

Overview of the Agricultural Sector

Over the 2020 review period, the agricultural sector contracted by 9.5 percent, a notable weakening after expanding in the previous two years. This outturn reflected declining growth rates in most of the various sub-sectors, primarily attributable to declining demand /sales associated with the COVID- 19 pandemic and reduced demand for bananas from the UK market. Notwithstanding a contraction in the Agricultural sector's growth rate in 2020, Agriculture's contribution to GDP grew marginally in 2020 from 1.9 percent in 2019 to 2.1 percent in 2020.

BANANA INDUSTRY



In 2020, there was an overall decline in banana exports to the United Kingdom (UK) of 39 percent to 4,344 tonnes. Accordingly, revenue earnings from bananas fell by 15 percent to EC\$4.2 million. During the first quarter of 2020, banana exports to the UK increased by 94.3 percent to 1,956 tonnes, when compared with the corresponding period in 2019. Thereafter, exports of bananas to the UK exhibited a downward trend. Banana exports to the UK declined by 42 percent during the second quarter of 2020 when compared to the corresponding period of 2019. The fall in exports was more pronounced in the third and fourth quarters of 2020, declining by 70 and 74 percent respectively.

Favourable weather conditions during the latter half of 2019 and the first quarter of 2020 coupled with the activities of the Banana Productivity Improvement Unit including pest and disease control, irrigation support, on-farm drainage, training and capacity building of farmers, expansion and rehabilitation of banana fields contributed to the increase in banana exports during the first quarter of 2020. Conversely, adverse developments including reduced demand from the UK market arising from compliance issues with banana industry standards in the local market, drought conditions during the period March to July, 2020 and COVID-19 related developments negatively affected banana exports to the UK during the last three quarters of 2020.

Moreover, in August 2020 WINFRESH, Saint Lucia's primary shipping and marketing agent for exporting bananas to the UK ceased operations. Sustainable Agricultural Supplies (SAS) became the primary agent for banana exports during the last quarter of 2020. The Saint Lucia National Fair Trade Organization (NFTO) handled the majority of bananas exported during the first three quarters of 2020. Exports of bananas to the UK during the last quarter of 2020 were handled by Sustainable Agricultural Supplies (SAS).

Banana exports to the region during 2020 were adversely affected by COVID-19 related developments. Regional banana exports declined by 24.6 percent to 3,346 tonnes in 2020 compared to 2019. Accordingly, revenue from regional banana exports declined by 15 percent to EC\$4.2 million. The decline in exports to the two major regional export markets in 2020, namely Barbados and Antigua overshadowed increases in banana exports to the third and fourth largest regional export markets, namely Trinidad and St. Kitts when compared with the corresponding period in 2019. This resulted in an overall decline in banana exports in 2020.

Exports to the main regional market Barbados, declined by 54.5 percent to 972 tonnes valued at EC\$555,000. Exports to the second largest regional market Antigua, declined by 7 percent to 1,197 tonnes valued at EC\$2 million while exports of bananas to the third largest regional market, Trinidad increased by 3.7 percent to 690 tonnes valued at EC\$1 million. Exports to the fourth largest regional market in 2020, St. Kitts and Nevis increased by 38 percent to 484 tonnes valued at EC\$550,000.

Banana Inputs

There was a general decrease in the prices of most types of banana inputs in 2020 when compared to 2019. The prices of all types of fertilizers namely NPK, Sulphate of Ammonia and Urea decreased in 2020 compared to 2019. The prices of most types of weedicides including Gramoxone, Basta, Reglone decreased with the exception of Touch down and the 1 litre bottle of Gramoxil which increased from \$47-\$49 in 2019 to \$47 -\$57 in 2020. The prices of nematicides, particularly Vidae also registered declines in 2020 when compared with 2019. The prices of fungicides, namely Neozil increased in 2020. Neozil rose from \$12 in 2019 to \$15 in 2020. The price of Blue Diothene rose from \$55 in 2019 to \$57.50 in 2020 and the price of twine rose from \$25-\$55 in 2019 to \$25-\$93 in 2020.

Non-traditional Crops

Consistent with reduced demand and household incomes associated with the COVID- 19 pandemic, the volume of non-traditional crops purchased by hotels and supermarkets declined by 16.5 percent to 4,455 tonnes in 2020 relative to 2019. Revenue from these sales declined by 22 percent to EC\$17.4 million in 2020 relative to 2019. Supermarket purchases which accounted for 91 percent of total domestic purchases of non-traditional crops in 2020, declined by 3.2 percent to 4,039tonnes in 2020. Revenue generated from supermarket purchases declined by 3.2 percent to EC\$15 million in 2020. All categories of crop purchases registered declines in the volumes purchased with the exception of the fruit and tree crop category which grew by 1.2 percent to 735 tonnes.

