CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF RABBITS INTO ST. LUCIA

- 1. An Import Permit must be obtained from the Veterinary and Livestock Services Division in Saint Lucia before Importation.
- 2. Rabbits should be born and bred in the country for which Import Permit is granted and must be exported directly to St. Lucia.
- 3. Rabbits should be accompanied by a Veterinary Health Certificate issued by a certified Veterinarian attached to the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country, stating that:
 - a) Rabbits were treated for External and Internal Parasites including Coccidia.
 - b) Rabbits were examined on the day of export and certified free of all major infectious and contagious diseases as well as Internal and external parasites including ear mites.
 - c) The country is free from of Tularemia, Myxomatosis and Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease.
- 4. Animals and documents must be presented to the Government Veterinary Officer at one of the following ports on arrival:
 - George FL Charles Airport
 - Hewanorra International Airport
 - Castries and Vieux-Fort Sea Ports.
