002. Chicken continues to remain the largest contributor to poultry imports accounting for almost 87.4% in 2002. Only 7 tonnes of whole chicken was imported into the island in 2002; this figure represents the lowest amount of whole chicken imported for the review period, and was due mainly to increased domestic broiler production.

Other meat imports namely, beef, pork, mutton and chevron imports, registered increases by 19, 62, 12 and 7 tonnes, respectively, in 2002 compared to 2001.

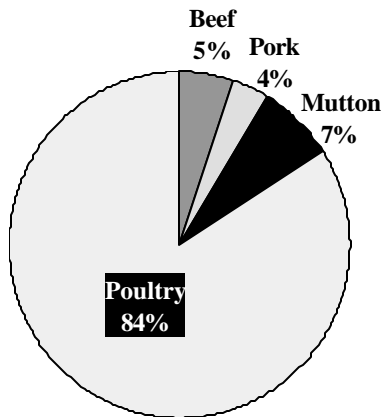

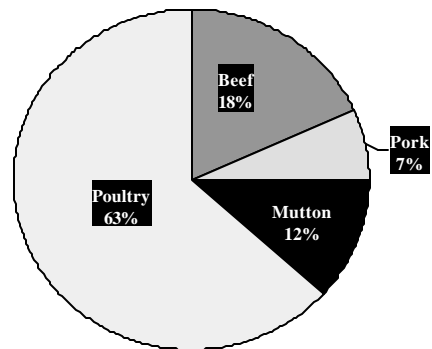

### AGRICULTURAL FINANCING

Forty-five (45) agricultural and fishing loans were approved under the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) project funds during 2002. These loans were valued at EC\$635,000, and overall, for the five-year review period, the number and value of loans granted for agricultural activities have declined. In 2002, loans for fishing were four (4) less than in the previous year, with the corresponding value declining by thirty-five percent (35%). Loans for farm development also fell by sixty-four percent (64%) in 2002 relative to 2001.