Preliminary data for the review period indicate that hotel purchases fell by 65percent to 415 tonnes, reflecting declines in purchases of all crop categories. This outturn reflected reduced demand from hotels associated with the decline in stay-over arrivals during the period under review. In keeping with the overall decrease in volume, revenue from hotel purchases declined by 64 percent to EC\$2.5 million.

Fisheries Sector

Available data indicates an 18.3 percent decline in the overall volume of fish landings in 2020 to 1,269 tonnes relative to 2019. There was a corresponding decline in revenue from fish landings during the period under review. Revenue declined by 24 percent to EC\$21 million in 2020. This outturn was associated with reduced fishing trips associated with COVID-19 protocols, reduced household income coupled with the closure of hotels and the scaled down operations of restaurants resulting in reduced demand.

An analysis of landings by species in 2020 indicates a decline in all major categories of fish species, namely tuna, dolphin and kingfish. Landings of tuna, dolphin and kingfish declined by 18 percent, 22 percent and 45 percent respectively. However, flying fish whose volumes of landings had been negligible for the past four years (one tonne and below) grew from 0.02 tonnes in 2019 valued at EC\$200 to 7tonnes, valued at EC\$55,000 in 2020. Favourable climatic conditions and the reduced presence of Sargassum seaweed in the water contributed to this favourable outturn.

Vieux-Fort and Dennery continued to be the major fish landing sites in 2020. These two major fish landing sites registered declines in fish landings of 20 percent to 373 tonnes and 9 percent to 303 tonnes respectively during the period under review. The third largest fish landing site in 2020 (Micoud) registered an 8 percent increase in fish landings to 146 tonnes.

Livestock Sector

Local chicken production declined by 15 percent to 1,882 tonnes in 2020 relative to 2019. Accordingly, revenue derived from sales of local poultry declined by 15 percent to EC\$23 million. All four quarters of 2020 registered declines in chicken production. Declines in the production of local chicken were more pronounced during the second and third quarters of 2020, during which poultry production declined by 30 percent and 20 percent respectively. The first and last quarters of 2020 registered declines of 6.6 percent and 7.8 percent respectively. Reduced demand from the hotel sector as a result of closures during the period March to June 2020 coupled with a slowdown in production due to COVID related factors were major contributors to the decline in chicken production during 2020.

Local Pork Purchases

Local pork purchases declined by 6 percent to 290 tonnes in 2020 relative to 2019. Similarly, revenue declined by 7 percent to EC\$3.7 million. The first three quarters of 2020 registered declines of 3.2 percent, 57 percent and 3.3 percent respectively in pork purchases. This outturn reflected reduced local demand associated with hotel closures, reduced social gatherings and mass events, particularly during the second quarter of 2020.

Meat Imports

Consistent with reduced demand associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, imports of beef declined by 51 percent to 486 tonnes in 2020 relative to 2019. Accordingly, the value of imported beef declined by 54 percent to EC\$7 million during the period under review. All four quarters of 2020 registered declines in beef imports. Declines in beef imports were more pronounced during the second, third and fourth quarters of 2020 where imports of beef fell by 49 percent, 58 percent and 66 percent respectively. Pork imports declined by 13 percent to 1,258 tonnes valued at EC\$7 million. All four quarters of 2020 registered declines in pork imports. Reduced demand from households, restaurants and the hotel sector associated with COVID-19 developments resulted in a 37 percent decline in pork imports during the second quarter of 2020 to 198 tonnes valued at EC\$954 thousand. The first, third and fourth quarters registered declines of 8 percent, 7 percent and 3 percent respectively.

The quantity of mutton imported which has been typically lower than that of beef and pork over the past five years also declined in 2020. Mutton imports declined by 2 percent to 237 tonnes valued at EC\$3.5 million in 2020 relative to 2019. There were increases in the importation of mutton during the first two quarters of 2020, while the last two quarters of 2020 registered declines in mutton imports. Imports of Chevron (goat) which has typically been the least imported meat during the past five years grew from 29 tonnes in 2019, valued at EC\$516,000 to 76 tonnes valued at EC\$1.3 million in 2020.

Imports of Selected Livestock Products

While imports of cheese and butter declined during 2020 relative to 2019, imports of milk grew by 14 percent to 4,357 tonnes valued at EC\$23 million. The first, third and fourth quarters of 2020 registered increases in milk imports of 17 percent, 27 percent, and 47 percent respectively. During the second quarter of 2020, milk imports declined by 29 percent to 734 tonnes valued at EC\$3.6 million.

