Guidelines for Approval of Livestock Farming Activities

A. General Site Location

- 1. Applicant must own land or have notary permission for use of land/ownership or documented proof of lease/rental.
- 2. The site must not be within or closer than 182.88 meters/ 200 yards /600 feet from boundaries of cities, towns and villages.
- 3. Site must not be located within flood plain, low lying areas or areas prone to land slippage.
- 4. The site or production unit must be at least 50 meters from any river, well, watercourse, highway or main road.

- 5. The site should not be within any designated/zoned residential, commercial or industrial area.
- 6. The site must be located at least 182.88 meters/ 200 yards /600 feet from and on the leeward side of any public place existing or proposed (school, health center, factory, playing field, church, etc.)
- 7. The proposed site/pen must not pose any hazard or potential hazard/nuisance to public health and safety.
- 8. The site/pen must not be within any area of major archeological or historical significance, these areas include beaches and public places.
- 9. The area must not be deemed ecologically sensitive due to existing flora and fauna.
- 10. Site SHOULD BE ADEQUATE in size and must be accessible and motorable.

B. Application Requirements

 Submission of detailed drawings of pen (drawing to be appropriately scaled) consistent with proposed Veterinary & Livestock Services Division plans for livestock farm holdings.

As well as the following listed below;

- Copy of land register/ survey plan, lease, deed of sale.
- Lot size, Location plan, Floor plans, Elevation, Accessibility to Lot.
- Detailed drawings of type of sewage treatment system, location, capacity etc.

- Submission of a waste management plan and protocols for handling of diseased and dead animals.
- Drainage plans
- Location plan to indicate any rivers, watercourses and development within 182.88 meters/ 200 yards /600 feet of site.
- Location, type, capacity, distribution of water supply and auxiliary water supply system.
- Ownership of a water abstraction license, if water is to be harvested from rivers or watercourses.
- Number and type of animals.
- Number of persons working on farm.
- Facilities for farm workers including toilets, hand wash basins.
- Mode of Operations and Maintenance guide- Also indicate whether any processing of animal or animal products will be undertaken.