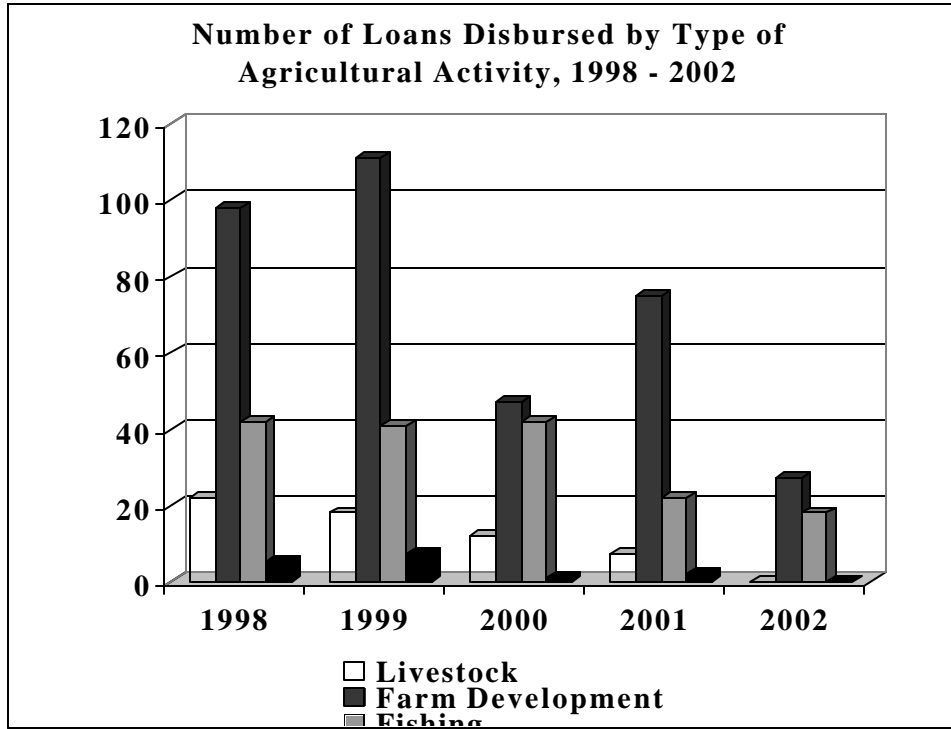

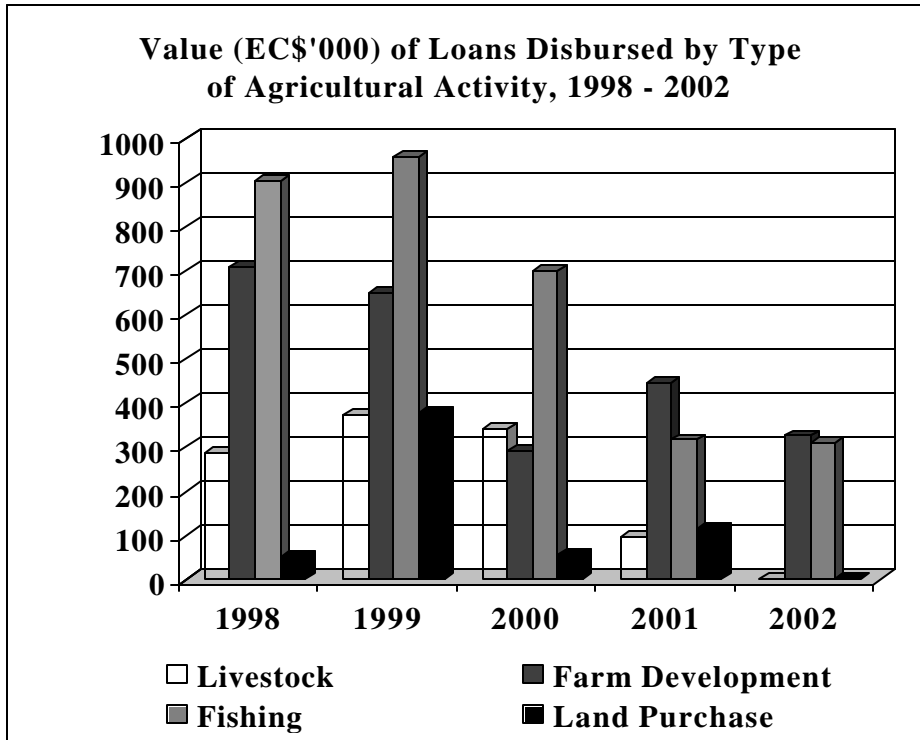

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**THE FOOD TRADE BALANCE**

St. Lucia continues to suffer a deficit in its trade balance on food, notwithstanding the fall in the trade balance by 9.15% in 2002 relative to the previous year. There was a decline of EC\$4.9 million and EC\$15.4 million in food exports and imports, respectively. Food exports in 2002 represented only 38% of the island's domestic exports, 19 percentage points less than the recorded value in 2001.

In 2002 the import value of all the major food items declined, in particular, cereal and cereal preparations, which fell by EC\$8.5 million. Meat and meat preparations remained dominant in terms of import volumes, accounting for 23% of all food imports in 2002.

The main regional export destination for fruits and vegetables in 2002 was Barbados, accounting for almost 62% of exports. The quantity and value of exports of selected agricultural produce (Table XI – 3) decreased by 602 tonnes and almost EC\$1 million in value. A significant decline in the exports of mango, green banana and hot pepper was recorded, however, a favourable increase in the quantity of avocado exported.

Exports of selected agricultural commodities were lowest in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter and highest in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2002.

Overall, there was a decline in the total quantity of selected agricultural commodities imported, but with an increase in value by over EC\$854,000. This increase can be attributed to the increase in the price of some commodities such as Irish potato, legumes (peas and beans) and cabbage.

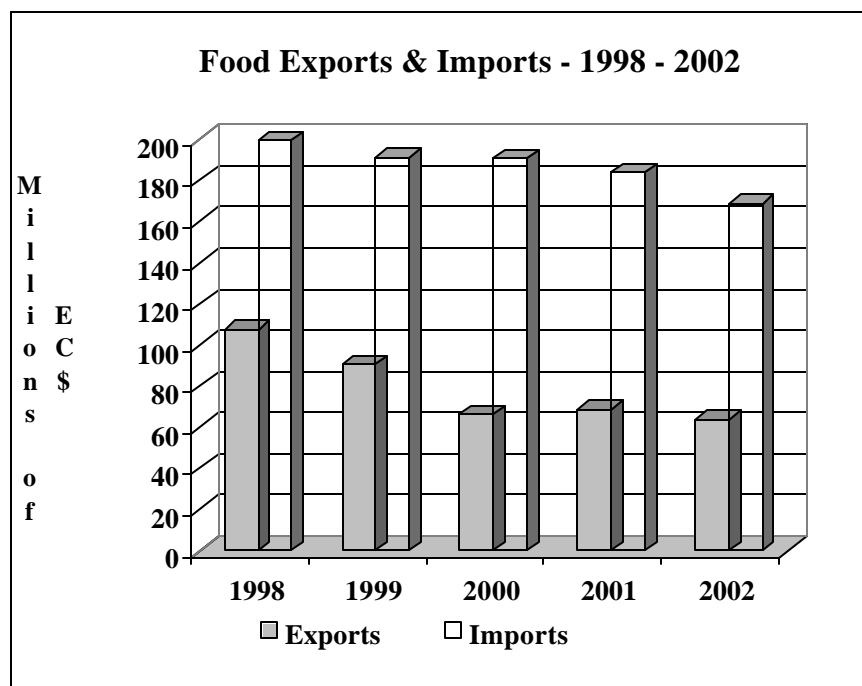
Imports of selected vegetables such as cabbage, carrot, sweet pepper and lettuce declined, with the exception of tomato. Over seventy-percent (70%) of regional fruit and vegetable imports were from Trinidad & Tobago. Barbados was the second largest regional importer of fruits and vegetables, with imports recorded at 17.3%.