Imports of cheese declined by 20 percent to 1,020 tonnes valued at EC\$13 million in 2020 relative to 2019. The first, third and fourth quarters of 2020 registered declines of 8 percent, 22 percent and 18.4 percent respectively. The decline in cheese importation was more pronounced during the second quarter of 2020, falling by 46 percent to 179 tonnes valued at EC\$2.5 million. Imports of butter declined by 57 percent to 77 tonnes valued at EC\$1.2 million during the period under review. Imports of butter declined during all four quarters of 2020 with the decline in the second quarter being more pronounced at 75 percent.

Agricultural Financing

In 2020, a total of fifty-five (55) loans valued at EC\$906,000 were approved for agricultural and fishing activities. This represents a substantial increase over the previous year, given that 14 loans valued at EC\$634,000 were approved for agricultural and fishing purposes in 2019. Three (3) loans valued at EC\$30,000 were approved for livestock activities in 2020 compared to one (1) loan valued at EC\$25,000 which was approved for livestock activities in 2019. While there were no loans approved for fishing activities in 2019, a total number of eight (8) loans valued at one hundred and thirty eight (138) thousand were approved for fishing activities in 2020.

Sixteen (16) loans valued at one hundred and thirty-one (131) thousand dollars were approved for crop development purposes in 2020 compared to four (4) loans valued at thirty one (31) thousand in 2019. This represents a fourfold increase in the total number of loans approved for crop development purposes in 2020 relative to 2019.

The number of loans approved for land purchase and development remained constant in 2020 at two (2) loans compared to the corresponding period in 2019. However, the value of loans approved for land purchase and development grew from EC\$46,000 in 2019 to EC\$155,000 in 2020.

The number of loans approved for other purposes grew from seven (7) in 2019 to twenty-six (26) in 2020. Notwithstanding an increase in the number of loans approved for other purposes in 2020, the total value of loans approved for other purposes declined from EC\$527,000 in 2019 to EC\$457,000 in 2020.

The trade deficit on food declined by 11 percent, from EC\$341 million in 2019 to EC\$305 million in 2020. A decline in food imports in 2020 was a major contributory factor in the narrowing of the food trade deficit during the period under review. Food imports decreased by 12 percent to EC\$330 million in 2020 and food exports declined by 23 percent to EC\$25 million. The reduction in food imports was associated with reduced demand particularly by the hotel sector as a result of closures and scaled down operations in 2020. Food exports were also adversely affected by reduced demand from external markets.

Food exports as a percentage of domestic exports fell from 31 percent in 2019 to 30 percent in 2020. Notwithstanding a decline in food imports in 2020, food imports as a percentage of total imports rose from 23 percent in 2019 to 24 percent in 2020.

Composition of Food Imports

Following four consecutive years of increases in food imports (2016-2019), food imports declined significantly in 2020. A major contributory factor was the Covid-19 pandemic which resulted in shutdowns, closure of many hotels and the scaling back of operations primarily within the hotel sector. Moreover, job losses resulted in reduced spending power of households leading to reduced demand for imported foods which caused a decline in supermarket purchases in 2020.

Food imports declined by 74 percent to EC\$96 million in 2020 compared to the corresponding period in 2019. All categories of imported food items recorded declines in 2020. The major category of imported food items over the past five years which includes meat and meat preparations, cereal and cereal preparations, vegetables and fruits, dairy products and eggs recorded declines of 95 percent, 52 percent, 84 percent and 87 percent respectively in 2020 when compared to 2019.

Exports of Agricultural Produce

Exports of selected agricultural produce declined by 28 percent to 4,043 tonnes valued at EC\$6.9 million in 2020 when compared to 2019. All crops exported recorded declines in the quantities exported in 2020 compared to 2019. With the exception of bananas, breadfruit, plantain, mangoes and avocados were the major crops exported. Exports of plantain fell from 488 tonnes in 2019 to 346 tonnes in 2020. The value of plantain exported rose from EC\$738,000 in 2019 to EC\$1.4 million indicating an increase in the export price of plantain in 2020. Exports of breadfruit declined from 394 tonnes valued at EC\$2 million in 2019 to 224 tonnes valued at EC\$739,000 in 2020. Exports of mango fell from 130 tonnes valued at EC\$321,000 in 2019 to 72 tonnes valued at EC\$202,000 in 2020. Avocado exports declined from 38 tonnes valued at EC\$106,000 in 2019 to 27 tonnes valued at EC\$85,000 in 2020.






TOTAL VALUE OF SELECTED FRESH AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES BY SELECTED MARKETING OUTLETS