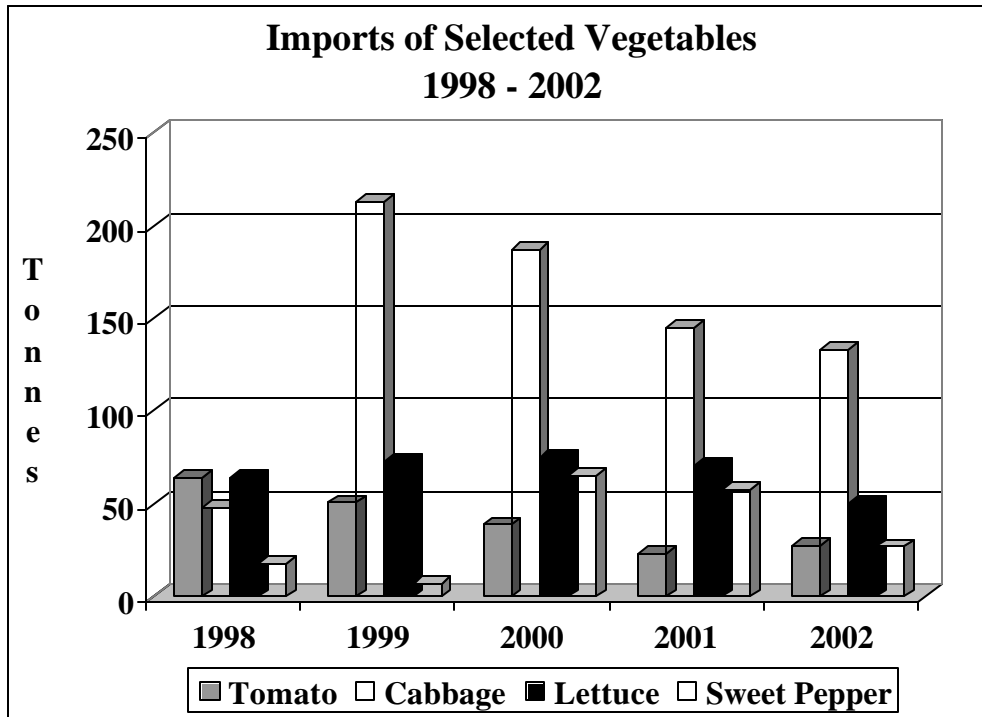

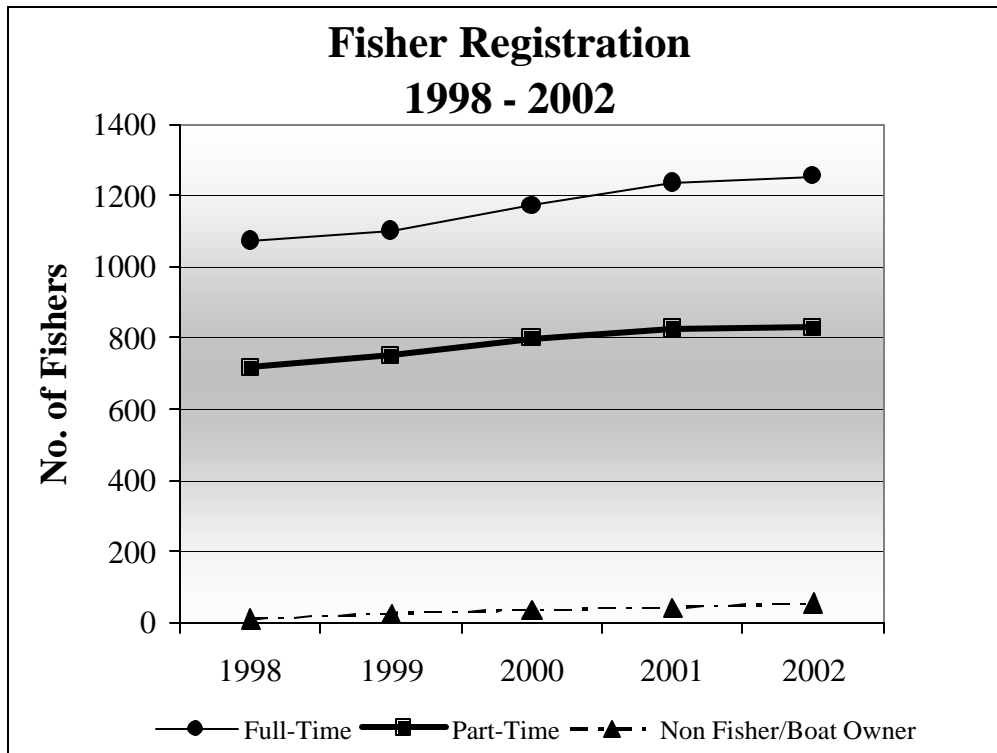
